

ASSEMBLY BILL No. 141—ASSEMBLYMEN GOICOECHEA;
ELLISON AND HANSEN

FEBRUARY 11, 2011

Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

SUMMARY—Revises the frequency with which certain volunteer firefighters must submit to physical examinations to receive workers' compensation coverage for certain occupational diseases. (BDR 53-567)

AN ACT relating to occupational diseases; expanding the frequency with which certain volunteer firefighters must submit to physical examinations to receive workers' compensation coverage for certain occupational diseases; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, an employee who contracts an occupational disease arising out of and in the course of his or her employment is generally entitled to receive benefits for workers' compensation. (Chapter 617 of NRS) Specifically, if an employee has been employed for 2 years or more as a full-time salaried firefighter, arson investigator or police officer or has acted for 2 years or more as a volunteer firefighter who is entitled to benefits for workers' compensation, any disease of the lungs caused by exposure to heat, smoke, fumes, tear gas or any other noxious gases arising out of and in the course of employment is an occupational disease for which the employee is entitled to receive workers' compensation. To receive coverage for such an occupational disease, the employee must submit to a physical examination upon initial employment, upon commencement of the coverage, once every even-numbered year until the employee is 40 years of age or older and on an annual basis thereafter during his or her employment. (NRS 617.455) **Section 1** of this bill requires a volunteer firefighter who is 40 years of age or older to submit to the physical examination once every 2 years instead of on an annual basis.

Existing law provides similar coverage for a volunteer firefighter who contracts a disease of the heart and who, for 5 years or more, has served continuously as a volunteer firefighter in Nevada. To receive coverage for such an occupational disease, the volunteer firefighter is required to submit to a physical examination upon initial employment, once every 3 years after the initial examination until he or

21 she reaches the age of 50 years and once each year if he or she is 50 years of age or
22 older. (NRS 617.457) **Section 2** of this bill requires a volunteer firefighter who is
23 50 years of age or older to submit to the physical examination once every 2 years
24 instead of once each year.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 617.455 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 617.455 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of this
3 chapter, diseases of the lungs, resulting in either temporary or
4 permanent disability or death, are occupational diseases and
5 compensable as such under the provisions of this chapter if caused
6 by exposure to heat, smoke, fumes, tear gas or any other noxious
7 gases, arising out of and in the course of the employment of a
8 person who, for 2 years or more, has been:

9 (a) Employed in this State in a full-time salaried occupation of
10 fire fighting or the investigation of arson for the benefit or safety of
11 the public;

12 (b) Acting as a volunteer firefighter in this State and is entitled
13 to the benefits of chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive, of NRS
14 pursuant to the provisions of NRS 616A.145; or

15 (c) Employed in a full-time salaried occupation as a police
16 officer in this State.

17 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, each
18 employee who is to be covered for diseases of the lungs pursuant to
19 the provisions of this section shall submit to a physical examination,
20 including a thorough test of the functioning of his or her lungs and
21 the making of an X-ray film of the employee's lungs, upon
22 employment, upon commencement of the coverage, once every
23 even-numbered year until the employee is 40 years of age or older
24 and thereafter on an annual basis during his or her employment.

25 3. A thorough test of the functioning of the lungs is not
26 required for a volunteer firefighter. *A volunteer firefighter who is
27 40 years of age or older shall submit to the physical examination
28 required pursuant to subsection 2 once every 2 years during his or
29 her employment.*

30 4. All physical examinations required pursuant to subsection 2
31 must be paid for by the employer.

32 5. A disease of the lungs is conclusively presumed to have
33 arisen out of and in the course of the employment of a person who
34 has been employed in a full-time continuous, uninterrupted and
35 salaried occupation as a police officer, firefighter or arson
36 investigator for 5 years or more before the date of disablement.

1 6. Failure to correct predisposing conditions which lead to lung
2 disease when so ordered in writing by the examining physician after
3 the annual *or biennial* examination excludes the employee from the
4 benefits of this section if the correction is within the ability of the
5 employee.

6 7. A person who is determined to be:

7 (a) Partially disabled from an occupational disease pursuant to
8 the provisions of this section; and

9 (b) Incapable of performing, with or without remuneration, work
10 as a firefighter, police officer or arson investigator,
11 ➔ may elect to receive the benefits provided under NRS 616C.440
12 for a permanent total disability.

13 **Sec. 2.** NRS 617.457 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 617.457 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of this
15 chapter, diseases of the heart of a person who, for 5 years or more,
16 has been employed in a full-time continuous, uninterrupted and
17 salaried occupation as a firefighter, arson investigator or police
18 officer in this State before the date of disablement are conclusively
19 presumed to have arisen out of and in the course of the employment.

20 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, diseases
21 of the heart, resulting in either temporary or permanent disability or
22 death, are occupational diseases and compensable as such under the
23 provisions of this chapter if caused by extreme overexertion in times
24 of stress or danger and a causal relationship can be shown by
25 competent evidence that the disability or death arose out of and was
26 caused by the performance of duties as a volunteer firefighter by a
27 person entitled to the benefits of chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive,
28 of NRS pursuant to the provisions of NRS 616A.145 and who, for 5
29 years or more, has served continuously as a volunteer firefighter in
30 this State by continuously maintaining an active status on the roster
31 of a volunteer fire department.

32 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, each
33 employee who is to be covered for diseases of the heart pursuant to
34 the provisions of this section shall submit to a physical examination,
35 including an examination of the heart, upon employment, upon
36 commencement of coverage and thereafter on an annual basis during
37 his or her employment.

38 4. A physical examination for a volunteer firefighter is required
39 upon initial employment and once every 3 years after the initial
40 examination until the firefighter reaches the age of 50 years. Each
41 volunteer firefighter who is 50 years of age or older shall submit to a
42 physical examination once ~~each year.~~ *every 2 years during his or*
43 *her employment.*

44 5. The employer of the volunteer firefighter is responsible for
45 scheduling the physical examination.

1 6. Failure to submit to a physical examination that is scheduled
2 by his or her employer pursuant to subsection 5 excludes the
3 volunteer firefighter from the benefits of this section.

4 7. The chief of a volunteer fire department may require an
5 applicant to pay for any physical examination required pursuant to
6 this section if the applicant:

7 (a) Applies to the department for the first time as a volunteer
8 firefighter; and

9 (b) Is 50 years of age or older on the date of his or her
10 application.

11 8. The volunteer fire department shall reimburse an applicant
12 for the cost of a physical examination required pursuant to this
13 section if the applicant:

14 (a) Paid for the physical examination in accordance with
15 subsection 7;

16 (b) Is declared physically fit to perform the duties required of a
17 firefighter; and

18 (c) Becomes a volunteer with the volunteer fire department.

19 9. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 7, all physical
20 examinations required pursuant to subsections 3 and 4 must be paid
21 for by the employer.

22 10. Failure to correct predisposing conditions which lead to
23 heart disease when so ordered in writing by the examining physician
24 subsequent to the annual *or biennial* examination excludes the
25 employee from the benefits of this section if the correction is within
26 the ability of the employee.

27 11. A person who is determined to be:

28 (a) Partially disabled from an occupational disease pursuant to
29 the provisions of this section; and

30 (b) Incapable of performing, with or without remuneration, work
31 as a firefighter, arson investigator or police officer,
32 ➔ may elect to receive the benefits provided under NRS 616C.440
33 for a permanent total disability.

34 12. Claims filed under this section may be reopened at any
35 time during the life of the claimant for further examination and
36 treatment of the claimant upon certification by a physician of a
37 change of circumstances related to the occupational disease which
38 would warrant an increase or rearrangement of compensation.

39 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.
