Chair Kirkpatrick:

[Roll taken] Mr. Claborn will be testifying from Las Vegas all of next week. He has a family emergency. Ms. Scholley and I have been tracking everyone's bills. Please, I only know the bills that you say are important to you, so I am trying to make sure that everyone's bills get out of the Senate. If there is something that has not moved or something that is stuck, be sure to let me know.

I am going to give you updates on a couple of bills because, especially for the freshmen, there are a whole bunch of amendments coming on the Senate side. People are trying to amend on to the bills. <u>Assembly Bill 60</u>, which was the Treasurer's bill and was a contentious vote in this Committee as well as on the floor, has been completely gutted and redone, so if you would like a copy, there will be a conference committee on the bill.

The Senate has 20 bills from Assembly Government Affairs that they are going to try to hear in two days next week. So, if one of your bills is one of those 20, I am waiting for a list and please let me know. Today, for example, there are seven bills up that came out of this Committee so we are trying to keep track of all of them.

With that we will move into work session. There are a couple of bills that I am pulling from work session just so we can make sure that it is finalized. We will get copies out to you this afternoon so that you have plenty of time to go over the bills so that the public can talk to you about them.

Our first bill in the work session is Senate Bill 23.

Senate Bill 23: Revises provisions governing certain organizational matters within the Department of Health and Human Services. (BDR 18-328)

Susan Scholley, Committee Policy Analyst:

Chair Kirkpatrick:

It there a motion?

ASSEMBLYMAN STEWART MOVED TO DO PASS SENATE BILL 23.

ASSEMBLYMAN BOBZIEN SECONDED THE MOTION.

THE MOTION PASSED. (ASSEMBLYMEN ATKINSON, CLABORN, AND SPIEGEL WERE ABSENT FOR THE VOTE.)

Chair Kirkpatrick:

As far as floor statements, everyone realizes that the floor rules were suspended, so as soon as the bill is reported out to Committee the bill can go straight to General File. More than likely the bills will be on General File today. Since the floor rules have been suspended there is no second reading for the rest of the session. Who would like to do the floor statement? Mrs. Mastroluca will do S.B. 23.

We will now move on to Senate Bill 53 (1st Reprint).

Senate Bill 53 (1st Reprint): Makes various changes relating to the Office of the Secretary of State. (BDR 18-415)

Susan Scholley, Committee Policy Analyst:

Chair Kirkpatrick:

I think that there are still some questions on this bill, but I will take any discussion.

Assemblyman Settelmeyer:

My overall opinion is that the private sector already has online data storage in numerous formats, either to back up your entire hard drive computer or to allow you to rent individually. There are at least 15 or 20 sites that I have done research on that cost about \$5 a month. I really feel that the government

should not be in competition with the private sector, so I will be voting no on this bill.

Assemblywoman Mastroluca:

One thing to Mr. Settelmeyer, I will say that my parents are using the Living Will Lockbox, the one that is already in existence through the Secretary of State. That is great for me because then I have access to their "do not resuscitate orders," which I would not have had unless my parents had given me a physical copy and I stored it somewhere. So, for that reason I believe that this bill is a really good use of state time and resources.

My question was, I noticed in section 14, subsections 2 and 3, that any money that is collected, including interest, stays with the Secretary of State's Office. I am wondering if there was ever consideration to put a limit on how much they could keep, and if they exceeded that limit then roll it over to the state.

Chair Kirkpatrick:

We are just going to take discussion on this bill. Ms. Lamboley of the Secretary of State's Office can get with the Committee members after the meeting and try to answer questions.

Assemblyman Stewart:

Have we had any difficulties with changes not made in wills and other items in the lockbox that later resulted in legal problems?

Chair Kirkpatrick:

I do not believe that there were any. I will have Ms. Lamboley get all the answers for us at the end of today. I will then send out an email addressing everyone's concerns.

Assemblyman Bobzien:

Ms. Lamboley may correct this later with individual members, but I remember from testimony that that issue did come up, and it was reported that there had been no issues or problems. As someone who does use private services for data storage extensively, I look forward to having this sort of service for special documents that I frankly do not trust with the private sector. I think it is much better to have the seal of approval from the Secretary of State's Office in the State of Nevada for select documents. I think that this is a wonderful example of the Secretary trying to move forward in terms of what the government can provide to the citizens of Nevada. This is a wonderful idea that I look forward to supporting.

Assemblywoman Pierce:

I think that Mr. Stewart's concerns are addressed in section 12, subsection 6. On what Mr. Bobzien was saying, this may not always be true, but at this moment in history the private sector's polling numbers are really, really low, and the government's polling numbers are really, really high. There are things that we have traditionally trusted government to do, and I think that dealing with wills is one of them. I think that is a reflection of the fact that this is a part of life that has always been a purview of government.

Chair Kirkpatrick:

Ms. Lamboley has heard all the questions, so if after this meeting you could answer them, it would be most helpful, and we will try to bring the bill back next week.

We now move on to Senate Bill 59 (1st Reprint).

<u>Senate Bill 59 (1st Reprint):</u> Revises provisions governing telephone systems used for reporting emergencies in certain counties. (BDR 20-471)

<u>Senate Bill 76 (1st Reprint):</u> Revises provisions governing the administrative procedures for the summary suspension of licenses issued by certain state agencies. (BDR 18-263)
