SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing contracts for services entered into by certain public employers. (BDR 23-149)

AN ACT relating to public agencies; revising the restrictions on contracts with or employment of former or current state employees by a state agency; requiring state agencies to report all contracts for services as part of the budget process; requiring that a contractor with a state agency ~~for with a school district have a current and valid business license;~~ **be in active and good standing with the Secretary of State;** and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law restricts the employment of consultants by public agencies and requires the
 2 approval of certain contracts with consultants by the Interim Finance Committee. (NRS
 3 284.1729) **Section 1** of this bill expands those restrictions to apply to all contracts to provide
 4 services to state agencies, ~~and~~ revises the exceptions to the restrictions, ~~and requires~~
 5 **approval of the State Board of Examiners rather than the Interim Finance Committee of**
 6 **contracts subject to the restrictions. Section 1 also prohibits a state agency from entering**
 7 **into a contract with a person for services without ensuring that the person is in active**
 8 **and good standing with the Secretary of State. Section 2** of this bill requires state agencies
 9 to report all contracts for services as part of the budget process instead of only reporting
 10 contracts with consultants and temporary employment services. ~~Sections 1 and 2 of this bill~~
 11 ~~prohibit a state agency or a school district from entering into a contract with a person for~~
 12 ~~services without ensuring that the person has a current and valid state business license.~~
 13 **Section 3** ~~also~~ moves the reporting requirements for school districts regarding consultants to
 14 the chapter which specifically governs school districts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 284.1729 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 284.1729 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a department,
3 division or other agency of this State shall not ~~{employ, by}~~ **enter into a** contract ~~{or~~
4 ~~otherwise.}~~ **with** a person to provide services ~~{as a consultant}~~ for the agency if:

5 (a) The person is a current employee of an agency of this State;

6 (b) The person is a former employee of an agency of this State and less than ~~{~~
7 ~~year has}~~ **2 years have** expired since the termination of the person's employment
8 with the State;

9 (c) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (d), the term of the contract is
10 for more than 2 years, or is amended or otherwise extended beyond 2 years; or

11 (d) The person is employed by the Department of Transportation for a
12 transportation project that is ~~{federally}~~ **entirely** funded **by federal money** and the
13 term of the contract is for more than 4 years, ~~{or is amended or otherwise extended~~
14 ~~beyond 4 years.}~~

15 ↪ unless, before the ~~{person is employed}~~ **contract is executed** by the agency, the
16 ~~{Interim Finance Committee}~~ **State Board of Examiners** approves the employment
17 of the person. **The requirements of this subsection apply to any person employed**
18 **by a business or other entity that enters into a contract to provide services for a**
19 **department, division or agency of this State if the person will be performing or**
20 **producing the services for which the business or entity is employed.**

21 2. The provisions of paragraph (b) of subsection 1 apply to employment
22 through a temporary employment service. A temporary employment service
23 providing employees for a state agency shall provide the agency with the names of
24 the employees to be provided to the agency. The ~~{Interim Finance Committee}~~
25 **State Board of Examiners** shall not approve ~~{the employment of a consultant}~~ **a**
26 **contract** pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1 unless the ~~{Interim Finance~~
27 ~~Committee}~~ **Board** determines that one or more of the following circumstances
28 exist:

29 (a) The person provides services that are not provided by any other employee
30 of the agency or for which a critical labor shortage exists; or

31 (b) A short-term need or unusual economic circumstance exists for the agency
32 to ~~{employ}~~ **contract with** the person. ~~{as a consultant.}~~

33 3. A department, division or other agency of this State may ~~{employ}~~ **contract**
34 **with** a person pursuant to paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection 1 without obtaining the
35 approval of the ~~{Interim Finance Committee}~~ **State Board of Examiners** if the term
36 of ~~{employment}~~ **the contract** is for less than 4 months and the executive head of
37 the department, division or agency determines that an emergency exists which
38 necessitates the ~~{employment.}~~ **contract**. If a department, division or agency
39 ~~{employs}~~ **contracts with** a person pursuant to this subsection, the department,
40 division or agency shall include in the report to the ~~{Interim Finance Committee}~~
41 **State Board of Examiners** pursuant to subsection 4 a description of the emergency.

42 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection ~~{7.}~~ **8**, a department, division or
43 other agency of this State shall report to the Interim Finance Committee whenever
44 it ~~{employs, by contract or otherwise.}~~ **contracts with** a person to provide services
45 ~~{as a consultant}~~ for the agency who is a former employee of a department, division
46 or other agency of this State.

47 5. Except as otherwise provided in subsection ~~{7.}~~ **8**, a department, division or
48 other agency of this State shall not contract with a temporary employment service
49 unless the contracting process is controlled by rules of open competitive bidding.

1 6. Each board or commission of this State ~~[each school district in this State]~~
 2 and each institution of the Nevada System of Higher Education that employs a
 3 consultant shall, at least once every 6 months, submit to the Interim Finance
 4 Committee a report setting forth:

5 (a) The number of consultants employed by the board, commission ~~[school~~
 6 ~~district]~~ or institution;

7 (b) The purpose for which the board, commission ~~[school district]~~ or
 8 institution employs each consultant;

9 (c) The amount of money or other remuneration received by each consultant
 10 from the board, commission ~~[school district]~~ or institution; and

11 (d) The length of time each consultant has been employed by the board,
 12 commission ~~[school district]~~ or institution.

13 7. *A department, division or other agency of this State, including a board or*
 14 *commission of this State and each institution of the Nevada System of Higher*
 15 *Education, shall not enter into a contract with a person to provide services*
 16 *without ensuring that the person ~~[has a current and valid state business license.]~~*
 17 *is in active and good standing with the Secretary of State.*

18 8. The provisions of subsections 1 to 5, inclusive, do not apply to: ~~[the:]~~

19 (a) ~~The Nevada System of Higher Education [the Public Employees' Benefits~~
 20 ~~Program]~~ or a board or commission of this State.

21 (b) ~~[Employment]~~ *The employment* of professional engineers by the
 22 Department of Transportation if those engineers are employed for a transportation
 23 project that is ~~federally funded.~~

24 ~~8. For the purposes of this section, "consultant" includes any person~~
 25 ~~employed by a business or other entity that is providing consulting services if the~~
 26 ~~person will be performing or producing the work for which the business or entity is~~
 27 ~~employed.] entirely funded by federal money.~~

33 *(3) Pursuant to the Public Employees' Benefits Program.*

34 **Sec. 2.** NRS 353.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35 353.210 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 6, on or before
 36 September 1 of each even-numbered year, all departments, institutions and other
 37 agencies of the Executive Department of the State Government, and all agencies of
 38 the Executive Department of the State Government receiving state money, fees or
 39 other money under the authority of the State, including those operating on money
 40 designated for specific purposes by the Nevada Constitution or otherwise, shall
 41 prepare, on blanks furnished them by the Chief, and submit to the Chief:

42 (a) The number of positions within the department, institution or agency that
 43 have been vacant for at least 12 months, the number of months each such position
 44 has been vacant and the reasons for each such vacancy;

45 (b) Any existing contracts *for services* the department, institution or agency
 46 has with ~~[consultants or]~~ temporary employment services ~~[]~~ *or other persons*, the
 47 proposed expenditures for such contracts in the next 2 fiscal years and the reasons
 48 for the use of such ~~[consultants or]~~ services; and

49 (c) Estimates of their expenditure requirements, together with all anticipated
 50 income from fees and all other sources, for the next 2 fiscal years compared with
 51 the corresponding figures of the last completed fiscal year and the estimated figures
 52 for the current fiscal year.

1 2. The Chief shall direct that one copy of the forms submitted pursuant to
2 subsection 1, accompanied by every supporting schedule and any other related
3 material, be delivered directly to the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative
4 Counsel Bureau on or before September 1 of each even-numbered year.

5 3. The Budget Division of the Department of Administration shall give
6 advance notice to the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau of
7 any conference between the Budget Division of the Department of Administration
8 and personnel of other state agencies regarding budget estimates. A Fiscal Analyst
9 of the Legislative Counsel Bureau or his or her designated representative may
10 attend any such conference.

11 4. The estimates of expenditure requirements submitted pursuant to
12 subsection 1 must be classified to set forth the data of funds, organizational units,
13 and the character and objects of expenditures, and must include a mission statement
14 and measurement indicators for each program. The organizational units may be
15 subclassified by functions and activities, or in any other manner at the discretion of
16 the Chief.

17 5. If any department, institution or other agency of the Executive Department
18 of the State Government, whether its money is derived from state money or from
19 other money collected under the authority of the State, fails or neglects to submit
20 estimates of its expenditure requirements as provided in this section, the Chief may,
21 from any data at hand in the Chief's office or which the Chief may examine or
22 obtain elsewhere, make and enter a proposed budget for the department, institution
23 or agency in accordance with the data.

24 6. Agencies, bureaus, commissions and officers of the Legislative
25 Department, the Public Employees' Retirement System and the Judicial Department
26 of the State Government shall submit to the Chief for his or her information in
27 preparing the proposed executive budget the budgets which they propose to submit
28 to the Legislature.

29 **Sec. 3.** Chapter 391 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
30 section to read as follows:

31 ~~Each school district in this State that employs a consultant shall, at~~
32 ~~least once every 6 months, submit to the Interim Finance Committee a report~~
33 ~~setting forth:~~

34 ~~(a) 1. The number of consultants employed by the school district;~~
35 ~~(b) 2. The purpose for which the school district employs each consultant;~~
36 ~~(c) 3. The amount of money or other remuneration received by each~~
37 ~~consultant from the school district; and~~
38 ~~(d) 4. The length of time each consultant has been employed by the~~
39 ~~school district.~~

40 ~~2. A school district shall not employ, by contract or otherwise, a person to~~
41 ~~provide services for the school district for which a business license is required~~
42 ~~without ensuring that the person has a current and valid state business license.~~
