#### ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 378-ASSEMBLYMAN ATKINSON

### MARCH 21, 2011

## Referred to Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Mining

SUMMARY—Authorizes a charitable organization to possess and transport the carcass of a game mammal for inspection and processing under certain circumstances. (BDR 45-52)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to wildlife; requiring the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to adopt certain regulations concerning the possession and transportation of a carcass of a game mammal by a charitable organization; authorizing a game warden, sheriff or other peace officer to issue a written authorization to a representative of a charitable organization to allow the representative to possess and transport the carcass of a game mammal under certain circumstances; authorizing certain persons to possess the carcass of a game mammal without a tag attached to the carcass; requiring a person who takes possession of a carcass of a game mammal to transport the carcass to an official establishment for processing under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, a person may not possess the carcass of certain game mammals unless a tag issued by the Department of Wildlife is attached to the carcass. (NRS 502.150) This bill provides an exception to this prohibition. **Section 2** of this bill authorizes a game warden, sheriff or other peace officer investigating a scene at which a game mammal has been killed to notify a charitable organization of the availability of the carcass of the game mammal and to allow a representative of the charitable organization to take possession of the carcass. **Section 2** also authorizes the officer to provide to the representative written authorization for the





representative to possess and transport the carcass. Section 5 of this bill requires 10 the representative to take the carcass to be processed at a business that processes 11 meat for human consumption. Section 3 of this bill authorizes a representative of a 12 charitable organization or an owner or employee of a business that processes meat 13 to possess the carcass of a game mammal without a tag attached to the carcass. 14 Section 1 of this bill requires the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to adopt 15 regulations concerning the possession and transportation of a carcass of a game mammal by a charitable organization, including, without limitation, regulations 17 specifying the form for the written authorization for possession of a carcass without 18 a tag.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** NRS 501.181 is hereby amended to read as follows: 501.181 The Commission shall:

1. Establish broad policies for:

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- (a) The protection, propagation, restoration, transplanting, introduction and management of wildlife in this State.
- (b) The promotion of the safety of persons using or property used in the operation of vessels on the waters of this State.
- (c) The promotion of uniformity of laws relating to policy matters.
- 2. Guide the Department in its administration and enforcement of the provisions of this title and of chapter 488 of NRS by the establishment of such policies.
  - 3. Establish policies for areas of interest including:
- (a) The management of big and small game mammals, upland and migratory game birds, fur-bearing mammals, game fish, and protected and unprotected mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and amphibians.
  - (b) The control of wildlife depredations.
- (c) The acquisition of lands, water rights and easements and other property for the management, propagation, protection and restoration of wildlife.
- (d) The entry, access to, and occupancy and use of such property, including leases of grazing rights, sales of agricultural products and requests by the Director to the State Land Registrar for the sale of timber if the sale does not interfere with the use of the property on which the timber is located for wildlife management or for hunting or fishing thereon.
  - (e) The control of nonresident hunters.
  - (f) The introduction, transplanting or exporting of wildlife.
- (g) Cooperation with federal, state and local agencies on wildlife and boating programs.





- (h) The revocation of licenses issued pursuant to this title to any person who is convicted of a violation of any provision of this title or any regulation adopted pursuant thereto.
- 4. Establish regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this title and of chapter 488 of NRS, including:
- (a) Seasons for hunting game mammals and game birds, for hunting or trapping fur-bearing mammals and for fishing, the daily and possession limits, the manner and means of taking wildlife, including, but not limited to, the sex, size or other physical differentiation for each species, and, when necessary for management purposes, the emergency closing or extending of a season, reducing or increasing of the bag or possession limits on a species, or the closing of any area to hunting, fishing or trapping. The regulations must be established after first considering the recommendations of the Department, the county advisory boards to manage wildlife and others who wish to present their views at an open meeting. Any regulations relating to the closure of a season must be based upon scientific data concerning the management of wildlife. The data upon which the regulations are based must be collected or developed by the Department.
- (b) The manner of using, attaching, filling out, punching, inspecting, validating or reporting tags.
- (c) The delineation of game management units embracing contiguous territory located in more than one county, irrespective of county boundary lines.
- (d) The number of licenses issued for big game and, if necessary, other game species.
- 5. Adopt regulations requiring the Department to make public, before official delivery, its proposed responses to any requests by federal agencies for its comment on drafts of statements concerning the environmental effect of proposed actions or regulations affecting public lands.
  - 6. Adopt regulations:
- (a) Governing the provisions of the permit required by NRS 502.390 and for the issuance, renewal and revocation of such a permit.

  (b) Establishing the method for determining the amount of an
  - (b) Establishing the method for determining the amount of an assessment, and the time and manner of payment, necessary for the collection of the assessment required by NRS 502.390.
  - 7. Adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of NRS 501.375 and section 5 of this act concerning the possession and transportation of a carcass of a game mammal by a charitable organization, including, without limitation, regulations:



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- (a) Prescribing the form for a written authorization to possess a carcass of a game mammal pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 501.375; and
- (b) Providing for making the form available upon request by a person.
- **8.** Designate those portions of wildlife management areas for big game mammals that are of special concern for the regulation of the importation, possession and propagation of alternative livestock pursuant to NRS 576.129.
  - **Sec. 2.** NRS 501.375 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 501.375 1. Every game warden, sheriff and other peace officer of this State and its political subdivisions shall enforce the provisions of this title and seize any wildlife taken or held in possession in violation of those provisions.
  - 2. Such an officer may:

- (a) With or without a warrant, conduct a reasonable search of any camp, structure, aircraft, vessel, vehicle, box, game bag or other package where the officer has reason to believe any wildlife taken or held in violation of any of the provisions of this title is to be found, and, for the purpose of such a search, may detain any aircraft, vessel or vehicle for a reasonable time.
- (b) Seize any such wildlife and any gun, ammunition, trap, snare, tackle, or other device or equipment whose presence indicates that a violation of any provision of this title has occurred. Except for property described in NRS 501.3857, property seized pursuant to this subsection may be held only for evidence and may be recovered by the owner within 1 year after it is no longer needed for that purpose. The Department shall, within 30 days after the property is no longer needed, send a written notice to the owner of the property that informs the owner of the owner's right to recover the property.
- (c) If the officer investigates the scene of a vehicle accident or the scene of a crime and at the scene is a game mammal which has been killed or is so severely injured that it must be killed, notify a charitable organization of the availability of the carcass of the game mammal and allow a representative of the charitable organization to take possession of the carcass. If, after receiving the notice, the representative wishes to take possession of the carcass, the officer may provide to the representative, on a form prescribed by the Commission and signed by the officer, written authorization for the representative to possess the carcass and transport it pursuant to section 5 of this act. As used in this paragraph, "charitable organization" means an organization which:
  - (1) Provides food to an indigent person free of charge;





- (2) The Secretary of the Treasury has determined is an exempt organization pursuant to section 501 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code; and
- (3) Holds a current certificate of organization or is currently qualified by the Secretary of State to do business in this State.
  - 3. A dwelling house may be searched only pursuant to a warrant or as otherwise provided by law.
    - **Sec. 3.** NRS 502.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - 502.150 1. [Whenever] Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, whenever tags are required for any species of wildlife, it is unlawful to have any of that species in possession without the tag attached thereto and such possession without an attached tag is prima facie evidence that the game is illegally taken and possessed.
  - 2. It is unlawful to remove any tag from any wildlife for reuse or to be in possession of excess tags or used tags.
  - 3. Whenever tags are required for any species of fur-bearing mammal, possession of a pelt of that species without the tag attached thereto is prima facie evidence that such pelt is illegally taken and possessed.
  - 4. A person may possess the carcass of a game mammal for which tags are required without the tag attached thereto if:
  - (a) The person has taken possession pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 501.375; or
  - (b) The person is an owner or employee of an official establishment and the carcass has been taken to the official establishment pursuant to the provisions of section 5 of this act.
  - 5. As used in this section, "official establishment" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 583.375.
    - **Sec. 4.** NRS 503.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - 503.040 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, it is unlawful for any person at any time to transport or offer for transportation to any place within or outside of this State any game mammal, raw furs, wild mammal taken by trapping, game bird or game fish taken within this State.
  - 2. Any person who has legally taken any game mammal, raw furs, wild mammal taken by trapping, game bird or game fish within this State may use his or her hunting license, trapping license or fishing license or tag or stamp, when required, as a permit to transport one possession limit to points within or outside the State.
  - 3. Any person who legally acquires ownership or custody of any game mammal, raw furs, wild mammal taken by trapping, game bird or game fish not taken by the person through hunting, trapping or fishing may transport such mammal, furs, bird or fish within the State without a transportation permit if such shipment does not



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exceed one possession limit and if such shipment is labeled with the name, address, number and class of license of the hunter, trapper or angler who legally took such mammal, furs, bird or fish and date taken, if the mammal, furs, bird or fish is not required by law or regulation to be tagged. Unless otherwise permitted by a regulation of the Commission, when tagged shipments are involved, a transportation permit is required as provided in this section.

4. [Any] Except as otherwise provided in subsection 9, any other person who desires to transport any game mammal, raw furs, wild mammal taken by trapping, game fish or game bird to a point within or without the State may do so only under the authority of a transportation permit as provided in this section.

- Department shall designate the The form transportation permit, and such permits may be issued for a fee of \$1 by any game warden or other such persons as may be specifically designated by the Department. The person legally in possession of the game mammals, raw furs, wild mammals taken by trapping, game birds or game fish to be transported must appear before the issuing agent to obtain a transportation permit. The permit must describe the wildlife to be transported and identify by name, address, license number and class the person who legally took the furs or wildlife and by name and address the person transporting it. Whenever raw furs or wildlife is to be transported by the postal service or by common carrier, freight or express agency, such an agency may be designated by name alone.
- 6. Game mammals, raw furs, wild mammals taken by trapping, game birds or game fish transported to another person shall be deemed to be in the legal possession of the person making shipment until actual delivery is made.
- 7. Any package or container in which game birds, raw furs, wild mammals taken by trapping, game mammals or game fish are being transported by common carrier must have the name and address of the shipper and of the consignee and an accurate statement of the number and kinds of game birds, raw furs, wild mammals taken by trapping, game mammals or game fish contained therein attached to the outside thereof.
- 8. The Commission may limit the number of shipments by any one person in any one season of any kind of game bird, game mammal or game fish.
- 9. The provisions of this section do not apply to a representative of a charitable organization who transports a game mammal pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 501.375 and section 5 of this act.





**Sec. 5.** Chapter 583 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

A representative of a charitable organization who takes possession of a carcass of a game mammal pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 501.375 shall, as soon as practicable after taking possession, transport the carcass to an official establishment to be processed.

**Sec. 6.** NRS  $5\hat{8}3.255$  is hereby amended to read as follows:

583.255 As used in NRS 583.255 to 583.555, inclusive, *and section 5 of this act*, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 583.265 to 583.429, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in NRS 583.265 to 583.429, inclusive.

**Sec. 7.** NRS 583.435 is hereby amended to read as follows:

583.435 1. Meat, meat food products, and poultry products are an important source of the supply of human food in this State and legislation to assure that such food supplies are unadulterated and otherwise fit for human consumption, and properly labeled, is in the public interest. Therefore, it is hereby declared to be the policy of this State to provide for the inspection of slaughtered livestock, poultry and other animals, and the carcasses and parts thereof which are used for human food, at certain establishments to prevent the distribution in intrastate commerce, for human consumption, of animal carcasses and parts thereof which are adulterated or otherwise unfit for human food.

2. [The] Except as otherwise provided in NRS 501.181, the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services is hereby designated as the single state agency primarily responsible for the administration of the program established by NRS 583.255 to 583.555, inclusive [...], and section 5 of this act.

**Sec. 8.** NRS 583.535 is hereby amended to read as follows:

583.535 1. [The] Except as otherwise provided in NRS 501.181, the State Board of Health shall promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary to carry out its responsibilities pursuant to NRS 583.255 to 583.555, inclusive [...], and section 5 of this act.

- 2. The rules and regulations must establish:
- (a) Procedures for hearings;
- (b) Standards for licensure;
- 39 (c) Standards for ante mortem and postmortem inspections;
  - (d) Standards for inspection of products; and
  - (e) Fees for permits, licenses and inspections.
  - 3. The rules and regulations must be in conformity with the provisions of the Wholesome Meat Act and Wholesome Poultry Products Act unless the Officer determines that a provision of the



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Act is not in accord with the objectives of NRS 583.255 to 583.555, inclusive [...], and section 5 of this act.

- 4. The Officer shall appoint such qualified personnel as are necessary to carry out the Officer's responsibilities pursuant to NRS 583.255 to 583.555, inclusive [...], and section 5 of this act.
  - **Sec. 9.** NRS 583.549 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 583.549 The district courts of this state are vested with jurisdiction specifically to enforce and to prevent and restrain violations of NRS 583.255 to 583.555, inclusive [...], and section 5 of this act.
- **Sec. 10.** The Board of Wildlife Commissioners shall adopt any regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act on or before October 1, 2011.
- **Sec. 11.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting regulations pursuant to the amendatory provisions of section 1 of this act and on October 1, 2011, for all other purposes.
