The first page of all handouts must include the bill number, name and contact information of the provider. Additionally, please provide 20 hard copies the day of the hearing.

All amendments must be submitted in writing, at least 24 hours in advance, and must include: (1) the bill number, name and contact information of the sponsor of the amendment; (2) a concise explanation of the intent of the amendment; and (3) suggested language.

Cellular telephones must be turned off while in the committee room.

During the meeting, the Committee can introduce bills and resolutions as well as discuss or take action on measures previously considered by the Committee.

The Committee's ability to videoconference and accommodate Power Point presentations is limited. Requests must be made at least 72 hours in advance and will be considered subject to availability.

During testimony and public comment, the Chair may limit the length of testimony.

Speakers must clearly state and spell their names and indicate their affiliation prior to offering testimony.
