SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing special license plates. (BDR 43-958)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; requiring that license plates without distinguishing marks be furnished for two vehicles used by the office of the county coroner; authorizing the Department of Motor Vehicles to issue certain special license plates for use on motorcycles; prescribing the fees for special license plates for use on vehicles other than passenger cars and light commercial vehicles; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law provides that license plates furnished for certain exempt vehicles
2 maintained for and used by certain governmental entities must be free of distinguishing
3 marks which would otherwise identify the vehicle as a governmental vehicle. (NRS
4 482.368) Section 1 of this bill adds two vehicles used by the office of a county coroner to
5 the list of vehicles for which license plates without a distinguishing mark must be
6 furnished.

7 Under existing law, if the Department of Motor Vehicles issues special license plates for
8 use on passenger car or light commercial vehicle and if those special license plates generate
9 financial support for a charitable organization, the Department is authorized to issue the
10 special license plates for use on a trailer or other type of vehicle that is not passenger car or
11 light commercial vehicle, but is prohibited from issuing the special license plates for use on a
12 motorcycle or heavy commercial vehicle. (NRS 482.3824) Effective July 1, 2010, section 2 of
13 this bill removes the prohibition against the Department issuing such special license plates for
14 use on motorcycles and provides further that the fees for special license plates issued for use
15 on vehicles other than passenger cars or light commercial vehicles must be the same as if the
16 special license plates were issued for use on a passenger car or light commercial vehicle.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1. NRS 482.368 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

2 482.368 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the Department
3 shall provide suitable distinguishing license plates for exempt vehicles. These
4 plates must be displayed on the vehicles in the same manner as provided for
5 privately owned vehicles. The fee for the issuance of the plates is \$5. Any license
6 plates authorized by this section must be immediately returned to the Department
7 when the vehicle for which they were issued ceases to be used exclusively for the
8 purpose for which it was exempted from the governmental services tax.

9 2. License plates furnished for:

10 (a) Those vehicles which are maintained for and used by the Governor or under
11 the authority and direction of the Chief Parole and Probation Officer, the State
12 Contractors' Board and auditors, the State Fire Marshal, the Investigation Division
13 of the Department of Public Safety and any authorized federal law enforcement
14 agency or law enforcement agency from another state;

15 (b) One vehicle used by the Department of Corrections, three vehicles used by
16 the Department of Wildlife, two vehicles used by the Caliente Youth Center and
17 four vehicles used by the Nevada Youth Training Center;

18 (c) Vehicles of a city, county or the State, if authorized by the Department for
19 the purposes of law enforcement or work related thereto or such other purposes as
20 are approved upon proper application and justification; ~~and~~

21 (d) **Two vehicles used by the office of the county coroner of any county**
22 **which has created that office pursuant to NRS 244.163; and**

23 (e) Vehicles maintained for and used by investigators of the following:

- 24 (1) The State Gaming Control Board;
- 25 (2) The State Department of Agriculture;
- 26 (3) The Attorney General;
- 27 (4) City or county juvenile officers;
- 28 (5) District attorneys' offices;
- 29 (6) Public administrators' offices;
- 30 (7) Public guardians' offices;
- 31 (8) Sheriffs' offices;
- 32 (9) Police departments in the State; and

33 (10) The Securities Division of the Office of the Secretary of State,

34 → must not bear any distinguishing mark which would serve to identify the
35 vehicles as owned by the State, county or city. These license plates must be issued
36 annually for \$12 per plate or, if issued in sets, per set.

37 3. The Director may enter into agreements with departments of motor
38 vehicles of other states providing for exchanges of license plates of regular series
39 for vehicles maintained for and used by investigators of the law enforcement
40 agencies enumerated in paragraph ~~(d)~~ (e) of subsection 2, subject to all of the
41 requirements imposed by that paragraph, except that the fee required by that
42 paragraph must not be charged.

43 4. Applications for the licenses must be made through the head of the
44 department, board, bureau, commission, school district or irrigation district, or
45 through the chairman of the board of county commissioners of the county or town
46 or through the mayor of the city, owning or controlling the vehicles, and no plate or
47 plates may be issued until a certificate has been filed with the Department showing
48 that the name of the department, board, bureau, commission, county, city, town,
49 school district or irrigation district, as the case may be, and the words "For Official

1 Use Only" have been permanently and legibly affixed to each side of the vehicle,
2 except those vehicles enumerated in subsection 2.

3 5. As used in this section, "exempt vehicle" means a vehicle exempt from the
4 governmental services tax, except a vehicle owned by the United States.

5 6. The Department shall adopt regulations governing the use of all license
6 plates provided for in this section. Upon a finding by the Department of any
7 violation of its regulations, it may revoke the violator's privilege of registering
8 vehicles pursuant to this section.

9 **Section 1.** **Sec. 2.** NRS 482.3824 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 482.3824 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.38279, with respect
11 to any special license plate that is issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3825,
12 inclusive, and for which ~~fan additional fee is~~ **additional fees are** imposed for the
13 issuance of the special license plate to generate financial support for a charitable
14 organization:

15 (a) The Director shall, at the request of the charitable organization that is
16 benefited by the particular special license plate:

17 (1) Order the design and preparation of souvenir license plates, the design
18 of which must be substantially similar to the particular special license plate; and

19 (2) Issue such souvenir license plates, for a fee established pursuant to
20 NRS 482.3825, only to the charitable organization that is benefited by the particular
21 special license plate. The charitable organization may resell such souvenir license
22 plates at a price determined by the charitable organization.

23 (b) The Department may, except as otherwise provided in this paragraph and
24 after the particular special license plate is approved for issuance, issue the special
25 license plate for a trailer, **motorcycle** or other type of vehicle that is not a passenger
26 car or light commercial vehicle, excluding ~~motoreycles and~~ vehicles required to
27 be registered with the Department pursuant to NRS 706.801 to 706.861, inclusive,
28 upon application by a person who is entitled to license plates pursuant to NRS
29 482.265 **or 482.272** and who otherwise complies with the requirements for
30 registration and licensing pursuant to this chapter **[.] or chapter 46 of NRS.** The
31 Department may not issue a special license plate for such other types of vehicles if
32 the Department determines that the design or manufacture of the plate for those
33 other types of vehicles would not be feasible. In addition, if the Department incurs
34 additional costs to manufacture a special license plate for such other types of
35 vehicles, including, without limitation, costs associated with the purchase,
36 manufacture or modification of dies or other equipment necessary to manufacture
37 the special license plate for such other types of vehicles, those additional costs must
38 be paid from private sources without any expense to the State of Nevada.

39 2. **If, as authorized pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1, the**
40 **Department issues a special license plate for a trailer, motorcycle or other type of**
41 **vehicle that is not a passenger car or light commercial vehicle, the Department**
42 **shall charge and collect for the issuance and renewal of such a plate the same**
43 **fees that the Department would charge and collect if the other type of vehicle was**
44 **a passenger car or light commercial vehicle. As used in this subsection, "fees"**
45 **does not include any applicable registration or license fees or governmental**
46 **services taxes.**

47 3. As used in this section ~~[, "charitable"]~~:

48 (a) **"Additional fees" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 482.38273.**

49 (b) **"Charitable organization"** means a particular cause, charity or other entity
50 that receives money from the imposition of ~~fan additional fee~~ **additional fees** in
51 connection with the issuance of a special license plate pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to
52 482.3825, inclusive. The term includes the successor, if any, of a charitable
53 organization.
