SUMMARY—Establishes the Advisory Committee on Medicaid Fraud. (BDR S-693)

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AN ACT relating to Medicaid; establishing the Advisory Committee on Medicaid Fraud to conduct a study of Medicaid fraud in this State and make certain recommendations to the Legislature; requiring the Administrator of the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services, the Administrator of the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department and the Attorney General to each appoint three members to the Advisory Committee; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 1** of this bill establishes the Advisory Committee on Medicaid Fraud to  
2      conduct a study of Medicaid fraud in this State and to make certain  
3      recommendations to the Legislature for reducing the incidence of Medicaid fraud in  
4      this State. **Section 1** requires the Administrator of the Division of Welfare and  
5      Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services,  
6      the Administrator of the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the  
7      Department and the Attorney General to each appoint three members to the



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8 Advisory Committee. **Section 1** further requires the Advisory Committee: (1) on or  
9 before December 31, 2011, to submit to the Interim Finance Committee a  
10 preliminary report on the results of the study; and (2) on or before June 30, 2012, to  
11 submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 77th  
12 Session of the Nevada Legislature a final report on the results of the study.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby created the Advisory  
2 Committee on Medicaid Fraud to conduct a study of Medicaid fraud  
3 in this State and make recommendations to the Legislature for  
4 reducing the incidence of Medicaid fraud in this State.

5     2. The Administrator of the Division of Welfare and  
6 Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human  
7 Services, the Administrator of the Division of Health Care  
8 Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human  
9 Services and the Attorney General shall each appoint three members  
10 to the Advisory Committee.

11     3. Members of the Advisory Committee serve without  
12 compensation, except that each member is entitled, while engaged in  
13 the business of the Advisory Committee, to the per diem allowance  
14 and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees  
15 generally.

16     4. Any member of the Advisory Committee who is a public  
17 employee must be granted administrative leave from his or her  
18 duties to engage in the business of the Advisory Committee without  
19 loss of his or her regular compensation. Such leave does not reduce  
20 the amount of any other accrued leave of the member.

21     5. A majority of the members of the Advisory Committee  
22 constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and a majority  
23 of a quorum present at any meeting is sufficient for any official  
24 action taken by the Advisory Committee.

25     6. The Advisory Committee shall, at its first meeting, elect a  
26 Chair from among its members.

27     7. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the Chair  
28 or a majority of its members.

29     8. The study conducted by the Advisory Committee pursuant to  
30 subsection 1 must include, without limitation:

31         (a) A review of the laws, regulations and policies of this State  
32 with respect to Medicaid fraud and the implementation and  
33 effectiveness of those laws, regulations and policies;

34         (b) A review of the imposition and effectiveness of penalties for  
35 committing Medicaid fraud;



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1       (c) A review of existing information, policies or studies, or the  
2 laws of other states or territories of the United States, which may  
3 assist the Advisory Committee in developing a strategy to reduce  
4 the incidence of Medicaid fraud;

5       (d) The development of strategies to increase the detection of  
6 Medicaid fraud;

7       (e) The development of strategies to recoup revenue lost as the  
8 result of Medicaid fraud;

9       (f) The development of strategies to increase public awareness  
10 of Medicaid fraud and the penalties for committing Medicaid fraud;

11       (g) The development of strategies to encourage the reporting of  
12 Medicaid fraud;

13       (h) The development of recommendations for legislation  
14 concerning appropriate statutory provisions, amendments and  
15 penalties to reduce the incidence of Medicaid fraud; and

16       (i) The development of criteria to measure the performance or  
17 success of any strategy developed by or any recommendation of the  
18 Advisory Committee.

19       9. The Advisory Committee shall:

20       (a) On or before December 31, 2011, submit to the Interim  
21 Finance Committee a preliminary report on the results of the study;  
22 and

23       (b) On or before June 30, 2012, submit to the Director of the  
24 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 77th Session of the  
25 Nevada Legislature a final report on the results of the study which  
26 includes, without limitation:

27           (1) Any recommendations by the Advisory Committee for  
28 legislation;

29           (2) A summary of the collaboration and deliberation of the  
30 Advisory Committee; and

31           (3) A summary of the criteria developed to measure the  
32 performance or success of any strategy developed by or any  
33 recommendation of the Advisory Committee.

34       **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval  
35 and expires by limitation on July 1, 2012.

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
