

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 39—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION)

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing educational personnel.  
(BDR 34-439)

AN ACT relating to educational personnel; removing the requirement that the Superintendent of Public Instruction notify a licensee by mail of the date of expiration of his or her license; requiring the Department of Education to maintain a directory of licensees on the Internet website maintained by the Department; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 This bill removes the requirement that the Superintendent of Public Instruction  
2 provide written notice, by first class mail, to each person who is licensed by the  
3 Superintendent of the date on which his or her license expires. This bill also  
4 requires the Department of Education to maintain a directory of the name of each  
5 person who is licensed and the date on which his or her license expires and to make  
6 that information available to licensed educational personnel and to the general  
7 public on the Department’s Internet website.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 391.042 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2 391.042 The ~~{Superintendent of Public Instruction}~~  
3 **Department** shall ~~{provide written notice to each person}~~ :  
4 **1. Maintain a directory of the name of each person** who holds  
5 a license issued pursuant to this chapter ~~{of}~~ **and** the date on which



1 ~~{the}~~ *his or her* license expires ~~[. The written notice must be mailed,~~  
2 ~~by first class mail, to the last known address of the licensee, as~~  
3 ~~reflected in the records of the Superintendent, not less than 6 months~~  
4 ~~and not more than 1 year before the date of expiration.] ; and~~

5 *2. Make the directory readily available to licensed*  
6 *educational personnel and to the general public on the Internet*  
7 *website maintained by the Department.*

8 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.
