- 2 in response to attacks on the United States on September 11, 2001,
- 3 through Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom and
- 4 Operation New Dawn, 5,922 Americans have lost their lives,
- 5 including 53 Nevadans; and
