AN ACT relating to traffic laws; prohibiting ~~certain persons~~ a person operating a motor vehicle from using a telephonic device to write, send or read a text-based communication while ~~operating at the~~ the motor vehicle ~~is in motion or stopped at certain intersections;~~ providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 ~~This~~ Section 1 of this bill prohibits a person operating a motor vehicle from using a
2 telephonic device to write, send or read a text-based communication while ~~operating at the~~ the
3 motor vehicle ~~except in certain circumstances,~~ is in motion or stopped at an intersection
4 that is controlled by a traffic-control signal. A person who violates this provision must pay
5 a fine of \$20 for a first offense, ~~and~~ a fine of \$50 for a second offense and a fine of \$100
6 for a third or subsequent offense. This bill does not create a moving violation.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 484 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a person operating a motor
4 vehicle shall not use a telephonic device to write, send or read a text-based
5 communication while operating a motor vehicle.) the motor vehicle is in motion
6 or stopped at an intersection that is controlled by a traffic-control signal.

7 2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to f.

1 ~~(a) An emergency medical attendant, firefighter or law enforcement officer
2 who uses a telephonic device in the course of his duties; or~~

3 ~~(b) A person who reads, selects or enters a telephone number or name in a
4 telephonic device for the purpose of making or receiving a telephone call.~~

5 3. A person who violates the provisions of subsection 1 shall:

6 (a) For a first offense, pay a fine of \$20.

7 (b) For a second ~~or subsequent~~ offense, pay a fine of \$50.

8 (c) ~~For a third or subsequent offense, pay a fine of \$100.~~

9 4. A violation of subsection 1 is not a moving traffic violation under
10 NRS 483.473.

11 5. As used in this section:

12 (a) ~~“Emergency medical attendant” means a person licensed as an
13 attendant or certified as an emergency medical technician, intermediate
14 emergency medical technician or advanced emergency medical technician
15 pursuant to chapter 450B of NRS.~~

16 ~~(b) “Telephonic device” has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 707.375.~~

17 ~~(c) (b) “Text-based communication” includes, without limitation,
18 communication by text message, instant message or electronic mail.~~

19 Sec. 2. NRS 707.375 is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 707.375 1. An agency, board, commission or political subdivision of this
21 State, including, without limitation, any agency, board, commission or governing
22 body of a local government, shall not regulate the use of a telephonic device by a
23 person who is operating a motor vehicle ~~if, except as provided in section 1 of this
24 act.~~

25 2. As used in subsection 1, “telephonic device” means a cellular phone,
26 satellite phone, portable phone or any other similar electronic device that is
27 handheld and designed or used to communicate with ~~or~~ another person.
