

SENATE BILL NO. 143—COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

FEBRUARY 17, 2009

Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation to the Interim Finance Committee for allocation to pay costs relating to the implementation of certain legislation. (BDR S-1034)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Interim Finance Committee for allocation to pay costs relating to the implementation of certain legislation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 This bill makes an appropriation of \$500,000 from the State General Fund to
2 the Interim Finance Committee for allocation to pay costs relating to the
3 implementation of legislation concerning state revenue enacted during the 75th
4 Session of the Nevada Legislature.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
2 General Fund to the Interim Finance Committee the sum of
3 \$500,000 for allocation to pay costs relating to the implementation
4 of legislation concerning state revenue enacted during the 75th
5 Session of the Nevada Legislature.
6 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
7 subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30,
8 2011, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity
9 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise
10 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated
11 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after
12 September 16, 2011, by either the entity to which the money was



- 1 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
- 2 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
- 3 Fund on or before September 16, 2011.
- 4 **Sec. 2.** (Deleted by amendment.)

- 6 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
