

SENATE BILL NO. 4—COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND EDUCATION
(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE)

PREFILED NOVEMBER 19, 2008

Referred to Committee on Health and Education

SUMMARY—Requires the establishment of a system for the electronic submission of applications for Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program. (BDR 38-210)

EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public welfare; requiring the Department of Health and Human Services to establish and maintain a system for the electronic submission of applications for Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program; requiring certain agencies to use the system to forward such applications to the Department; requiring the transfer of money from the Abandoned Property Trust Account for the Department to establish and maintain the system; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law provides for the administration of welfare programs pursuant to
2 federal law, including Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program.
3 (Chapters 422 and 422A of NRS) **Section 1** of this bill requires the Department of
4 Health and Human Services to establish and maintain a system which allows
5 applicants for these programs to submit applications electronically. **Section 1**
6 further requires agencies that are designated by the Director of the Department to
7 receive applications or determine eligibility for Medicaid or the Children's Health
8 Insurance Program to use the system to forward applications to the Department.
9 Certain money received by the State pursuant to chapter 120A of NRS,
10 including proceeds from the sale of unclaimed property, is deposited in the
11 Abandoned Property Trust Account. (NRS 120A.620) **Sections 2 and 3** of this bill
12 require an annual transfer of money from the Account for the Department to
13 establish and maintain the system required by **section 1** of this bill.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 422 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. The Department shall establish and maintain a system
4 which allows an applicant for Medicaid or the Children's Health
5 Insurance Program to submit the application electronically. The
6 system must allow an applicant to submit an application through
7 the Internet or another on-line service designated by the
8 Department.*

9 *2. An agency designated by the Director to receive
10 applications or determine eligibility for Medicaid or the Children's Health
11 Insurance Program shall use the system established
12 pursuant to subsection 1 to forward to the Department all
13 applications received by the agency.*

14 *3. An applicant for Medicaid or the Children's Health
15 Insurance Program must not be required to submit an application
16 electronically. If an applicant submits a written application to an
17 agency designated by the Director, the agency shall create an
18 electronic application on behalf of the applicant and use the
19 system established pursuant to subsection 1 to forward the
20 application to the Department.*

21 **Sec. 2.** NRS 120A.620 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22 120A.620 1. There is hereby created in the State General
23 Fund the Abandoned Property Trust Account.

24 2. All money received by the Administrator under this chapter,
25 including the proceeds from the sale of abandoned property, must be
26 deposited by the Administrator in the State General Fund for credit
27 to the Account.

28 3. Before making a deposit, the Administrator shall record
29 the name and last known address of each person appearing from the
30 holders' reports to be entitled to the abandoned property and the
31 name and last known address of each insured person or annuitant,
32 and with respect to each policy or contract listed in the report of an
33 insurance company, its number, the name of the company and the
34 amount due. The record must be available for public inspection at
35 all reasonable business hours.

36 4. The Administrator may pay from money available in the
37 Account:

38 (a) Any costs in connection with the sale of abandoned property.
39 (b) Any costs of mailing and publication in connection with any
40 abandoned property.

41 (c) Reasonable service charges.

1 (d) Any costs incurred in examining the records of a holder and
2 in collecting the abandoned property.

3 (e) Any valid claims filed pursuant to this chapter.

4 5. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 120A.610, by the end
5 of each fiscal year, the balance in the Account must be transferred as
6 follows:

7 (a) The first \$7,600,000 each year must be transferred to the
8 Millennium Scholarship Trust Fund created by NRS 396.926.

9 (b) *After making the transfer pursuant to paragraph (a),
10 \$159,513.84, if available, must be transferred to the Department of
11 Health and Human Services to establish the system required
12 pursuant to section 1 of this act.*

13 (c) The remainder must be transferred to the State General Fund,
14 but remains subject to the valid claims of holders pursuant to NRS
15 120A.590 and owners pursuant to NRS 120A.640. No such claim
16 may be satisfied from money in the Millennium Scholarship Trust
17 Fund ~~[,] or from money transferred to the Department of Health
18 and Human Services pursuant to paragraph (b).~~

19 6. If there is an insufficient amount of money in the Account to
20 pay any cost or charge pursuant to subsection 4, the State Board of
21 Examiners may, upon the application of the Administrator,
22 authorize a temporary transfer from the State General Fund to the
23 Account of an amount necessary to pay those costs or charges. The
24 Administrator shall repay the amount of the transfer as soon as
25 sufficient money is available in the Account.

26 **Sec. 3.** NRS 120A.620 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27 120A.620 1. There is hereby created in the State General
28 Fund the Abandoned Property Trust Account.

29 2. All money received by the Administrator under this chapter,
30 including the proceeds from the sale of abandoned property, must be
31 deposited by the Administrator in the State General Fund for credit
32 to the Account.

33 3. Before making a deposit, the Administrator shall record
34 the name and last known address of each person appearing from the
35 holders' reports to be entitled to the abandoned property and the
36 name and last known address of each insured person or annuitant,
37 and with respect to each policy or contract listed in the report of an
38 insurance company, its number, the name of the company and the
39 amount due. The record must be available for public inspection at
40 all reasonable business hours.

41 4. The Administrator may pay from money available in the

43 (a) Any costs in connection with the sale of abandoned property.

2 (d) Any costs incurred in examining the records of a holder and

4 (e) Any valid claims filed pursuant to this chapter.

5 5. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 120A.610, by the end
6 of each fiscal year, the balance in the Account must be transferred as
7 follows:

8 (a) The first \$7,600,000 each year must be transferred to the
9 Millennium Scholarship Trust Fund created by NRS 396.926.

10 (b) After making the transfer pursuant to paragraph (a),
11 ~~\$159,513.84~~ \$12,500 each year, if available, must be transferred
12 to the Department of Health and Human Services to ~~establish~~
13 maintain the system required pursuant to section 1 of this act.

14 (c) The remainder must be transferred to the State General Fund,
15 but remains subject to the valid claims of holders pursuant to NRS
16 120A.590 and owners pursuant to NRS 120A.640. No such claim
17 may be satisfied from money in the Millennium Scholarship Trust
18 Fund or from money transferred to the Department of Health and
19 Human Services pursuant to paragraph (b).

20 6. If there is an insufficient amount of money in the Account to
21 pay any cost or charge pursuant to subsection 4, the State Board of
22 Examiners may, upon the application of the Administrator,
23 authorize a temporary transfer from the State General Fund to the
24 Account of an amount necessary to pay those costs or charges. The
25 Administrator shall repay the amount of the transfer as soon as
26 sufficient money is available in the Account.

27 **Sec. 4.** 1. This section and sections 1 and 2 of this act
28 become effective on July 1, 2009.

29 2. Section 3 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2010.
