SUMMARY—Requires the State Forester Firewarden to submit annual reports concerning fire prevention and forest health in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin to the Governor, the Legislature, the Nevada Congressional Delegation and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency. (BDR 47-439)

AN ACT relating to forestry; requiring the State Forester Firewarden to submit an annual report concerning fire prevention and forest health in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin to the Governor, the Legislature, the Nevada Congressional Delegation and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill requires the State Forester Firewarden, who is the executive head of
2 the Division of Forestry of the State Department of Conservation and Natural
3 Resources, in coordination and cooperation with the Tahoe Regional Planning
4 Agency and the fire chiefs within the Lake Tahoe Basin, to report annually to the
5 Governor, the Legislature, the Nevada Congressional Delegation and the Tahoe
6 Regional Planning Agency regarding plans and activities relating to fire prevention
7 and forest health in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 528 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. On or before January 1 of each year, the State Forester
4 Firewarden shall, in coordination and cooperation with the Tahoe
5 Regional Planning Agency and the fire chiefs within the Lake
6 Tahoe Basin, submit a report concerning fire prevention and
7 forest health in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin to:*

8 *(a) The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for
9 transmittal to the Legislature;*

10 *(b) The Governor;*

11 *(c) The Tahoe Regional Planning Agency; and*

12 *(d) Each United States Senator and Representative in
13 Congress who is elected to represent the State of Nevada.*

14 *2. The report submitted by the State Forester Firewarden
15 pursuant to subsection 1 must address, without limitation:*

16 *(a) The status of:*

17 *(1) The implementation of plans for the prevention of fires
18 in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin, including, without
19 limitation, plans relating to the reduction of fuel for fires;*

20 *(2) Efforts concerning forest restoration in the Nevada
21 portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and*

22 *(3) Efforts concerning rehabilitation of vegetation, if any,
23 as a result of fire in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin.*

24 *(b) Compliance with:*

25 *(1) The goals and policies for fire prevention and forest
26 health in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and*

27 *(2) Any recommendations concerning fire prevention or
28 public safety made by any fire department or fire protection
29 district in the Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin.*

30 *(c) Any efforts to:*

31 *(1) Increase public awareness in the Nevada portion of the
32 Lake Tahoe Basin regarding fire prevention and public safety;
33 and*

34 *(2) Coordinate with other federal, state, local and private
35 entities with regard to projects to reduce fire hazards in the
36 Nevada portion of the Lake Tahoe Basin.*
