SUMMARY—Establishes provisions relating to certain early childhood education programs. (BDR 34-1134)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the Department of Education to develop a plan for early childhood education; ~~requiring~~ **authorizing** the Department to apply for money for certain prekindergarten programs; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 **Section 1** of this bill requires the Department of Education to adopt a plan for early
2 childhood education for programs of prekindergarten education which are provided by a
3 school district or charter school, or which are supported by public money.

4 **Section 3** of this bill ~~further requires~~ **authorizes** the Department to apply for any
5 available grants of money from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public
6 Law 111-5, for the Department to use to grant money to certain programs of prekindergarten
7 education.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 388 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 *1. The Department shall establish a plan for early childhood education in*
4 *this State which sets forth the standards and guidelines for programs of*
5 *prekindergarten education. The plan must be designed to promote the*
6 *development and school readiness of children in prekindergarten education in*
7 *this State and must include, without limitation, guidelines for:*

- 8 (a) *The physical well-being and motor development of children;*
- 9 (b) *The successful adjustment of children to a school environment;*
- 10 (c) *Suggested approaches to learning and methods for teaching children;*
- 11 (d) *The development of speech and language of children; and*
- 12 (e) *Providing general knowledge to children.*

13 *2. Each program of prekindergarten education in this State which is*
14 *provided by a school district or charter school, or which operates, in whole or in*

1 *part, using money from a public source must comply with the provisions of the*
2 *plan developed by the Department pursuant to subsection 1.*

3 3. *The Department may:*

4 (a) *Adopt, implement and provide training to educational personnel and*
5 *other personnel who provide prekindergarten education to children in this State.*

6 (b) *Provide assistance to programs of prekindergarten education in this State*
7 *to ensure the school readiness of children who attend prekindergarten.*

8 4. *The Department shall, within the limits of money available for that*
9 *purpose, grant money to programs of prekindergarten education which comply*
10 *with the provisions of this section.*

11 5. *The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall prepare an annual report*
12 *concerning the plan developed pursuant to subsection 1 and the programs of*
13 *prekindergarten education conducted in this State, including, without limitation:*

14 (a) *Demographic information for children enrolled in such programs; and*

15 (b) *An analysis of the school readiness of children who complete a program*
16 *of prekindergarten education.*

17 6. *The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall submit the report*
18 *prepared pursuant to subsection 5 on or before February 1 of each:*

19 (a) *Odd-numbered year to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for*
20 *transmission to the next regular session of the Legislature.*

21 (b) *Even-numbered year to the Legislative Committee on Education.*

22 7. *Nothing in this section requires:*

23 (a) *A school district, charter school or the Department to provide a program*
24 *of prekindergarten education; or*

25 (b) *A parent or legal guardian of a child to enroll the child in a program of*
26 *prekindergarten education.*

27 8. *As used in this section, "school readiness" means the ability of a child to*
28 *enter kindergarten with an appropriate level of skills, knowledge and maturity to*
29 *successfully participate in kindergarten.*

30 **Sec. 2.** NRS 392.375 is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 392.375 1. At least twice each school year, a school district shall require all
32 the pupils in the school district who ride a school bus to practice the evacuation of a
33 school bus for a purpose other than a crisis governed by NRS 392.600 to 392.656,
34 inclusive, and to receive instruction in the responsibility of a passenger of a school
35 bus to use the emergency exit doors on the bus during such an evacuation.

36 2. Each school district shall adopt a safety program which does not concern a
37 crisis governed by NRS 392.600 to 392.656, inclusive, and which includes, without
38 limitation:

39 (a) The procedure for pupils to safely enter and exit a school bus, including
40 entering and exiting with a driver of a school bus as an escort;

41 (b) Proper behavior and conduct of pupils while in areas around a school bus
42 where a high risk of danger to pupils exists, including the area that is used to load
43 and unload school buses;

44 (c) Behavior and conduct of pupils while on a school bus that will enhance the
45 safety of the pupils;

46 (d) Evacuation of pupils from a school bus; and

47 (e) The location of emergency equipment on a school bus.

48 ↪ At least annually, a school district shall require all pupils who are enrolled in
49 preschool, *prekindergarten*, kindergarten and in grades 1 to 4, inclusive, in the
50 school district who ride a school bus to participate in the safety program created
51 pursuant to this section.

52 3. If a parent or legal guardian enrolls his child in preschool,
53 *prekindergarten*, kindergarten or grades 1 to 6, inclusive, and the child will be

1 riding a school bus for the first time, the school shall provide the parent or legal
2 guardian, upon enrollment, with written information concerning the safety of pupils
3 on a school bus. The information must include, without limitation:

4 (a) A description of each location that is designated to load and unload a school
5 bus which is in geographical proximity to the pupil's residence;

6 (b) Rules of conduct for pupils on a school bus and at an area that is designated
7 for pupils to enter and exit a school bus;

8 (c) Instructions for the operation of a motor vehicle:

9 (1) At school crossing zones and in areas that are designated to load and
10 unload a school bus; and

11 (2) When a driver of a school bus operates a system of flashing red lights;

12 (d) A description of the area around a school bus that poses a high risk of
13 danger to pupils and other pedestrians; and

14 (e) Behavior and conduct for pupils who walk to and from an area that is
15 designated for pupils to enter and exit a school bus that will enhance the safety of
16 the pupils.

17 4. The board of trustees of each school district shall adopt regulations
18 regarding practices conducted pursuant to subsection 1 and participation in safety
19 programs required by subsection 2, including the requirement of such practices and
20 participation in such programs at the beginning of any field trip by school bus.

21 **Sec. 3.** 1. The Department ~~shall~~ of Education may apply for any
22 available grants of money from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of
23 2009, Public Law 111-5, for the Department to use to grant money to programs of
24 prekindergarten education which comply with the provisions of section 1 of this
25 act.

26 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, if any money is
27 received by this State pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of
28 2009, Public Law 111-5, which is designated for expenditure from the State
29 Distributive School Account in the State General Fund by the Legislature for Fiscal
30 Years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 for the Department to use to grant money to
31 programs of prekindergarten education which comply with the provisions of section
32 1 of this act, the money must be deposited in the State Distributive School Account
33 and accounted for separately.

34 **Sec. 4.** 1. This section and section 3 of this act become effective upon
35 passage and approval.

36 2. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2009, for purposes of
37 developing a plan for early childhood education and on July 1, 2010, for all other
38 purposes.

39 3. Section 2 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2010.
