SUMMARY—Prohibits the Governor or any other state officer or employee , without authorization by the Legislature, from binding the State to the requirements of an international trade agreement [without authorization by the Legislature,] or otherwise committing the State to comply with the nontariff terms of an international trade agreement. AN ACT relating to international trade agreements; prohibiting the Governor or any other state officer or employee , without authorization by the Legislature, from binding the State to the requirements of an international trade agreement [without authorization by the Legislature,] or otherwise committing the State to comply with the nontariff terms of an international trade agreement; invalidating any prior consent to any such requirements in an international trade agreement; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Certain international trade agreements, such as the Agreement on Government Procurement, obligate states and local governments to certain requirements concerning government purchasing. Section 1 of this bill prohibits the Governor or any other state officer or employee , without authorization by the Legislature, from : (1) binding the State to the requirements of an international trade agreement [without authorization by the Legislature,] or otherwise committing the State to comply with the nontariff terms of an international trade agreement; or (2) giving consent to the Federal Government to bind the State to the requirements of an international trade agreement or otherwise indicating that the State will comply with the nontariff terms of an international trade agreement. Section 2

10 of this bill invalidates any prior consent to such requirements of an international trade
11 agreement.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter ~~1237A~~ 597 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto
2 a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a state officer or employee,
4 including the Governor, may not:*

5 *(a) Bind the State to the requirements of an international trade agreement or
6 otherwise commit the State to comply with the nontariff terms of an international
7 trade agreement; or*

8 *(b) Give consent to the Federal Government to bind the State to the
9 requirements of an international trade agreement or otherwise indicate that the
10 State will comply with the nontariff terms of an international trade agreement.*

11 *2. The Governor may not bind the State or give consent to the Federal
12 Government to bind the State to the requirements of an international trade
13 agreement ~~only if~~ or otherwise commit the State to comply with the nontariff
14 terms of an international trade agreement unless the Legislature has enacted
15 legislation that explicitly authorizes the Governor to do so.*

16 *3. As used in this section, “international trade agreement” means a trade
17 agreement between the Federal Government and a foreign country to which the
18 State, at the request of the Federal Government, is a ~~party~~ participant. The
19 term does not include a trade agreement between the State and a foreign country
20 to which the Federal Government is not a party.*

21 **Sec. 2.** 1. Any consent that the Governor or any other state officer or
22 employee has given on or before the effective date of this act for the State to be
23 bound by the requirements of an international trade agreement is hereby declared to
24 be invalid, and the State is not bound by such requirements.

25 2. As used in this section, “international trade agreement” has the meaning
26 ascribed to it in section 1 of this act.

27 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
