SUMMARY—Provides certain restrictions on demonstrations near
a funeral, memorial service or ceremony.
(BDR 15-230)

AN ACT relating to crimes against the public peace; providing
certain restrictions on demonstrations near a funeral,
memorial service or ceremony; providing a penalty; and
providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill prohibits a person from engaging in a demonstration: (1) during the
2 period of time beginning 60 minutes before and ending 60 minutes after a funeral,
3 memorial service or ceremony is held; and (2) within 300 feet of the location where
4 a funeral, memorial service or ceremony is held. A person who engages in such a
5 demonstration is guilty of a misdemeanor.

6 The description of the term “demonstration” in this bill is patterned after the
7 description of the term contained in federal law. (38 U.S.C. § 2413(b))

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 203 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. A person shall not, during the period beginning 60 minutes before and ending 60 minutes after a funeral, memorial service or ceremony is held, engage in a demonstration that takes place within 300 feet of the location where the funeral, memorial service or ceremony is held.

2. A person who violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

3. As used in this section, "demonstration" includes, without limitation:

(a) Any picketing or other similar conduct;

(b) Any oration, speech, use of any equipment or device for sound amplification or other similar conduct that is not part of a funeral, memorial service or ceremony;

(c) The display of any placard, banner, flag or other similar device unless the display is part of a funeral, memorial service or ceremony; and

(d) The distribution of any handbill, pamphlet, leaflet or other written or printed material other than a program distributed as part of a funeral, memorial service or ceremony.
