

SENATE BILL NO. 19—COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND EDUCATION  
(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION)

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing the award of grants of money by the Commission on Educational Excellence. (BDR 34-302)

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AN ACT relating to education; revising provisions governing the award of grants of money from the Account for Programs for Innovation and the Prevention of Remediation by the Commission on Educational Excellence; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1       The Commission on Educational Excellence awards grants of money from the  
2 Account for Programs for Innovation and the Prevention of Remediation for  
3 programs designed for pupils enrolled in kindergarten through grade 6 and pupils  
4 enrolled in grades 7 through 12. (NRS 385.3781-385.379) This bill requires the  
5 Commission, when awarding grants for programs designed for pupils enrolled in  
6 grades 7 through 12, to give first priority to applications for programs of summer  
7 school for pupils enrolled in grade 8 who have not completed the courses of study  
8 required for promotion to high school, including the costs of providing  
9 transportation for those pupils. (NRS 385.3785)

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 385.3785 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:  
3       385.3785   1. The Commission shall:



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1       (a) Establish a program of educational excellence designed  
2 exclusively for pupils enrolled in kindergarten through grade 6 in  
3 public schools in this State based upon:

4              (1) The plan to improve the achievement of pupils prepared  
5 by the State Board pursuant to NRS 385.34691;

6              (2) The plan to improve the achievement of pupils prepared  
7 by the board of trustees of each school district pursuant to  
8 NRS 385.348;

9              (3) The plan to improve the achievement of pupils prepared  
10 by the principal of each school pursuant to NRS 385.357, which  
11 may include a program of innovation; and

12              (4) Any other information that the Commission considers  
13 relevant to the development of the program of educational  
14 excellence.

15       (b) Identify programs, practices and strategies that have proven  
16 effective in improving the academic achievement and proficiency of  
17 pupils.

18       (c) Develop a concise application and simple procedures for the  
19 submission of applications by public schools and consortiums of  
20 public schools, including, without limitation, charter schools, for  
21 participation in a program of educational excellence and for grants  
22 of money from the Account. Grants of money must be made for  
23 programs designed for the achievement of pupils that are linked to  
24 the plan to improve the achievement of pupils or for innovative  
25 programs, or both. The Commission shall not award a grant of  
26 money from the Account for a program to provide full-day  
27 kindergarten. All public schools and consortiums of public schools,  
28 including, without limitation, charter schools, are eligible to submit  
29 such an application, regardless of whether the schools have made  
30 adequate yearly progress or failed to make adequate yearly progress.  
31 A public school or a consortium of public schools selected for  
32 participation may be approved by the Commission for participation  
33 for a period not to exceed 2 years, but may reapply.

34       (d) Prescribe a long-range timeline for the review, approval and  
35 evaluation of applications received from public schools and  
36 consortiums of public schools that desire to participate in the  
37 program.

38       (e) Establish guidelines for the review, evaluation and approval  
39 of applications for grants of money from the Account, including,  
40 without limitation, consideration of the list of priorities of public  
41 schools provided by the Department pursuant to subsection 5. To  
42 ensure consistency in the review, evaluation and approval of  
43 applications, if the guidelines authorize the review and evaluation of  
44 applications by less than the entire membership of the Commission,  
45 money must not be allocated from the Account for a grant until the



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1 entire membership of the Commission has reviewed and approved  
2 the application for the grant.

3 (f) Prescribe accountability measures to be carried out by a  
4 public school that participates in the program if that public school  
5 does not meet the annual measurable objectives established by the  
6 State Board pursuant to NRS 385.361, including, without limitation:

7 (1) The specific levels of achievement expected of schools  
8 that participate; and

9 (2) Conditions for schools that do not meet the grant criteria  
10 but desire to continue participation in the program and receive  
11 money from the Account, including, without limitation, a review of  
12 the leadership at the school and recommendations regarding changes  
13 to the appropriate body.

14 (g) Determine the amount of money that is available from the  
15 Account for those public schools and consortiums of public schools  
16 that are selected to participate in the program.

17 (h) Allocate money to public schools and consortiums of public  
18 schools from the Account. Allocations must be distributed not later  
19 than August 15 of each year.

20 (i) Establish criteria for public schools and consortiums of  
21 public schools that participate in the program and receive an  
22 allocation of money from the Account to evaluate the effectiveness  
23 of the allocation in improving the achievement of pupils, including,  
24 without limitation, a detailed analysis of:

25 (1) The achievement of pupils enrolled at each school that  
26 received money from the allocation based upon measurable criteria  
27 identified in the plan to improve the achievement of pupils for the  
28 school prepared pursuant to NRS 385.357;

29 (2) If applicable, the effectiveness of the program of  
30 innovation on the achievement of pupils and the overall  
31 effectiveness for pupils and staff;

32 (3) The implementation of the applicable plans for  
33 improvement, including, without limitation, an analysis of whether  
34 the school is meeting the measurable objectives identified in the  
35 plan; and

36 (4) The attainment of measurable progress on the annual list  
37 of adequate yearly progress of school districts and schools.

38 2. To the extent money is available, the Commission shall  
39 make allocations of money to public schools and consortiums of  
40 public schools for effective programs for grades 7 through 12 that  
41 are designed to improve the achievement of pupils and effective  
42 programs of innovation for pupils. In making such allocations, the  
43 Commission shall ~~comply~~:

44 (a) **Comply** with the requirements of subsection 1 ~~H~~; and



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1       (b) Give first priority to applications which propose to establish  
2 or maintain a program of summer school that is designed for  
3 pupils enrolled in grade 8 who have not completed the courses of  
4 study or credits required for promotion to high school, including,  
5 without limitation, the costs of providing transportation for those  
6 pupils. If more applications are submitted for a summer school  
7 program than the amount of money available, the Commission  
8 shall make its determination based upon the list of priorities of  
9 schools provided by the Department pursuant to subsection 5.

10      3. The Commission shall ensure, to the extent practicable, that  
11 grants of money provided pursuant to this section reflect the  
12 economic and geographic diversity of this State.

13      4. If a public school or consortium that receives money  
14 pursuant to subsection 1 or 2:

15       (a) Does not meet the criteria for effectiveness as prescribed in  
16 paragraph (i) of subsection 1;

17       (b) Does not, as a result of the program for which the grant of  
18 money was awarded, show improvement in the achievement of  
19 pupils, as determined in an evaluation conducted pursuant to  
20 subsection 3 of NRS 385.379; or

21       (c) Does not implement the program for which the money was  
22 received, as determined in an evaluation conducted pursuant to  
23 subsection 3 of NRS 385.379,

24       → over a 2-year period, the Commission may consider not awarding  
25 future allocations of money to that public school or consortium of  
26 public schools.

27      5. On or before July 1 of each year, the Department shall  
28 provide a list of priorities of public schools that indicates:

29       (a) The adequate yearly progress status of schools in the  
30 immediately preceding year; and

31       (b) The public schools that are considered Title I eligible by the  
32 Department based upon the poverty level of the pupils enrolled in a  
33 school in comparison to the poverty level of the pupils in the school  
34 district as a whole,

35       → for consideration by the Commission in its development of  
36 procedures for the applications.

37      6. A public school, including, without limitation, a charter  
38 school, or a consortium of public schools may request assistance  
39 from the school district in which the school is located in preparing  
40 an application for a grant of money pursuant to this section. A  
41 school district shall assist each public school or consortium of  
42 public schools that requests assistance pursuant to this subsection to  
43 ensure that the application of the school:

44       (a) Is based directly upon the plan to improve the achievement  
45 of pupils prepared for the school pursuant to NRS 385.357;



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1       (b) Is developed in accordance with the criteria established by  
2 the Commission; and

3       (c) Is complete and complies with all technical requirements for  
4 the submission of an application.

5       → A school district may make recommendations to the individual  
6 schools and consortiums of public schools. Such schools and  
7 consortiums of public schools are not required to follow the  
8 recommendations of a school district.

9       7. In carrying out the requirements of this section, the  
10 Commission shall review and consider the programs of remedial  
11 study adopted by the Department pursuant to NRS 385.389, the list  
12 of approved providers of supplemental *educational* services  
13 maintained by the Department pursuant to NRS 385.384 and the  
14 recommendations submitted by the Committee pursuant to NRS  
15 218.5354 concerning programs, practices and strategies that have  
16 proven effective in improving the academic achievement and  
17 proficiency of pupils.

18       8. If a consortium of public schools is formed for the purpose  
19 of submitting an application pursuant to this section, the public  
20 schools within the consortium do not need to be located within the  
21 same school district.

22       **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.

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
