SUMMARY—Requires school districts to use certain environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products. (BDR 34-742)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the **[State Board] Department** of Education to adopt regulations setting forth the standards for environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the **cleaning of all floor surfaces in the** public schools; requiring school districts to ensure that only environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products are used in the **cleaning of all floor surfaces in the** public schools; prescribing the process for a waiver under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 **Section 2** of this bill expresses the intent of the Legislature with regard to the manner in
2 which school districts may reduce the potential exposure of pupils and school personnel to
3 potentially hazardous chemicals and substances.

4 **Section 3** of this bill requires the **[State Board] Department** of Education to adopt
5 regulations setting forth the standards for environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance
6 products for use in the **cleaning of all floor surfaces in the** public schools in this State.
7 **Section 3** also requires school districts to ensure that only environmentally sensitive cleaning
8 and maintenance products **for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces** are used in the public
9 schools in accordance with the regulations adopted by the **[State Board] Department**.
10 **Section 3** further provides that a school district may submit a written request to the
11 Department **[of Education]** for a waiver from these requirements under certain circumstances
12 **[, and authorizes the board of trustees of a school district to use environmentally**
13 **sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the cleaning of any other**
14 **surfaces.]**

15 **Section 5** of this bill requires school districts to ensure that the public schools within the
16 school district comply with the requirements of **section 3** of this bill on or before July 1, 2010.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 386 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the
2 provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

3 **Sec. 2. *The Legislature declares that:***

4 **1. Children are particularly vulnerable to and may be severely affected by
5 exposure to chemicals, hazardous wastes and other environmental hazards that
6 may be used for cleaning and maintenance in the public schools; and**

7 **2. It is the intent of the Legislature to reduce the possible exposure of pupils
8 and school personnel to potentially hazardous chemicals and substances which
9 are used in the cleaning and maintenance of the public schools in this State.**

10 **Sec. 3. 1. The ~~State Board~~ Department of Education shall, in
11 consultation with each school district, the State Department of Conservation and
12 Natural Resources, the Department of Health and Human Services and other
13 interested parties, including, without limitation, representatives of the cleaning
14 and maintenance product industry, nongovernmental agencies and
15 organizations, and parents and legal guardians of pupils enrolled in the school
16 district, adopt regulations setting forth the standards for environmentally
17 sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the cleaning of all floor
18 surfaces in the public schools.**

19 **2. The Department shall provide a sample list of approved environmentally
20 sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the cleaning of all floor
21 surfaces to each school district based upon the standards prescribed pursuant to
22 subsection 1.**

23 **3. The Department shall, at least every 2 years, review and may amend the
24 sample list developed pursuant to subsection 2 as necessary.**

25 **~~4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection~~ subsections ~~4,~~ 6 and
26 7, each school district shall ensure that the public schools within the school
27 district use only environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products in
28 the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools within the school district in
29 accordance with the regulations adopted pursuant to subsection 1.**

30 **5. The board of trustees of a school district may consult with persons who
31 are knowledgeable and have experience in environmentally sensitive cleaning
32 and maintenance products to determine if the board of trustees should:**

33 **(a) Submit a written request to the Department pursuant to subsection 6 or 7.**

34 **(b) Use any other environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance
35 products in the public schools within the school district pursuant to subsection 9.**

36 **~~6. If the board of trustees of a school district determines that the costs
37 associated with the purchase or use of environmentally sensitive cleaning and
38 maintenance products for use in the cleaning of floor surfaces are unreasonable
39 and would place an undue burden on the efficient operation of the school district
40 or a particular school within the school district, the board of trustees may submit
41 a written request to the Department for a waiver from purchasing and using
42 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the
43 cleaning of floor surfaces for the school district as a whole or for a particular
44 school or schools within the school district.~~**

45 **7. If the board of trustees of a school district determines that an
46 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance product for use in the
47 cleaning of floor surfaces which is not included in the sample list developed
48 pursuant to subsection 2 is more economically feasible or is a more effective**

1 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance product, the board of
2 trustees may submit a written request to the Department for a waiver to purchase
3 and use such an environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance product
4 that complies with the standards prescribed pursuant to subsection 1.

5 ~~§ 8. If a waiver is granted by the Department pursuant to subsection,~~
6 ~~subsection 6 or 7, the waiver is effective for 1 year after the date of its~~
7 ~~approval and a renewal may be requested on an annual basis in the manner set~~
8 ~~forth in subsection 4, subsection 6 or 7, as applicable.~~

9 9. In addition to the environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance
10 products for use in the cleaning of floor surfaces in the public schools within the
11 school district required pursuant to subsection 1, the board of trustees of a school
12 district may use environmentally sensitive cleaning products for use in the
13 cleaning of any other surfaces.

14 10. The regulations adopted by the Department must not prohibit the use of
15 any disinfectant, sanitizer, antimicrobial product or other cleaning product when
16 necessary to protect the health and welfare of the pupils enrolled in a school
17 within the school district and the educational personnel of the school district.

18 ~~§ 11. As used in this section, "environmentally sensitive cleaning and~~
19 ~~maintenance products" means cleaning and maintenance products that reduce~~
20 ~~the chemicals, hazardous wastes and other environmental hazards to which~~
21 ~~pupils and school personnel may be exposed.~~

22 Sec. 4. On or before January 1, 2010, the ~~State Board~~ Department of
23 Education shall adopt the regulations required by section 3 of this act.

24 Sec. 5. On or before July 1, 2010, each school district shall:

25 1. Ensure that only environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance
26 products for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces are used in the public schools
27 within the school district in accordance with the regulations adopted pursuant to
28 section 3 of this act; or

29 2. Request a waiver from the Department of Education pursuant to section 3
30 of this act.

31 Sec. 6. 1. On or before January 1, 2011, the board of trustees of each school
32 district shall prepare and submit to the Department of Education a written report
33 regarding the implementation of the use of environmentally sensitive cleaning and
34 maintenance products for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public
35 schools within the school district. The report must include, without limitation:

36 (a) A description of the cleaning and maintenance products that were replaced,
37 if any;

38 (b) A description of the environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance
39 products that are used in the public schools within the school district;

40 (c) A description of any requests for a waiver that the school district submitted
41 to the Department and the status of the request; and

42 (d) An evaluation of the effectiveness of the use of environmentally sensitive
43 cleaning and maintenance products on the health and safety of the pupils and school
44 personnel in the school district.

45 2. On or before February 1, 2011, the Department of Education shall submit a
46 written report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to
47 the 76th Session of the Nevada Legislature regarding the implementation of the use
48 of environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products in the cleaning of
49 all floor surfaces in the public schools within the school districts in this State.
50 The report must include, without limitation:

51 (a) A compilation of the reports submitted by each school district pursuant to
52 subsection 1; and

1 (b) A description of the requests for a waiver submitted by school districts to
2 the Department pursuant to section 3 of this act, including, without limitation:

3 (1) The number of waivers that were granted by the Department and the
4 justification for each waiver; and

5 (2) The number of waivers that were denied by the Department and the
6 reasons for each denial.

7 **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.
