

SENATE BILL NO. 7—SENATOR WIENER

PREFILED NOVEMBER 24, 2008

Referred to Committee on Health and Education

SUMMARY—Makes various changes to the Advisory Council on the State Program for Fitness and Wellness. (BDR 40-23)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets [omitted-material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public health; making various changes relating to the Advisory Council on the State Program for Fitness and Wellness; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides that, within the limits of available money, the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services shall establish the Advisory Council on the State Program for Fitness and Wellness to increase public knowledge, to raise public awareness and to educate the residents of this State on matters relating to physical fitness and wellness. (NRS 439.517, 439.518) **Section 1** of this bill increases the number of voting members of the Advisory Council from 7 to 11 members and authorizes the appointment of additional nonvoting members.

Existing law requires the State Health Officer or his designee to serve as the Chairman of the Advisory Council. **Section 2** of this bill provides instead that a majority of the voting members of the Advisory Council must select a Chairman and a Vice Chairman of the Advisory Council. **Section 2** further authorizes a majority of the voting members of the Advisory Council to appoint committees and subcommittees to study issues relating to physical fitness and wellness and provides for the removal of nonlegislative members. (NRS 439.519)

Existing law authorizes the Health Division to contract with public or private entities to provide services necessary to carry out the State Program for Fitness and Wellness. **Section 3** of this bill authorizes the Health Division to award grants for the same purpose.

Section 4 of this bill revises an appropriation made by the 2007 Legislature to clarify that the money must be accounted for in the nonreverting account created by statute to pay the operational costs of the Advisory Council.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 439.518 is hereby amended to read as follows:
439.518 1. Within the limits of available money, the Health Division shall establish the Advisory Council on the State Program for Fitness and Wellness to advise and make recommendations to the Health Division concerning the Program.

2. The Administrator shall appoint to the Advisory Council the following ~~seven~~ **nine voting** members:

- (a) The State Health Officer or his designee;
- (b) The Superintendent of Public Instruction or his designee;
- (c) One representative of the health insurance industry;
- (d) One provider of health care;
- (e) One representative of the Nevada Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance or its successor organization;

(f) One representative of an organization committed to the prevention of chronic diseases; ~~and~~

(g) One registered dietician ~~and~~;

(h) One representative who is a member of a racial or ethnic minority group; and

(i) One representative of private employers in this State who has experience in matters relating to employment and human resources.

3. The Legislative Commission shall appoint to the Advisory Council the following two voting members:

(a) One member of the Senate; and

(b) One member of the Assembly.

4. A majority of the voting members of the Advisory Council may appoint nonvoting members to the Advisory Council.

Sec. 2. NRS 439.519 is hereby amended to read as follows:

439.519 1. The members of the Advisory Council serve terms of 2 years. A member may be reappointed.

2. ~~The State Health Officer or his designee shall serve as the~~
A majority of the voting members of the Advisory Council shall select a Chairman and a Vice Chairman of the Advisory Council.

3. **A majority of the voting members of the Advisory Council may:**

(a) Appoint committees or subcommittees to study issues relating to physical fitness and wellness.

(b) Remove a nonlegislative member of the Advisory Council for failing to carry out the business of, or serve the best interests of, the Advisory Council.



1 **4.** The Health Division shall, within the limits of available
2 money, provide the necessary professional staff and a secretary for
3 the Advisory Council.

4 ~~[4.]~~ **5.** A majority of the *voting* members of the Advisory
5 Council constitutes a quorum to transact all business, and a majority
6 of those *voting members* present, physically or via
7 telecommunications, must concur in any decision.

8 ~~[5.]~~ **6.** The Advisory Council shall, within the limits of
9 available money, meet at the call of the Administrator, the Chairman
10 or a majority of the *voting* members of the Advisory Council
11 quarterly or as is necessary.

12 ~~[6.]~~ **7.** The members of the Advisory Council serve without
13 compensation, except that each member is entitled, while engaged in
14 the business of the Advisory Council and within the limits of
15 available money, to the per diem allowance and travel expenses
16 provided for state officers and employees generally.

17 **Sec. 3.** NRS 439.523 is hereby amended to read as follows:

18 439.523 The Health Division may, within the limits of
19 available money, enter into contracts with *or award grants to* public
20 or private entities that have the appropriate expertise to provide any
21 services necessary to carry out or assist the Health Division in
22 carrying out the provisions of NRS 439.514 to 439.525, inclusive.

23 **Sec. 4.** Section 35 of chapter 345, Statutes of Nevada 2007, at
24 page 1617, is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 Sec. 35. ~~[1.]~~ There is hereby appropriated from the
26 State General Fund to the account for the Advisory Council
27 on the State Program for Fitness and Wellness, created
28 pursuant to ~~[Senate Bill No. 197 of the 73rd Session of the~~
29 ~~Nevada Legislature, the sum of \$100,000 for the operational~~

31 ~~—2.— Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by~~

44 439.519, the members of the Advisory Council on the State Program

1 1. The provisions of paragraphs (h) and (i) of subsection 2 of
2 NRS 439.518, as amended by section 1 of this act, must be
3 appointed to initial terms of 4 years.

4 2. The provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection 3 of
5 NRS 439.518, as amended by section 1 of this act, must be
6 appointed to initial terms of 2 years.

7 **Sec. 6.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
