<u>A.B. 59</u> (R1)	Creates a rebuttable presumption against an award of custody or unsupervised visitation for any person who has abducted a child in the past. (BDR 11-265)
<u>A.B. 105</u> (R1)	Makes various changes concerning genetic marker testing of certain criminal defendants. (BDR 14-51)
A.B. 262 (R1)	Makes various changes concerning the issuance of marriage licenses. (BDR 11-961)
<u>A.B. 432</u> (R1)	Revises provisions governing alcoholic beverage awareness programs. (BDR 32-526)
A.B. 477	Exempts a person who works for a landlord of a dwelling unit used for a residence for older persons from an additional background check. (BDR 10-100)
