[S.B. 5](#) Revises provisions governing the selection and summoning of grand jurors in certain counties. (BDR 1-319)

[S.B. 6](#) Authorizes the electronic reproduction of the seal of a court. (BDR 1-324)

[S.B. 24](#) Revises provisions concerning writs of execution in justice courts. (BDR 6-321)

All amendments must be submitted in writing, at least 24 hours in advance, and must include: (1) the name and contact information of the sponsor of the amendment; (2) a concise explanation of the intent of the amendment; and (3) suggested language.

Cellular telephones must be turned off while in the committee room.

During the meeting, the Committee can introduce bills and resolutions as well as discuss or take action on measures previously considered by the Committee.

The Committee's ability to videoconference and accommodate Power Point presentations is limited. Requests must be made at least 72 hours in advance and will be considered subject to availability. During public comment, the Chair may limit testimony.

Speakers must clearly spell their name and state their affiliation at the commencement of testimony.
