BREEDEN, COFFIN, HARDY, LEE, MATHEWS AND WOODHOUSE

MARCH 9, 2009

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JOINT SPONSORS: ASSEMBLYMEN BOBZIEN, AIZLEY, HOGAN,

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Referred to Committee on Health and Education

**SUMMARY**—Requires school districts to use certain environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products. (BDR 34-742)

**FISCAL NOTE:** Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.  
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to education; requiring the Department of Education to adopt regulations setting forth the standards for environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools; requiring school districts to ensure that only environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products are used in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools; prescribing the process for a waiver under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 2** of this bill expresses the intent of the Legislature with regard to the  
2 manner in which school districts may reduce the potential exposure of pupils and  
3 school personnel to potentially hazardous chemicals and substances.

4      **Section 3** of this bill requires the Department of Education to adopt regulations  
5 setting forth the standards for environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance  
6 products for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools in this  
7 State. **Section 3** also requires school districts to ensure that only environmentally  
8 sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the cleaning of all floor  
9 surfaces are used in the public schools in accordance with the regulations adopted  
10 by the Department. **Section 3** further provides that a school district may submit a  
11 written request to the Department for a waiver from these requirements under

12 certain circumstances and authorizes the board of trustees of a school district to use  
13 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the  
14 cleaning of any other surfaces.

15 **Section 5** of this bill requires school districts to ensure that the public schools  
16 within the school district comply with the requirements of **section 3** of this bill on  
17 or before July 1, 2010.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 386 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

3 **Sec. 2. *The Legislature declares that:***

4 *1. Children are particularly vulnerable to and may be  
5 severely affected by exposure to chemicals, hazardous wastes and  
6 other environmental hazards that may be used for cleaning and  
7 maintenance in the public schools; and*

8 *2. It is the intent of the Legislature to reduce the possible  
9 exposure of pupils and school personnel to potentially hazardous  
10 chemicals and substances which are used in the cleaning and  
11 maintenance of the public schools in this State.*

12 **Sec. 3. 1. The Department of Education shall, in  
13 consultation with each school district, the State Department of  
14 Conservation and Natural Resources, the Department of Health  
15 and Human Services and other interested parties, including,  
16 without limitation, representatives of the cleaning and  
17 maintenance product industry, nongovernmental agencies and  
18 organizations, and parents and legal guardians of pupils enrolled  
19 in the school district, adopt regulations setting forth the standards  
20 for environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products  
21 for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools.**

22 **2. The Department shall provide a sample list of approved  
23 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for  
24 use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces to each school district  
25 based upon the standards prescribed pursuant to subsection 1.**

26 **3. The Department shall, at least every 2 years, review and  
27 may amend the sample list developed pursuant to subsection 2 as  
28 necessary.**

29 **4. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 6 and 7, each  
30 school district shall ensure that the public schools within the  
31 school district use only environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
32 maintenance products in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the  
33 public schools within the school district in accordance with the  
34 regulations adopted pursuant to subsection 1.**

1       5. The board of trustees of a school district may consult with  
2 persons who are knowledgeable and have experience in  
3 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products to  
4 determine if the board of trustees should:

5       (a) Submit a written request to the Department pursuant to  
6 subsection 6 or 7.

7       (b) Use any other environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
8 maintenance products in the public schools within the school  
9 district pursuant to subsection 9.

10      6. If the board of trustees of a school district determines that  
11 the costs associated with the purchase or use of environmentally  
12 sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for use in the  
13 cleaning of floor surfaces are unreasonable and would place an  
14 undue burden on the efficient operation of the school district or a  
15 particular school within the school district, the board of trustees  
16 may submit a written request to the Department for a waiver from  
17 purchasing and using environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
18 maintenance products for use in the cleaning of floor surfaces for  
19 the school district as a whole or for a particular school or schools  
20 within the school district.

21      7. If the board of trustees of a school district determines that  
22 an environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance product  
23 for use in the cleaning of floor surfaces which is not included in  
24 the sample list developed pursuant to subsection 2 is more  
25 economically feasible or is a more effective environmentally  
26 sensitive cleaning and maintenance product, the board of trustees  
27 may submit a written request to the Department for a waiver to  
28 purchase and use such an environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
29 maintenance product that complies with the standards prescribed  
30 pursuant to subsection 1.

31      8. If a waiver is granted by the Department pursuant to  
32 subsection 6 or 7, the waiver is effective for 1 year after the date of  
33 its approval and a renewal may be requested on an annual basis in  
34 the manner set forth in subsection 6 or 7, as applicable.

35      9. In addition to the environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
36 maintenance products for use in the cleaning of floor surfaces in  
37 the public schools within the school district required pursuant to  
38 subsection 1, the board of trustees of a school district may use  
39 environmentally sensitive cleaning products for use in the  
40 cleaning of any other surfaces.

41      10. The regulations adopted by the Department must not  
42 prohibit the use of any disinfectant, sanitizer, antimicrobial  
43 product or other cleaning product when necessary to protect the  
44 health and welfare of the pupils enrolled in a school within the  
45 school district and the educational personnel of the school district.

1       **11. As used in this section, “environmentally sensitive  
2 cleaning and maintenance products” means cleaning and  
3 maintenance products that reduce the chemicals, hazardous  
4 wastes and other environmental hazards to which pupils and  
5 school personnel may be exposed.**

6       **Sec. 4.** On or before January 1, 2010, the Department of  
7 Education shall adopt the regulations required by section 3 of this  
8 act.

9       **Sec. 5.** On or before July 1, 2010, each school district shall:

10       1. Ensure that only environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
11 maintenance products for use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces are  
12 used in the public schools within the school district in accordance  
13 with the regulations adopted pursuant to section 3 of this act; or

14       2. Request a waiver from the Department of Education  
15 pursuant to section 3 of this act.

16       **Sec. 6.** 1. On or before January 1, 2011, the board of trustees  
17 of each school district shall prepare and submit to the Department of  
18 Education a written report regarding the implementation of the use  
19 of environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products for  
20 use in the cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools within  
21 the school district. The report must include, without limitation:

22       (a) A description of the cleaning and maintenance products that  
23 were replaced, if any;

24       (b) A description of the environmentally sensitive cleaning and  
25 maintenance products that are used in the public schools within the  
26 school district;

27       (c) A description of any requests for a waiver that the school  
28 district submitted to the Department and the status of the request;  
29 and

30       (d) An evaluation of the effectiveness of the use of  
31 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products on the  
32 health and safety of the pupils and school personnel in the school  
33 district.

34       2. On or before February 1, 2011, the Department of Education  
35 shall submit a written report to the Director of the Legislative  
36 Counsel Bureau for transmission to the 76th Session of the Nevada  
37 Legislature regarding the implementation of the use of  
38 environmentally sensitive cleaning and maintenance products in the  
39 cleaning of all floor surfaces in the public schools within the school  
40 districts in this State. The report must include, without limitation:

41       (a) A compilation of the reports submitted by each school  
42 district pursuant to subsection 1; and

43       (b) A description of the requests for a waiver submitted by  
44 school districts to the Department pursuant to section 3 of this act,  
45 including, without limitation:

- 1           (1) The number of waivers that were granted by the
- 2 Department and the justification for each waiver; and
- 3           (2) The number of waivers that were denied by the
- 4 Department and the reasons for each denial.

5       **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.
