**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing automated external defibrillators. (BDR 40-277)

AN ACT relating to public health; requiring the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services, within the limitations of available funding, to establish and maintain a database of certain owners of automated external defibrillators for use in an emergency; providing for the registration of automated external defibrillators with the Health Division; authorizing all public schools in this State to acquire automated external defibrillators under certain circumstances; providing for the placement of automated external defibrillators in medical facilities and health clubs in this State; providing a civil penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 3** of this bill: (1) requires the Health Division of the Department of  
2      Health and Human Services to establish and maintain, within the limitations of  
3      available funding, a database containing certain information concerning automated  
4      external defibrillators in this State and to make the information in the database  
5      available to each agency and facility that employs an emergency medical dispatcher  
6      in this State; (2) authorizes an emergency medical dispatcher to disclose the  
7      information in the database to any person for the purpose of providing emergency  
8      medical care; (3) requires a manufacturer that sells an automated external  
9      defibrillator for commercial use in this State to provide certain information to the  
10     purchaser and the Health Division; (4) authorizes the owner of an automated  
11     external defibrillator in this State to register the defibrillator with the Health  
12     Division; and (5) provides for the imposition of civil penalties against  
13     manufacturers for violations. **Section 4** of this bill authorizes the board of trustees  
14     of each school district in this State, to the extent that money is available, to provide  
15     for the placement of automated external defibrillators in certain locations. **Section 4**

16 also provides for the placement of automated external defibrillators in medical  
17 facilities and health clubs in this State.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1      **Section 1.** Chapter 450B of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.
- 3      **Sec. 2.** *As used in NRS 450B.600 and sections 2, 3 and 4 of  
4 this act, unless the context otherwise requires, "automated  
5 external defibrillator" or "defibrillator" means a medical device  
6 that:*
- 7      *1. Has been approved by the United States Food and Drug  
8 Administration;*
- 9      *2. Is capable of recognizing the presence or absence of  
10 ventricular fibrillation and rapid ventricular tachycardia in a  
11 patient;*
- 12     *3. Is capable of determining, without intervention by the  
13 operator of the device, whether defibrillation should be performed  
14 on a patient;*
- 15     *4. Upon determining that defibrillation should be performed  
16 on a patient, automatically charges and requests delivery of an  
17 electrical impulse to the patient's heart; and*
- 18     *5. Upon appropriate action by the operator of the device,  
19 delivers an appropriate electrical impulse to the patient's heart.*
- 20      **Sec. 3.** *1. The Health Division shall:*
- 21     *(a) Within the limitations of available funding, establish and  
22 maintain a database containing:*
- 23     *(1) The name and address of each person who owns an  
24 automated external defibrillator for commercial use in this State;*
- 25     *(2) If the defibrillator has been registered with the Health  
26 Division pursuant to subsection 4, the name, street address and  
27 telephone number of the business or organization that has placed  
28 the defibrillator for use on its premises, and the specific location at  
29 which the defibrillator is stored; and*
- 30     *(3) If the defibrillator has been registered with the Health  
31 Division pursuant to subsection 5, the information concerning the  
32 defibrillator that was required for registration by the Health  
33 Division.*
- 34     *(b) Make the information in the database available to each  
35 agency and facility that employs an emergency medical dispatcher  
36 in this State.*
- 37     *(c) Apply for and accept any gifts, grants or donations to  
38 establish and maintain the database.*



1       2. An emergency medical dispatcher may disclose the  
2 information in the database to any person for the purpose of  
3 providing emergency medical care.

4       3. A manufacturer that sells an automated external  
5 defibrillator for commercial use in this State shall:

6           (a) Notify the purchaser in writing of the opportunity to  
7 register the defibrillator pursuant to subsection 4;

8           (b) On or before January 10, April 10, July 10 and October 10  
9 of each year, notify the Health Division of the name and address  
10 of each person who purchased such a defibrillator from the  
11 manufacturer during the immediately preceding 3 calendar  
12 months; and

13           (c) Provide to each person who purchases such a defibrillator  
14 from the manufacturer information regarding the installation,  
15 use, maintenance and operation of the defibrillator and any  
16 related training that is available.

17       4. A person who purchases an automated external  
18 defibrillator for commercial use in this State may register the  
19 defibrillator with the Health Division by providing the Health  
20 Division with his name, street address and telephone number, the  
21 name, street address and telephone number of the business or  
22 organization on whose premises the defibrillator will be placed for  
23 use, and the specific location at which the defibrillator will be  
24 stored.

25       5. A person who owns an automated external defibrillator for  
26 use in a private residence may register the defibrillator with the  
27 Health Division by providing such information concerning the  
28 defibrillator as required by the Health Division.

29       6. The Health Division may impose a civil penalty upon a  
30 manufacturer of not more than \$500 for each violation of this  
31 section by the manufacturer. All money collected from the  
32 imposition of a civil penalty must be used for the maintenance of  
33 the database established pursuant to subsection 1.

34       Sec. 4. 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 450B.600,  
35 the board of trustees of each school district in this State, to the  
36 extent that money is available, may provide for the placement of  
37 an automated external defibrillator in each public school in the  
38 school district and at each athletic facility maintained by the  
39 school district at a location that is separate from a public school.  
40 Each defibrillator must be appropriate for use on children and  
41 adults and be limited to use on school property and at school  
42 events. The board of trustees may accept:

43           (a) The donation of a defibrillator that complies with the  
44 standards established by the United States Food and Drug

1       (b) *Gifts, grants and donations for use in obtaining, inspecting  
2 and maintaining a defibrillator.*

3       2. *Each medical facility and health club in this State may  
4 provide for the placement of an automated external defibrillator in  
5 a central location at the medical facility or health club.*

6       3. *Each school district, medical facility and health club that  
7 provides for the placement of one or more automated external  
8 defibrillators pursuant to this section shall:*

9           (a) *Ensure that each defibrillator is inspected and maintained  
10 on a regular basis; and*

11           (b) *Require any employee who will use a defibrillator to  
12 complete the training requirements of a course in basic emergency  
13 care of a person in cardiac arrest that includes training in the  
14 operation and use of an automated external defibrillator and is  
15 conducted in accordance with the standards of the American  
16 Heart Association, the American National Red Cross or any  
17 similar organization.*

18       4. *As used in this section:*

19           (a) *"Health club" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
20 NRS 598.9415.*

21           (b) *"Medical facility" means:*

22              (1) *A facility for hospice care as defined in NRS 449.0033;*  
23              (2) *A facility for intermediate care as defined in  
24 NRS 449.0038;*

25              (3) *A facility for skilled nursing as defined in  
26 NRS 449.0039;*

27              (4) *A hospital as defined in NRS 449.012;*  
28              (5) *An independent center for emergency medical care as  
29 defined in NRS 449.013; or*

30              (6) *A surgical center for ambulatory patients as defined in  
31 NRS 449.019.*

32           (c) *"School property" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
33 NRS 701B.350.*

34       Sec. 5. NRS 450B.600 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35       450B.600 1. Not later than July 1, 2004, and thereafter:

36           (a) The board of trustees of a school district in a county whose  
37 population is 100,000 or more shall ensure that at least one  
38 automated external defibrillator is placed in a central location at  
39 each high school within the district.

40           (b) The Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority shall ensure that at least  
41 three automated external defibrillators are placed in central locations  
42 at the largest airport within the county.

43           (c) The board of county commissioners of each county whose  
44 population is 400,000 or more shall ensure that at least seven

1 automated external defibrillators are placed in central locations at  
2 the largest airport within the county.

3 (d) The Board of Regents of the University of Nevada shall  
4 ensure that at least two automated external defibrillators are placed  
5 in central locations at each of:

6 (1) The largest indoor sporting arena or events center  
7 controlled by the University in a county whose population is  
8 100,000 or more but less than 400,000; and

9 (2) The largest indoor sporting arena or events center  
10 controlled by the University in a county whose population is  
11 400,000 or more.

12 (e) The Health Division shall ensure that at least one automated  
13 external defibrillator is placed in a central location at each of the  
14 following state buildings:

15 (1) The Capitol Building in Carson City;

16 (2) ~~The Kinkead Building in Carson City;~~

17 ~~(3)~~ The Legislative Building in Carson City; and

18 ~~(4)~~ (3) The Grant Sawyer Building in Las Vegas.

19 (f) The board of county commissioners of each county whose  
20 population is 100,000 or more shall:

21 (1) Identify five county buildings or offices in each of their  
22 respective counties which are characterized by large amounts of  
23 pedestrian traffic or which house one or more county agencies that  
24 provide services to large numbers of persons; and

25 (2) Ensure that at least one automated external defibrillator is  
26 placed in a central location at each county building or office  
27 identified pursuant to subparagraph (1).

28 2. Each governmental entity that is required to ensure the  
29 placement of one or more automated external defibrillators pursuant  
30 to subsection 1:

31 (a) May accept gifts, grants and donations for use in obtaining,  
32 inspecting and maintaining the defibrillators;

33 (b) Shall ensure that those defibrillators are inspected and  
34 maintained on a regular basis; and

35 (c) Shall encourage the entity where the automated external  
36 defibrillator is placed to require any employee who will use the  
37 automated external defibrillator to successfully complete the  
38 training requirements of a course in basic emergency care of a  
39 person in cardiac arrest that includes training in the operation and  
40 use of an automated external defibrillator and is conducted in  
41 accordance with the standards of the American Heart Association,  
42 the American National Red Cross or any ~~other~~ similar  
43 organization.

44 ~~13. As used in this section, "automated external defibrillator"~~  
45 means a medical device that:

- 1       (a) Has been approved by the United States Food and Drug  
2 Administration;  
3       (b) Is capable of recognizing the presence or absence, in a

5       (c) Is capable of determining, without intervention by the  
6 operator of the device, whether defibrillation should be performed

8       (d) Upon determining that defibrillation should be performed,  
9 automatically charges and requests delivery of an electrical impulse  
10 to the patient's heart; and  
11      (e) Upon action by the operator of the device, delivers to the  
12 patient's heart an appropriate electrical impulse.]
