AN ACT relating to days of observance; requiring the Governor annually to proclaim June 19 to be “Juneteenth Day”; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law sets forth certain days of observance in this State to commemorate
2 certain persons or occasions or to publicize information regarding certain important
3 topics. (NRS 236.018-236.085) This bill requires the Governor annually to
4 proclaim June 19 to be “Juneteenth Day” in the State of Nevada.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 236 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. The Governor shall annually proclaim June 19 to be
4 “Juneteenth Day” in the State of Nevada to commemorate the
5 abolition of slavery in the United States.*

6 *2. The proclamation must call upon the news media,
7 educators and appropriate governmental officers to bring to the
8 attention of Nevada’s residents the historical significance of the
9 day when the last slaves in the United States were emancipated
10 and the significant contributions of African-Americans to the
11 State.*
