SUMMARY—Provides for additional compensation to be paid to certain senior psychiatrists and senior physicians employed by the Department of Corrections for being available to be called in to work during periods in which they are not regularly scheduled to work. (BDR 23-451)

AN ACT relating to public employees; providing for additional compensation to be paid to certain senior psychiatrists and senior physicians employed by the Department of Corrections for being available to be called in to work during periods in which they are not regularly scheduled to work; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 281 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

A senior psychiatrist or senior physician in the unclassified service of the State who is employed by the Department of Corrections is entitled to be paid an amount, in addition to his or her salary, for being available to be called in to work during any period in which he or she is not regularly scheduled to work, whether or not the person is required to return to work during that period.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
