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Legislative Counsel's Digest:

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1 ~~WHEREAS, Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus is a type of bacterial~~  
2 ~~infection that is resistant to more than one class of antimicrobial agents and is one of the~~  
3 ~~most common pathogens that cause healthcare-associated infections in the United States~~  
4 ~~and in many parts of the world;~~ and

5 ~~WHEREAS, Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus infections occur most~~  
6 ~~frequently in patients who have undergone invasive medical procedures or who have a~~  
7 ~~weakened immune system;~~ and

8 ~~WHEREAS, In 2004, methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus accounted for 63~~  
9 ~~percent of the total number of staphylococcus infections in healthcare settings;~~ and

10 ~~WHEREAS, In 2005, approximately 24,360 people were infected with and 18,650~~  
11 ~~people died from methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus infections;~~ and

12 ~~WHEREAS, Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus infections can be prevented~~  
13 ~~by practicing proper hygiene such as hand washing and contact precautions;~~ now

1                   THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
2                   SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

4                   Section 1. ~~[Chapter 441A of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.]~~ ~~(Deleted by amendment.)~~

5                   Sec. 2. ~~H. Each hospital in this State shall establish a MRSA program that requires:~~

6                   ~~(a) Identification of all MRSA colonized patients in all intensive care units, and other at-risk patients identified by the hospital, through active surveillance testing;~~

7                   ~~(b) Isolation of identified MRSA colonized or MRSA infected patients in an appropriate manner;~~

8                   ~~(c) Monitoring and strict enforcement of requirements for appropriate hygiene related to washing hands;~~

9                   ~~(d) Maintenance of records and reporting of identified cases of MRSA to the State Health Officer;~~

10                  ~~2. As used in this section, "MRSA" means methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus.*~~ ~~(Deleted by amendment.)~~

11                  Sec. 3. ~~H. The State Health Officer shall compile aggregate data from the information submitted by hospitals pursuant to section 2 of this act concerning the total number of infections caused by methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* in this State that were present when a patient was admitted to the hospital or that occurred after admission.~~

12                  ~~2. The State Health Officer shall adopt regulations concerning the manner of reporting and the information to be reported by hospitals pursuant to section 2 of this act.~~

13                  ~~3. The aggregate data compiled pursuant to subsection 1 must be made available on the website of the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services.~~ ~~(Deleted by amendment.)~~

14                  Sec. 4. ~~1. Each hospital in this State is encouraged to establish a methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* infection control program that requires:~~

15                   ~~(a) The identification, through testing, of all patients in all intensive care units and other patients who are at risk for infection with or who are colonized with methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus*;~~

16                   ~~(b) Proper isolation of patients who are identified as being infected with or colonized with methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus*;~~

17                   ~~(c) Monitoring and strict enforcement of proper hygiene, including, without limitation, hand washing; and~~

18                   ~~(d) The hospital to work with the Nevada Hospital Association to develop a model for reporting cases of methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* infection in a timely manner.~~

19                  ~~2. The Nevada Hospital Association, in cooperation with the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services and hospitals in this State, is encouraged to develop a model for reporting cases of methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* infection in a timely manner.~~

20                  ~~3. If the Nevada Hospital Association develops a model pursuant to subsection 2, on or before January 1, 2011, the Nevada Hospital Association shall submit a written report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the next regular session of the Legislature concerning the model developed pursuant to that subsection.~~
