

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 480—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION)

SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services for the completion of the takeover phase of the Medicaid Management Information System. (BDR S-1244)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services for the completion of the takeover phase of the Medicaid Management Information System; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General
2 Fund to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the
3 Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$175,710 for
4 the completion of the takeover phase of the Medicaid Management
5 Information System.

6 **Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
7 section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after
8 June 30, 2013, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or
9 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or
10 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the
11 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose
12 after September 20, 2013, by either the entity to which the money



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- 1 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
- 2 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
- 3 Fund on or before September 20, 2013.
- 4 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
