SUMMARY—Encourages the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to implement measures to ensure the educational needs of students and prospective students will be met. (BDR 34-725)

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AN ACT relating to the Nevada System of Higher Education; encouraging the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to examine, audit and revise certain aspects of the System to ensure the educational needs of students and prospective students will be met in an economical and efficient manner; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law encourages the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to  
2 review periodically their mission for higher education to determine whether there is  
3 unnecessary duplication of programs or courses at institutions within the Nevada  
4 System of Higher Education which might be more appropriate for a different  
5 institution. (NRS 396.504) This bill encourages the Board to: (1) examine and  
6 audit the function, strengths and most efficient use of the facilities, resources  
7 and staff of each institution within the System; (2) examine and audit the  
8 educational opportunities, programs and services offered by those institutions; and

9 (3) implement measures pursuant to which the educational needs of students and  
10 prospective students will be met in the most economical and efficient manner  
11 possible, including revising the courses of study offered at the various institutions  
12 so that programs of remedial education, continuing education and entry-level higher  
13 education are conducted at community colleges within the System; programs of  
14 baccalaureate-level higher education for teachers and nurses and other related  
15 medical fields are conducted at state colleges within the System; and programs of  
16 baccalaureate-level higher education in other disciplines and graduate-level higher  
17 education and research are conducted at universities within the System and the  
18 Desert Research Institute.

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1 WHEREAS, The Board of Regents of the University of Nevada  
2 governs the Nevada System of Higher Education; and

3 WHEREAS, The Nevada System of Higher Education  
4 encompasses several different types of institutions of higher  
5 education, including, without limitation, universities, colleges and  
6 community colleges; and

7 WHEREAS, Each type of institution of higher education within  
8 the Nevada System of Higher Education is uniquely situated to  
9 provide different educational opportunities for its students,  
10 including, without limitation, remedial education, continuing  
11 education, entry-level higher education, baccalaureate-level higher  
12 education, and graduate-level higher education and research; and

13 WHEREAS, Over time, the number of institutions of higher  
14 education within the Nevada System of Higher Education expands  
15 and the focus of each such institution is defined and further  
16 redefined; and

17 WHEREAS, To the extent that the educational programs of the  
18 institutions of higher education within the Nevada System of Higher  
19 Education can be tailored specifically to meet the needs of different  
20 categories of students, both the System and its students may be  
21 better served and able to realize significant cost savings; and

22 WHEREAS, To the extent that the educational programs of the  
23 institutions of higher education within the Nevada System of Higher  
24 Education are not tailored specifically to meet the needs of different  
25 categories of students, inefficiencies and redundancies may result;  
26 and

27 WHEREAS, In the present economic climate, it is more important  
28 than ever before to ensure that the institutions of higher education  
29 within the Nevada System of Higher Education are meeting the  
30 needs of their respective students and prospective students in the  
31 most affordable, cost-effective and efficient manner possible; now,

1 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
2 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:  
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4       **Section 1.** NRS 396.504 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
5       396.504   **1.** The Legislature hereby encourages the Board of  
6 Regents to ~~review~~:

7           (a) *Examine and audit the function, strengths and most  
8 efficient use of the facilities, resources and staff of each institution  
9 to address the needs of the students of the System.*

10          (b) *Review periodically their mission for higher education, as  
11 the number of institutions within the System expands and the focus  
12 of each institution is defined and further redefined, to determine  
13 whether there is unnecessary duplication of programs or courses  
14 within the System which might be more appropriate for a different  
15 institution.*

16          (c) *Examine and audit the educational opportunities,  
17 programs and services offered by the institutions within the  
18 System to ensure that those opportunities, programs and services  
19 are tailored appropriately to:*

20              (1) *The different categories of students and prospective  
21 students having varied aptitudes, aspirations and educational  
22 needs;*

23              (2) *The jobs and industries likely to be employing the  
24 students; and*

25              (3) *The state economic development plan.*

26          (d) *Insofar as is practicable to achieve the goals set forth in  
27 paragraphs (a), (b) and (c), implement measures pursuant to  
28 which the educational needs of students and prospective students  
29 will be met by providing:*

30              (1) *Programs of remedial education, continuing education  
31 and entry-level higher education at community colleges.*

32              (2) *Programs of baccalaureate-level higher education for  
33 teachers and nurses and related medical fields at state colleges.*

34              (3) *Programs of baccalaureate-level higher education in  
35 other disciplines and graduate-level higher education and  
36 research at universities and the Desert Research Institute.*

37          (e) *On or before September 1 of each year, provide a report of  
38 its findings and any adjustments made and actions taken as a  
39 result of those findings to the Director of the Legislative Counsel  
40 Bureau for transmission to the Interim Finance Committee and  
41 the next regular session of the Nevada Legislature.*

42        **2.** The System is encouraged to review the core curriculum at  
43 each institution to determine whether there is parity among the  
44 institutions of the System.



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1       **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.

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
