**SUMMARY**—Limits the maximum speed on certain portions of State Route 159. (BDR 43-1072)

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AN ACT relating to highways; limiting the maximum speed on certain portions of State Route 159; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1        This bill establishes the State Route 159 Speed Reduction Zone to limit  
2        vehicular traffic to not more than 45 miles per hour on any portion of State Route  
3        159 that: (1) is within the Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area; (2) abuts  
4        or is immediately adjacent to the Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area; or  
5        (3) has been designated as a Scenic Byway or State Scenic Byway.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1        **Section 1.** The Legislature hereby finds and declares that:  
2              1. Because of the unique character of the Red Rock Canyon  
3        National Conservation Area, restrictions on the maximum speed for  
4        vehicular traffic in and around the Red Rock Canyon National  
5        Conservation Area are necessary for:  
6              (a) The protection of the natural environment in and around the  
7        Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area; and



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1       (b) The safety and protection of the residents and visitors who  
2 enjoy the scenic beauty and recreational opportunities in and around  
3 the Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area.

4       2. The enactment of this act is not intended to encourage the  
5 imposition of similar restrictions on other designated highways in  
6 this State.

7       **Sec. 2.** Chapter 484 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
8 thereto a new section to read as follows:

9       ***1. The State Route 159 Speed Reduction Zone is hereby  
10 established.***

11       ***2. Within the State Route 159 Speed Reduction Zone, the  
12 Department of Transportation, in cooperation with other  
13 governmental entities whose jurisdiction includes this area, shall  
14 ensure that:***

15       ***(a) The maximum speed that is allowed for vehicular traffic is  
16 set at a level which does not exceed 45 miles per hour; and***

17       ***(b) Adequate signage or other forms of notice are posted and  
18 maintained to advise motorists of that maximum allowable speed.***

19       ***3. The State Route 159 Speed Reduction Zone consists of:***

20       ***(a) Any portion of State Route 159 that is within the Red Rock  
21 Canyon National Conservation Area;***

22       ***(b) Any portion of State Route 159 that abuts or is immediately  
23 adjacent to the Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area;  
24 and***

25       ***(c) Any portion of State Route 159 that has been designated as  
26 a Scenic Byway or State Scenic Byway.***

27       ***4. As used in this section, "Scenic Byway" and "State Scenic  
28 Byway" have the meanings ascribed to them in the National  
29 Scenic Byways Program, as issued by the Federal Highway  
30 Administration in 60 Federal Register 26,759 on May 18, 1995.***

31       **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.

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
