AN ACT relating to governmental administration; pledging the support of the Legislature to ensure that English is preserved as the common language of this State; designating English as the official language of the State of Nevada; requiring that certain proceedings and records of this State be in English; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 In this bill the Nevada Legislature: (1) pledges to refrain from enacting certain
2 laws and to take all steps necessary to ensure that English remains the common
3 language of the State; (2) encourages other state officials to take similar actions; (3)
4 recognizes the importance of English in unifying the United States; (4) supports
5 English educational programs; and (5) encourages Nevada residents to master
6 English and take advantage of all educational opportunities.

7 This bill also designates English as the official language of the State of Nevada
8 and requires, with limited exceptions, that all official proceedings of the State be
9 conducted in English and that all official records of the State be prepared, stored
10 and made available in English.

1 WHEREAS, English is the common language of the people of the
2 United States of America and the State of Nevada and should be
3 preserved, protected and strengthened; and

4 WHEREAS, English is the most widely used language in the
5 industries of finance, trade, technology, diplomacy and
6 entertainment, and is the living library of the last 100 years of
7 scientific and technological advances; and

8 WHEREAS, There are more persons in the world who speak
9 English as a second language than there are native speakers of
10 English, and the numerous schools that teach English around the
11 world demonstrate that English is soon to become the prevalent
12 language used throughout the world; and

13 WHEREAS, It is universally accepted that a common language
14 promotes unity and fosters better communication; and

15 WHEREAS, Knowledge of the different languages existing in
16 today's world enhances competitiveness and growth in world trade
17 and promotes economic expansion; and

18 WHEREAS, A skilled labor force is crucial to the competitiveness
19 of the State of Nevada in today's national and global economy, and
20 a knowledge of both English and foreign languages enhances
21 communication and diplomatic efforts by fostering greater
22 communication and understanding between nations and promotes a
23 greater understanding between different ethnic and racial groups
24 within the United States; now, therefore,

26 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
27 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

29 **Section 1.** Chapter 235 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
30 thereto a new section to read as follows:

31 ***I. The Legislature hereby:***

32 ***(a) Pledges that it:***

33 ***(1) Will not enact any law which diminishes or ignores the***
34 ***role of English as the common language of this State; and***

35 ***(2) Will take all steps necessary to ensure that English is***
36 ***preserved and enhanced as the common language of this State.***

37 ***(b) Encourages other state officials to take appropriate steps to***
38 ***ensure that English is preserved and enhanced as the common***
39 ***language of this State.***

40 ***(c) Recognizes:***

41 ***(1) The importance of English as the unifying language of***
42 ***the United States and the importance of speaking English fluently***
43 ***to succeed in American society;***

1 (2) That a command of English is critical to the success
2 and productivity of the children of this State and should be
3 encouraged at all ages; and

4 (3) That a skilled labor force is crucial to this State's
5 competitiveness in the global economy and the ability to speak one
6 or more languages in addition to English is a significant skill.

7 (d) Supports educational programs designed to teach English
8 as well as other languages.

9 (e) Encourages the residents of this State:

10 (1) To master English as well as other languages; and

11 (2) To take advantage of all educational opportunities to
12 realize their full potential in the mastery of English as well as
13 other languages.

14 2. English is hereby designated as the official language of the
15 State of Nevada.

16 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4:

17 (a) All official proceedings of this State must be conducted in
18 the English language.

19 (b) All official records of this State must be prepared, stored
20 and made available in the English language.

21 4. The provisions of subsection 3 do not apply to:

22 (a) State employees when conducting official state business
23 orally.

24 (b) Classes that teach students a language other than English.

25 (c) Classes that teach students whose proficiency in the
26 English language is limited.

27 (d) Situations in which the exclusive use of the English
28 language would interfere with the functions and requirements of
29 the judicial system of this State.

30 (e) Situations in which the exclusive use of the English
31 language would interfere with public health or safety, or the
32 provision of emergency services.

33 (f) The promotion of international trade or tourism by an
34 officer, employee or agent of this State.

35 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other specific
36 statute:

37 (a) To the extent not inconsistent with federal law, this State
38 and its political subdivisions do not have any duty to provide
39 copies of statutes, regulations, reports, forms or other documents
40 in a language other than English.

41 (b) Neither this State nor an officer, employee or agent of this
42 State is civilly or criminally liable for an act or omission
43 committed to carry out the provisions of subsection 3.
