

SENATE BILL NO. 37—COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES

(ON BEHALF OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION  
AND NATURAL RESOURCES)

PREFILED DECEMBER 5, 2008

**SUMMARY**—Authorizes the award of subgrants for certain purposes relating to the control of water pollution.  
(BDR 40-360)

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AN ACT relating to water pollution; authorizing the Division of Environmental Protection of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to award subgrants for set-aside programs authorized by the federal Safe Drinking Water Act; authorizing the Director of the Department to award subgrants for certain purposes relating to the control of water pollution; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law creates the Account to Finance the Construction of Projects in the  
2 Fund for Water Projects Loans. This account is commonly referred to as the  
3 Account for the Revolving Fund. (NRS 445A.255) Existing law also creates an  
4 account to fund activities, other than projects, that are authorized by the federal  
5 Safe Drinking Water Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 300f et seq. This account is created in the  
6 Fund for the Municipal Bond Bank and is commonly referred to as the Account for  
7 Set-Aside Programs. (NRS 445A.255) The Division of Environmental Protection of  
8 the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources administers the  
9 accounts, is authorized to accept grants from the Federal Government and any other  
10 public or private source for the accounts and is authorized to use the money in the  
11 accounts only for the purposes set forth in the Safe Drinking Water Act. (NRS  
12 445A.255, 445A.265) The purposes for which the Division may use the money in  
13 the Account for Set-Aside Programs include causing the performance of set-aside  
14 programs authorized by the Safe Drinking Water Act through an interagency  
15 agreement, contract or memorandum of understanding. (NRS 445A.265) **Section 1**  
16 of this bill authorizes the Division to award subgrants for such purposes.

17 Existing law authorizes the Director of the Department to take certain actions  
18 relating to the control of water pollution in Nevada, including taking all steps  
19 necessary to qualify for, accept and administer loans and grants from the Federal  
20 Government and any other public and private source relating to the control of water  
21 pollution and the assurance of water quality. (NRS 445A.450) **Section 2** of this bill  
22 authorizes the Director to award subgrants for such purposes.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 445A.265 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3 445A.265 1. The Division shall:

4 (a) Use the money in the Account for the Revolving Fund and  
5 the Account for Set-Aside Programs for the purposes set forth in the  
6 Safe Drinking Water Act.

7 (b) Determine whether public water systems which receive  
8 money or other assistance from the Account for the Revolving Fund  
9 or the Account for Set-Aside Programs comply with the Safe  
10 Drinking Water Act and regulations adopted pursuant thereto.

11 2. The Division may:

12 (a) Prepare and enter into required agreements with the Federal  
13 Government for the acceptance of grants of money for the Account  
14 for the Revolving Fund and the Account for Set-Aside Programs.

15 (b) Bind itself to terms of the required agreements.

16 (c) Accept grants made pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water  
17 Act.

18 (d) Manage the Account for the Revolving Fund and the  
19 Account for Set-Aside Programs in accordance with the  
20 requirements and objectives of the Safe Drinking Water Act.

21 (e) Provide services relating to management and administration  
22 of the Account for the Revolving Fund and the Account for Set-  
23 Aside Programs, including the preparation of any agreement, plan or  
24 report.

25 (f) Perform, or cause to be performed by the Nevada Rural  
26 Water Association or other persons, agencies or organizations  
27 through interagency agreement, *subgrant*, contract or memorandum  
28 of understanding, set-aside programs pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §  
29 300j-12 of the Safe Drinking Water Act.

30 3. The Division shall not:

31 (a) Commit any money in the Account for the Revolving Fund  
32 for expenditure for the purposes set forth in NRS 445A.275; or

33 (b) Establish the priorities for determining which public water  
34 systems will receive money or other assistance from the Account for  
35 the Revolving Fund,

1 ➔ without obtaining the prior approval of the Board for Financing  
2 Water Projects.

3     **Sec. 2.** NRS 445A.450 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
4         445A.450 The Director may:

5         1. Perform any acts consistent with the requirements of state  
6 and federal legislation concerning the control of the injection of fluids through a well and the control of water pollution and  
7 conditions thereof relating to participation in and administration by  
9 this State of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System;

10         2. Advise, consult and cooperate with other agencies of the State, the Federal Government, other states, interstate agencies and with other persons in furthering the purposes of NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive;

11         3. Take the steps necessary to qualify for, accept and administer loans and grants from the Federal Government and from other sources, public or private, for carrying out any functions under NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive;

12         4. *Award subgrants to eligible persons to assist the Director in carrying out any functions under NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive;*

13         5. Encourage, request, participate in or conduct studies, surveys, investigations, research, experiments, demonstrations and pilot programs by contract, grant or other means;

14         ~~5.~~ 6. Maintain or require supervisors and operators of treatment plants which are privately owned or owned by a municipality or other public entity to maintain records and devices for continuing observation and establish or require these supervisors and operators to establish procedures for making inspections and obtaining samples necessary to prepare reports;

15         ~~6.~~ 7. Collect and disseminate information to the public as he considers advisable and necessary for the discharge of his duties under NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive;

16         ~~7.~~ 8. Hold hearings and issue subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses and the production of evidence as he finds necessary to carry out the provisions of NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive;

17         ~~8.~~ 9. Exercise all incidental powers necessary to carry out the purposes of NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive; and

18         ~~9.~~ 10. Delegate to the Division any function or authority granted to him under NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive.

19     **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
