AN ACT relating to wildlife; revising provisions governing the ~~use of the fee charged for processing an application for a game tag~~ development of certain programs and other activities conducted by the Department of Wildlife; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to guide the Department of Wildlife in carrying out various provisions of law governing wildlife and boating. (NRS 501.181) Existing law also provides that in addition to any fee charged and collected for a game tag, a fee of \$3 must be charged for processing each application for a game tag, the revenue from which must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the Wildlife Account in the State General Fund and used by the Department of Wildlife for costs related to certain programs. ~~for management activities and research relating to wildlife~~ (NRS 502.253) This bill provides that ~~such revenue must only be used for costs related to projects approved by any such programs, activities or research must be developed or conducted under the guidance of~~ the Board of Wildlife Commissioners ~~for the management and control of predatory wildlife for the enhancement of mule deer populations.~~

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 502.253 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 502.253 1. In addition to any fee charged and collected pursuant to NRS
3 502.250, a fee of \$3 must be charged for processing each application for a game
4 tag, the revenue from which must be accounted for separately, deposited with the
5 State Treasurer for credit to the Wildlife Account in the State General Fund and
6 used by the Department ~~only~~ for costs related to ~~the management and control of predatory~~

1 (a) Programs ~~for projects~~ for the management and control of injurious predatory
2 wildlife:

3 (b) Wildlife management activities relating to the protection of nonpredatory
4 game animals, sensitive wildlife species and related wildlife habitat;

5 (c) Conducting research, as needed, to determine successful techniques for
6 managing and controlling predatory wildlife, including studies necessary to ensure
7 effective programs for the management and control of injurious predatory wildlife;
8 and

9 (d) Programs for the education of the general public concerning the
10 management and control of predatory wildlife. ~~for the enhancement of mule deer~~
11 ~~populations.~~

12 2. The Department of Wildlife is hereby authorized to expend a portion of the
13 money collected pursuant to subsection 1 to enable the State Department of
14 Agriculture to develop and carry out the programs ~~for projects~~ described in
15 subsection 1.

16 3. Any project program developed or wildlife management activity or
17 research conducted pursuant to this section must be approved by ~~for~~ developed or
18 conducted under the guidance of the Commission ~~for~~ pursuant to subsection 2 of
19 NRS 501.181.

20 4. The money in the Wildlife Account remains in the Account and does not
21 revert to the State General Fund at the end of any fiscal year.

22 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.
