**SUMMARY**—Requires the Legislative Committee on Health Care to consider issues relating to the costs and payments for the provision of certain medical services and care. (BDR R-1333)

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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Requiring the Legislative Committee on Health Care to consider issues and make recommendations relating to payments for the provision of certain medical services and care.

1        WHEREAS, The rising cost of health care is a growing problem  
2 in this State, and many factors contribute to this problem; and

3        WHEREAS, The number of hospitals and physicians who have  
4 contracted for the provision of health care impacts the quality and  
5 cost of health care in this State; and

6        WHEREAS, Ensuring a sufficient number of such contracts is  
7 essential to improving the quality and cost of health care in this  
8 State; and

9        WHEREAS, Educating patients and consumers of health care in  
10 this State regarding the financial impact of receiving medical  
11 services and care from out-of-network hospitals and out-of-network  
12 physicians is a vital part of ensuring that patients and consumers  
13 minimize their health care expenses; and

14       WHEREAS, Billed charges by providers of health care have  
15 escalated at a rate far exceeding the rate of inflation; now, therefore,  
16 be it

17       RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE

1 Legislature hereby recognize the importance of restraining the cost  
2 of health care and recognize that patients, hospitals, physicians and  
3 health insurers each play an integral role in restraining those costs;  
4 and be it further

5 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Committee on Health Care,  
6 during the 2009-2010 interim, shall consider and review methods  
7 for establishing a fair and equitable system for the payment of  
8 medical services and care for persons who are covered by a policy  
9 of insurance or other contractual agreement with a third party that  
10 provides coverage for the provision of health care but whose  
11 insurance or other contractual agreement does not cover expenses by  
12 the specific hospital or physician which provided the service or care,  
13 including, to the extent practicable, consideration of:

14 1. The relationship between the actual cost to surgical centers  
15 for ambulatory patients, hospitals and physicians to provide medical  
16 services and care and the charges billed by those providers of health  
17 care;

18 2. The process used by providers of health care in this State  
19 and health insurers and other third parties that provide coverage for  
20 the provision of health care to negotiate contracts;

21 3. The process for granting hospital privileges to physicians in  
22 this State and related issues concerning contracts with health  
23 insurers and other third parties that provide coverage for the  
24 provision of health care;

25 4. Balance billing and collection practices implemented by  
26 providers of health care in this State and the effects of the escalation  
27 of billed charges on the cost of health care; and

28 5. Any other issues deemed necessary by the Chairman of the  
29 Legislative Committee on Health Care; and be it further

30 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Committee on Health Care, in  
31 considering the system pursuant to this resolution, shall make  
32 recommendations for the implementation of such a system to the  
33 76th Session of the Nevada Legislature; and be it further

34 RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Legislative Committee on  
35 Health Care is encouraged to appoint a subcommittee consisting of  
36 three members of the Committee to consider the issues relating to  
37 the system for the payment of medical services and care pursuant to  
38 this resolution; and be it further

39 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and  
40 transmit a copy of this resolution to the Legislative Commission.
