

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 96—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNOR)

PREFILED DECEMBER 15, 2008

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Referred to Committee on Education

**SUMMARY**—Clarifies eligibility for and the administration of Millennium Scholarships for students who are enrolled in more than one eligible institution. (BDR 34-441)

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AN ACT relating to education; clarifying eligibility for and the administration of Millennium Scholarships for students who are enrolled in more than one eligible institution; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law provides that to be eligible for a Governor Guinn Millennium  
2 Scholarship a student must be enrolled in at least 6 semester credit hours in a  
3 community college or 12 semester credit hours in another eligible institution. (NRS  
4 396.930) The law does not specify whether enrollment in more than one eligible  
5 institution affects a student's eligibility for a Scholarship or how to administer the  
6 Scholarship for such a student.

7 This bill clarifies that a student who is enrolled in more than one eligible  
8 institution is eligible for a Millennium Scholarship if the student meets certain  
9 requirements, and that the Scholarship must be administered by the eligible  
10 institution at which the student is enrolled in a program of study leading to a  
11 recognized degree or certificate. This bill also directs the Board of Regents of the  
12 University of Nevada to establish procedures and guidelines for the administration  
13 of Millennium Scholarships for students who are enrolled in more than one eligible  
14 institution. (NRS 396.930, 396.934)

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 396.930 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2      396.930 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2 and  
3      3, a student may apply to the Board of Regents for a Millennium  
4      Scholarship if he:

5            (a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (e) of subsection  
6      2, has been a resident of this State for at least 2 years before he  
7      applies for the Millennium Scholarship;

8            (b) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c), graduated  
9      from a public or private high school in this State:

10                (1) After May 1, 2000, but not later than May 1, 2003; or

11                (2) After May 1, 2003, and, except as otherwise provided in  
12      paragraph (c) of subsection 2, not more than 6 years before he  
13      applies for the Millennium Scholarship;

14                (c) Does not satisfy the requirements of paragraph (b) and:

15                (1) Was enrolled as a pupil in a public or private high school  
16      in this State with a class of pupils who were regularly scheduled to  
17      graduate after May 1, 2000;

18                (2) Received his high school diploma within 4 years after he  
19      was regularly scheduled to graduate; and

20                (3) Applies for the Millennium Scholarship not more than 6  
21      years after he was regularly scheduled to graduate from high school;

22                (d) Maintained in high school in the courses designated by the  
23      Board of Regents pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 2, at least:

24                (1) A 3.00 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if he  
25      was a member of the graduating class of 2003 or 2004;

26                (2) A 3.10 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if he  
27      was a member of the graduating class of 2005 or 2006; or

28                (3) A 3.25 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if he  
29      was a member of the graduating class of 2007 or a later graduating  
30      class; and

31                (e) Is enrolled in at least:

32                (1) Six semester credit hours in a community college within  
33      the System; ~~for~~

34                (2) Twelve semester credit hours in another eligible  
35      institution ~~for~~; or

36                (3) *A total of 12 or more semester credit hours in eligible  
37      institutions if the student is enrolled in more than one eligible  
38      institution.*

39                2. The Board of Regents:

40                (a) Shall define the core curriculum that a student must complete  
41      in high school to be eligible for a Millennium Scholarship.



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- 1       (b) Shall designate the courses in which a student must earn the  
2 minimum grade point averages set forth in paragraph (d) of  
3 subsection 1.
- 4       (c) May establish criteria with respect to students who have been  
5 on active duty serving in the Armed Forces of the United States to  
6 exempt such students from the 6-year limitation on applications  
7 ~~that is~~ set forth in subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of  
8 subsection 1.
- 9       (d) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who have a  
10 documented physical or mental disability or who were previously  
11 subject to an individualized education program under the  
12 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400 et  
13 seq., or a plan under Title V of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29  
14 U.S.C. §§ 791 et seq. The criteria must provide an exemption for  
15 those students from:
- 16           (1) The 6-year limitation on applications ~~that is~~ set forth in  
17 subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1 and subparagraph  
18 (3) of paragraph (c) of subsection 1 and any limitation applicable to  
19 students who are eligible pursuant to subparagraph (1) of paragraph  
20 (b) of subsection 1.
- 21           (2) The minimum number of credits prescribed in paragraph  
22 (e) of subsection 1.
- 23           (e) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who have a  
24 parent or legal guardian on active duty in the Armed Forces of the  
25 United States to exempt such students from the residency  
26 requirement set forth in paragraph (a) of subsection 1 or  
27 subsection 3.
- 28           3. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c) of subsection  
29 1, for students who did not graduate from a public or private high  
30 school in this State and who, except as otherwise provided in  
31 paragraph (e) of subsection 2, have been residents of this State for at  
32 least 2 years, the Board of Regents shall establish:
- 33           (a) The minimum score on a standardized test that such students  
34 must receive; or
- 35           (b) Other criteria that students must meet,  
36 ➔ to be eligible for Millennium Scholarships.
- 37           4. In awarding Millennium Scholarships, the Board of Regents  
38 shall enhance its outreach to students who:
- 39           (a) Are pursuing a career in education or health care;
- 40           (b) Come from families who lack sufficient financial resources  
41 to pay for the costs of sending their children to an eligible  
42 institution; or
- 43           (c) Substantially participated in an antismoking, antidrug or  
44 antialcohol program during high school.



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1       5. The Board of Regents shall establish a procedure by which  
2 an applicant for a Millennium Scholarship is required to execute an  
3 affidavit declaring his eligibility for a Millennium Scholarship  
4 pursuant to the requirements of this section. The affidavit must  
5 include a declaration that the applicant is a citizen of the United  
6 States or has lawful immigration status, or that the applicant has  
7 filed an application to legalize his immigration status or will file an  
8 application to legalize his immigration status as soon as he is  
9 eligible to do so.

10      **Sec. 2.** NRS 396.934 is hereby amended to read as follows:

11      396.934 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section,  
12 within the limits of money available in the Trust Fund, a student  
13 who is eligible for a Millennium Scholarship is entitled to receive:

14       (a) If he is enrolled in a community college within the System,  
15 including, without limitation, a summer academic term, \$40 per  
16 credit for each lower division course and \$60 per credit for each  
17 upper division course in which the student is enrolled, or the amount  
18 of money that is necessary for the student to pay the costs of  
19 attending the community college that are not otherwise satisfied by  
20 other grants or scholarships, whichever is less. The Board of  
21 Regents shall provide for the designation of upper and lower  
22 division courses for the purposes of this paragraph. ~~In no event may~~  
23 ~~a student who is eligible for a Millennium Scholarship receive more~~  
24 ~~than the cost of 12 semester credits per semester pursuant to this~~  
25 ~~paragraph.]~~

26       (b) If he is enrolled in a state college within the System,  
27 including, without limitation, a summer academic term, \$60 per  
28 credit for which the student is enrolled, or the amount of money that  
29 is necessary for the student to pay the costs of attending the state  
30 college that are not otherwise satisfied by other grants or  
31 scholarships, whichever is less. ~~In no event may a student who is~~  
32 ~~eligible for a Millennium Scholarship receive more than the cost of~~  
33 ~~12 semester credits per semester pursuant to this paragraph.]~~

34       (c) If he is enrolled in another eligible institution, including,  
35 without limitation, a summer academic term, \$80 per credit for  
36 which the student is enrolled, or the amount of money that is  
37 necessary for the student to pay the costs of attending the university  
38 that are not otherwise satisfied by other grants or scholarships,  
39 whichever is less.

40       *(d) If he is enrolled in more than one eligible institution,  
41 including, without limitation, a summer academic term, the  
42 amount authorized pursuant to paragraph (a), (b) or (c), or a  
43 combination thereof, in accordance with procedures and  
44 guidelines established by the Board of Regents.*



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1    ➔ In no event may a student who is eligible for a Millennium  
2    Scholarship receive more than the cost of 12 semester credits per  
3    semester pursuant to this [paragraph.] **subsection.**

4        2. No student may be awarded a Millennium Scholarship:

5            (a) To pay for remedial courses.

6            (b) For a total amount in excess of \$10,000.

7            3. A student who receives a Millennium Scholarship shall:

8              (a) Make satisfactory academic progress toward a recognized  
9              degree or certificate, as determined by the Board of Regents  
10          pursuant to subsection 7; and

11          (b) If the student graduated from high school after May 1, 2003,  
12          maintain:

13              (1) At least a 2.60 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale  
14          for each semester during the first year of enrollment in the Governor  
15          Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program.

16              (2) At least a 2.75 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale  
17          for each semester during the second year of enrollment in the  
18          Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program and for each  
19          semester during each year of enrollment thereafter.

20          ➔ *If a student is enrolled in more than one eligible institution, the  
21          student must maintain a combined grade point average that meets  
22          the requirements of this subsection.*

23          4. If a student does not satisfy the requirements of subsection 3  
24          during one semester of enrollment, excluding a summer academic  
25          term, he is not eligible for the Millennium Scholarship for the  
26          succeeding semester of enrollment. If such a student:

27              (a) Subsequently satisfies the requirements of subsection 3 in a  
28          semester in which he is not eligible for the Millennium Scholarship,  
29          he is eligible for the Millennium Scholarship for his next semester  
30          of enrollment.

31              (b) Fails a second time to satisfy the requirements of subsection  
32          3 during any subsequent semester, excluding a summer academic  
33          term, he is no longer eligible for a Millennium Scholarship.

34          5. A Millennium Scholarship must be used only:

35              (a) For the payment of registration fees and laboratory fees and  
36          expenses;

37              (b) To purchase required textbooks and course materials; and

38              (c) For other costs related to the attendance of the student at the  
39          eligible institution.

40          6. The Board of Regents shall certify a list of eligible students  
41          to the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer shall disburse a  
42          Millennium Scholarship for each semester on behalf of an eligible  
43          student directly to the eligible institution in which the student is  
44          enrolled, upon certification from the eligible institution of the  
45          number of credits for which the student is enrolled, which must



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1 meet or exceed the minimum number of credits required for  
2 eligibility and certification that the student is in good standing and  
3 making satisfactory academic progress toward a recognized degree  
4 or certificate, as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to  
5 subsection 7. The Millennium Scholarship must be administered by  
6 the eligible institution as other similar scholarships are administered  
7 and may be used only for the expenditures authorized pursuant to  
8 subsection 5. *If a student is enrolled in more than one eligible  
9 institution, the Millennium Scholarship must be administered by  
10 the eligible institution at which the student is enrolled in a  
11 program of study leading to a recognized degree or certificate.*

12 7. The Board of Regents shall establish ~~Criteria~~ :

13 (a) *Criteria* for determining whether a student is making  
14 satisfactory academic progress toward a recognized degree or  
15 certificate for purposes of subsection 6.

16 ~~18. The Board of Regents shall establish procedures~~

17 (b) *Procedures* to ensure that all money from a Millennium  
18 Scholarship awarded to a student that is refunded in whole or in part  
19 for any reason is refunded to the Trust Fund and not the student.

20 (c) *Procedures and guidelines for the administration of a  
21 Millennium Scholarship for students who are enrolled in more  
22 than one eligible institution.*

23 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.

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
