

SENATE BILL NO. 113—SENATOR HORSFORD

PREFILED JANUARY 23, 2009

Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Creates statutory subcommittees of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice. (BDR 14-626)

AN ACT relating to the criminal justice system; creating statutory subcommittees of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section 2 of this bill creates in statute the Subcommittee on Juvenile Justice of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice. **Section 2** also: (1) requires the Chairman of the Commission to appoint the members of the Subcommittee; (2) requires the Subcommittee to study issues related to juvenile justice and report to the Commission with recommendations to address such issues; and (3) sets forth the salaries and per diem that members of the Subcommittee may receive.

Section 3 of this bill creates in statute a Subcommittee on Victims of Crime of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice. **Section 3** also: (1) requires the Chairman of the Commission to appoint the members of the Subcommittee; (2) requires the Subcommittee to study issues related to victims of crime and report to the Commission with recommendations to address such issues; and (3) sets forth the salaries and per diem that members of the Subcommittee may receive.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 176 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. *There is hereby created the Subcommittee on Juvenile Justice of the Commission.*



1 2. The Chairman of the Commission shall appoint the
2 members of the Subcommittee and designate one of the members
3 of the Subcommittee as Chairman of the Subcommittee. The
4 Chairman of the Subcommittee must be a member of the
5 Commission.

6 3. The Subcommittee shall meet at the times and places
7 specified by a call of the Chairman. A majority of the members of
8 the Subcommittee constitutes a quorum, and a quorum may
9 exercise any power or authority conferred on the Subcommittee.

10 4. The Subcommittee shall consider issues related to juvenile
11 justice and shall evaluate, review and submit a report to the
12 Commission with recommendations concerning such issues.

13 5. Any Legislators who are members of the Subcommittee are
14 entitled to receive the salary provided for a majority of the
15 members of the Legislature during the first 60 days of
16 the preceding session for each day's attendance at a meeting of
17 the Subcommittee.

18 6. While engaged in the business of the Subcommittee, to the
19 extent of legislative appropriation, each member of the
20 Subcommittee is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and
21 travel expenses provided for state officers and employees
22 generally.

23 Sec. 3. 1. There is hereby created the Subcommittee on
24 Victims of Crime of the Commission.

25 2. The Chairman of the Commission shall appoint the
26 members of the Subcommittee and designate one of the members
27 of the Subcommittee as Chairman of the Subcommittee. The
28 Chairman of the Subcommittee must be a member of the
29 Commission.

30 3. The Subcommittee shall meet at the times and places
31 specified by a call of the Chairman. A majority of the members of
32 the Subcommittee constitutes a quorum, and a quorum may
33 exercise any power or authority conferred on the Subcommittee.

34 4. The Subcommittee shall consider issues related to victims
35 of crime and shall evaluate, review and submit a report to the
36 Commission with recommendations concerning such issues.

37 5. Any Legislators who are members of the Subcommittee are
38 entitled to receive the salary provided for a majority of the
39 members of the Legislature during the first 60 days of
40 the preceding session for each day's attendance at a meeting of
41 the Subcommittee.

42 6. While engaged in the business of the Subcommittee, to the
43 extent of legislative appropriation, each member of the
44 Subcommittee is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and



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1 *travel expenses provided for state officers and employees*
2 *generally.*

3 **Sec. 4.** NRS 176.0121 is hereby amended to read as follows:
4 176.0121 As used in NRS 176.0121 to 176.0129, inclusive,
5 *and sections 2 and 3 of this act*, “Commission” means the Advisory
6 Commission on the Administration of Justice.

7 **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.
