

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 366—ASSEMBLYMAN MUNFORD

MARCH 21, 2011

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing eligibility for a Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship. (BDR 34-1040)

AN ACT relating to education; revising provisions governing eligibility for a Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the Department of Education to prescribe a code of honor
2 relating to cheating for pupils enrolled in public schools. (NRS 392.461) Existing
3 law also creates the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program and
4 prescribes the criteria of eligibility for a Millennium Scholarship. (NRS 396.911-
5 396.938) This bill provides that if a pupil violates the code of honor relating to
6 cheating on three or more occasions while he or she is enrolled in a public high
7 school, the pupil is not eligible for a Millennium Scholarship.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 396.930 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 396.930 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2
3 ~~1 and 3, 1, 3 and 4~~, a student may apply to the Board of Regents for a
4 Millennium Scholarship if the student:
5 (a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (e) of subsection
6 2, has been a resident of this State for at least 2 years before the
7 student applies for the Millennium Scholarship;
8 (b) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c), graduated
9 from a public or private high school in this State;
10 (1) After May 1, 2000, but not later than May 1, 2003; or



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1 (2) After May 1, 2003, and, except as otherwise provided in
2 paragraphs (c), (d) and (f) of subsection 2, not more than 6 years
3 before the student applies for the Millennium Scholarship;

4 (c) Does not satisfy the requirements of paragraph (b) and:

5 (1) Was enrolled as a pupil in a public or private high school
6 in this State with a class of pupils who were regularly scheduled to
7 graduate after May 1, 2000;

8 (2) Received his or her high school diploma within 4 years
9 after he or she was regularly scheduled to graduate; and

10 (3) Applies for the Millennium Scholarship not more than 6
11 years after he or she was regularly scheduled to graduate from high
12 school;

13 (d) Maintained in high school in the courses designated by the
14 Board of Regents pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 2, at least:

15 (1) A 3.00 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if the
16 student was a member of the graduating class of 2003 or 2004;

17 (2) A 3.10 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if the
18 student was a member of the graduating class of 2005 or 2006; or

19 (3) A 3.25 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if the
20 student was a member of the graduating class of 2007 or a later
21 graduating class; and

22 (e) Is enrolled in at least:

23 (1) Six semester credit hours in a community college within
24 the System;

25 (2) Twelve semester credit hours in another eligible
26 institution; or

27 (3) A total of 12 or more semester credit hours in eligible
28 institutions if the student is enrolled in more than one eligible
29 institution.

30 2. The Board of Regents:

31 (a) Shall define the core curriculum that a student must complete
32 in high school to be eligible for a Millennium Scholarship.

33 (b) Shall designate the courses in which a student must earn the
34 minimum grade point averages set forth in paragraph (d) of
35 subsection 1.

36 (c) May establish criteria with respect to students who have been
37 on active duty serving in the Armed Forces of the United States to
38 exempt such students from the 6-year limitation on applications that
39 is set forth in subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1.

40 (d) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who have a
41 documented physical or mental disability or who were previously
42 subject to an individualized education program under the
43 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400 et
44 seq., or a plan under Title V of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973,



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1 29 U.S.C. §§ 791 et seq. The criteria must provide an exemption for
2 those students from:

3 (1) The 6-year limitation on applications that is set forth in
4 subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1 and subparagraph
5 (3) of paragraph (c) of subsection 1 and any limitation applicable to
6 students who are eligible pursuant to subparagraph (1) of paragraph
7 (b) of subsection 1.

8 (2) The minimum number of credits prescribed in paragraph
9 (e) of subsection 1.

10 (e) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who have a
11 parent or legal guardian on active duty in the Armed Forces of the
12 United States to exempt such students from the residency
13 requirement set forth in paragraph (a) of subsection 1 or
14 subsection 3.

15 (f) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who have
16 been actively serving or participating in a charitable, religious or
17 public service assignment or mission to exempt such students from
18 the 6-year limitation on applications that is set forth in subparagraph
19 (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1. Such criteria must provide for
20 the award of Millennium Scholarships to those students who qualify
21 for the exemption and who otherwise meet the eligibility criteria to
22 the extent that money is available to award Millennium Scholarships
23 to the students after all other obligations for the award of
24 Millennium Scholarships for the current school year have been
25 satisfied.

26 3. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c) of subsection
27 1, for students who did not graduate from a public or private high
28 school in this State and who, except as otherwise provided in
29 paragraph (e) of subsection 2, have been residents of this State for at
30 least 2 years, the Board of Regents shall establish:

31 (a) The minimum score on a standardized test that such students
32 must receive; or

33 (b) Other criteria that students must meet,
34 to be eligible for Millennium Scholarships.

35 4. *A student is not eligible for a Millennium Scholarship if he
36 or she violated the code of honor relating to cheating prescribed
37 pursuant to NRS 392.461 on three or more occasions while he or
38 she was enrolled in a public high school in this State.*

39 5. In awarding Millennium Scholarships, the Board of Regents
40 shall enhance its outreach to students who:

41 (a) Are pursuing a career in education or health care;

42 (b) Come from families who lack sufficient financial resources
43 to pay for the costs of sending their children to an eligible
44 institution; or



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1 (c) Substantially participated in an antismoking, antidrug or
2 antialcohol program during high school.

3 **[S.] 6.** The Board of Regents shall establish a procedure by
4 which an applicant for a Millennium Scholarship is required to
5 execute an affidavit declaring the applicant's eligibility for a
6 Millennium Scholarship pursuant to the requirements of this section.
7 The affidavit must include a declaration that the applicant is a
8 citizen of the United States or has lawful immigration status, or that
9 the applicant has filed an application to legalize the applicant's
10 immigration status or will file an application to legalize his or her
11 immigration status as soon as he or she is eligible to do so.

12 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.

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
