AN ACT relating to planning; requiring the comprehensive regional plan in certain counties to include provisions concerning the ~~Identification and~~ sustainability of certain ~~Supplies of~~ water ~~H~~ resources; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the regional planning commission of a county whose population is
2 100,000 or more but less than 400,000 (currently Washoe County) to develop a
3 comprehensive regional plan for the physical development and orderly growth of the region.
4 (NRS 278.0272) The comprehensive regional plan must include goals, policies, maps and
5 other documents relating to population, conservation, limitation of premature expansion, land
6 use, transportation, public facilities and services, annexation, intergovernmental coordination
7 and certain utility projects. (NRS 278.0274) ~~Existing law also provides for the development~~
8 ~~by the Northern Nevada Water Planning Commission of a comprehensive plan~~
9 ~~concerning supplies of water within the planning area for the comprehensive plan and~~
10 ~~for the adoption of such a plan by the Western Regional Water Commission. (NRS~~
11 ~~540A.010; Chapter 531, Statutes of Nevada 2007, pp. 3285-3304)~~ This bill requires the
12 comprehensive regional plan to include several provisions concerning the availability of water
13 resources for growth and development, including a statement setting forth the total population
14 of the ~~county~~ region that may be supported by the ~~Identified and~~ sustainable ~~Supply of~~
15 water ~~in the county as determined by the water planning commission of the county,~~
16 resources identified in the comprehensive plan adopted by the Western Regional Water
17 Commission.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** ~~NRS 278.026 is hereby amended to read as follows:~~
2 ~~278.026 As used in NRS 278.026 to 278.029, inclusive, unless the context~~
3 ~~otherwise requires;~~

1 1. "Affected entity" means a public utility, franchise holder, local or regional
2 agency, or any other entity having responsibility for planning or providing public
3 facilities relating to transportation, solid waste, energy generation and transmission,
4 conventions and the promotion of tourism, air quality or public education. The term
5 does not include:

6 (a) A state agency; or

7 (b) A public utility which is subject to regulation by the Public Utilities
8 Commission of Nevada.

9 2. "Facilities plan" means a plan for the development of public facilities
10 which will have a regional impact or which will aid in accomplishing regional goals
11 relating to transportation, solid waste, energy generation and transmission,
12 conventions and the promotion of tourism, air quality or public education. The term
13 does not include a plan for the development of a specific site or regulations adopted
14 by an affected entity to implement the comprehensive regional plan.

15 3. "Governing board" means the governing board for regional planning
16 created pursuant to NRS 278.0264.

17 4. "Joint planning area" means an area that is the subject of common study
18 and planning by the governing body of a county and one or more cities.

19 5. "Project of regional significance," with respect to a project proposed by
20 any person other than a public utility, means a project which:

21 (a) Has been identified in the guidelines of the regional planning commission
22 as a project which will result in the loss or significant degradation of a designated
23 historic, archeological, cultural or scenic resource;

24 (b) Has been identified in the guidelines of the regional planning commission
25 as a project which will result in the creation of significant new geothermal or
26 mining operations;

27 (c) Has been identified in the guidelines of the regional planning commission
28 as a project which will have a significant effect on the natural resources, public
29 services, public facilities, including, without limitation, schools, or the adopted
30 regional form of the region; or

31 (d) Will require a change in zoning, a special use permit, an amendment to a
32 master plan, a tentative map or other approval for the use of land which, if
33 approved, will have an effect on the region of increasing:

34 (1) Employment by not less than 938 employees;

35 (2) Housing by not less than 625 units;

36 (3) Hotel accommodations by not less than 625 rooms;

37 (4) Sewage by not less than 187,500 gallons per day;

38 (5) Water usage by not less than 625 acre feet per year; or

39 (6) Traffic by not less than an average of 6,250 trips daily.

40 The term does not include any project for which a request for an amendment to a
41 master plan, a change in zoning, a tentative map or a special use permit has been
42 approved by the local planning commission before June 17, 1989.

43 6. "Project of regional significance," with respect to a project proposed by a
44 utility, includes:

45 (a) An electric substation;

46 (b) A transmission line that carries 60 kilovolts or more;

47 (c) A facility that generates electricity greater than 5 megawatts;

48 (d) Natural gas storage and peak shaving facilities; and

49 (e) Gas regulator stations and mains that operate over 100 pounds per square
50 inch.

51 7. "Sphere of influence" means, *except as otherwise provided in NRS*
52 *278.0274*, an area into which a city plans to expand as designated in the

1 comprehensive regional plan within the time designated in the comprehensive
2 regional plan.] **(Deleted by amendment.)**

3 Sec. 2. NRS 278.0274 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 278.0274 The comprehensive regional plan must include goals, policies, maps
5 and other documents relating to:

6 1. Population, including a projection of population growth in the region and
7 the resources that will be necessary to support that population. *This portion of the
8 plan must set forth the total population of the [county] region that may be
9 supported by the identified and sustainable [supply of] water [in the county as
10 determined by the water planning commission of the county], resources identified
11 in the comprehensive plan adopted by the Western Regional Water Commission
12 pursuant to section 34 of chapter 531, Statutes of Nevada 2007, at page 3293, if
13 applicable to the region. The provisions of this subsection do not limit or
14 otherwise affect any authority or duty of the State Engineer.*

15 2. Conservation, including policies relating to the use and protection of air,
16 land, water and other natural resources, ambient air quality, natural recharge areas,
17 floodplains and wetlands, and a map showing the areas that are best suited for
18 development based on those policies.

19 3. The limitation of the premature expansion of development into
20 undeveloped areas, preservation of neighborhoods and revitalization of urban areas,
21 including, without limitation, policies that relate to the interspersion of new housing
22 and businesses in established neighborhoods and set forth principles by which
23 growth will be directed to older urban areas.

24 4. Land use and transportation, including the classification of future land uses
25 by density or intensity of development based upon the projected necessity and
26 availability of public facilities, including, without limitation, schools, and services
27 and natural resources, and the compatibility of development in one area with that of
28 other areas in the region. This portion of the plan must:

29 (a) Address, if applicable:

30 (1) Mixed-use development, transit-oriented development, master-planned
31 communities and gaming enterprise districts; and

32 (2) The coordination and compatibility of land uses with each military
33 installation in the region, taking into account the location, purpose and stated
34 mission of the military installation;

35 (b) Allow for a variety of uses;

36 (c) *[Estimate the amount of water required for those future uses;] Set forth a
37 pattern of development consistent with the total population of the region that may
38 be supported by the sustainable water resources described in subsection 1.*

39 (d) Describe the transportation facilities that will be necessary to satisfy the
40 requirements created by those future uses; ~~and~~

41 ~~(e)~~ Be based upon the policies and map relating to conservation that are
42 developed pursuant to subsection 2, surveys, studies and data relating to the area,
43 the amount of land required to accommodate planned growth, the population of the
44 area projected pursuant to subsection 1, and the characteristics of undeveloped land
45 in the area ~~H~~; and

46 (f) *Set forth policies that require, as a condition of the approval of any land
47 use, proof of the availability of water as determined by the water planning
48 commission of the county in accordance with subsection 1;*

49 (g) *Include the estimated area of potential development of the region that is
50 supported by the identified and sustainable supply of water determined pursuant
51 to subsection 1;*

52 (h) *Include the amount of water required to support all development that is
53 approved but is not yet built; and*

~~1 (i) Set forth policies and criteria, including, without limitation, any required
2 amendment to a master plan of a local government, that may be used to terminate
3 any approval of land use for which water is not committed; each applicable
4 master plan of a local government to be consistent with the pattern of
5 development and total population specified in paragraph (c).~~

6 5. Public facilities and services, including provisions relating to sanitary
7 sewer facilities, solid waste, flood control, potable water and groundwater aquifer
8 recharge which are correlated with principles and guidelines for future land uses,
9 and which specify ways to satisfy the requirements created by those future uses.
10 This portion of the plan must:

11 (a) Describe the problems and needs of the area relating to public facilities and
12 services and the general facilities that will be required for their solution and
13 satisfaction;

14 (b) Identify the providers of public services within the region and the area
15 within which each must serve, including service territories set by the Public
16 Utilities Commission of Nevada for public utilities;

17 (c) Establish the time within which those public facilities and services
18 necessary to support the development relating to land use and transportation must
19 be made available to satisfy the requirements created by that development; and

20 (d) Contain a summary prepared by the regional planning commission
21 regarding the plans for capital improvements that:

22 (1) Are required to be prepared by each local government in the region
23 pursuant to NRS 278.0226; and

24 (2) May be prepared by the water planning commission of the county, the
25 regional transportation commission and the county school district.

26 6. Annexation, including the identification of spheres of influence for each
27 unit of local government, improvement district or other service district and
28 specifying standards and policies for changing the boundaries of a sphere of
29 influence and procedures for the review of development within each sphere of
30 influence. As used in this subsection, "sphere of influence" means an area into
31 which a political subdivision may expand in the foreseeable future. ~~land which is
32 within the estimated area of potential development of the region specified in
33 paragraph (g) of subsection 4.~~

34 7. Intergovernmental coordination, including the establishment of guidelines
35 for determining whether local master plans and facilities plans conform with the
36 comprehensive regional plan.

37 8. Any utility project required to be reported pursuant to NRS 278.145.
