SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing athletics in public schools.
(BDR 34-1137)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association and the board of trustees of each school district to adopt policies concerning the prevention and treatment of injuries to the head sustained by pupils while participating in sports and other athletic activities and events; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes the county school districts to form a nonprofit association to be
2 known as the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association for the purposes of controlling,
3 supervising and regulating all interscholastic athletic events and other interscholastic events in
4 the public schools. (NRS 386.420-386.470) **Section 1** of this bill requires the Association to
5 adopt a policy concerning the prevention and treatment of injuries to the head which may
6 occur during a pupil's participation in interscholastic activities and events, including, without
7 limitation, concussion of the brain. The policy must require that a pupil who sustains or is
8 suspected of sustaining an injury to the head while participating in such an activity or event:
9 (1) be immediately removed from the activity or event; and (2) may not return to the activity
10 or event unless the parent or legal guardian of the pupil provides a written statement from a
11 provider of health care indicating that the pupil is medically cleared to participate **if and the**
12 **date on which the pupil may return to the activity or event.** A pupil who participates in
13 interscholastic activities and events and his or her parent or legal guardian must sign a form
14 acknowledging that they have received a copy of the policy and understand its terms and
15 conditions before the pupil's participation in the activity or event and must sign the form on
16 an annual basis thereafter. **Section 2** of this bill requires the board of trustees of each school
17 district to adopt a similar policy for the participation of pupils in competitive sports within the
18 school district which are not governed by the Association.

1 WHEREAS, A concussion is a brain injury that results from a bump, blow or jolt
2 to the head or body which causes the brain to move rapidly in the skull and which
3 disrupts normal brain function; and

4 WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United
5 States Department of Health and Human Services estimates that as many as 3.8

1 million concussions occur each year in the United States which are related to
2 participation in sports and other recreational activities; and

3 WHEREAS, Children who continue to participate in an athletic activity while
4 suffering from a concussion or suffering from the symptoms of an injury to the
5 head are at a greater risk for catastrophic injury to the brain or even death; and

6 WHEREAS, Ensuring that a child who sustains or is suspected of sustaining a
7 concussion or other injury to the head receives the appropriate medical care before
8 returning to an athletic activity will significantly reduce the child's risk of
9 sustaining greater injury; now, therefore,

10
11 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
12 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:
13

14 **Section 1.** Chapter 386 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
15 section to read as follows:

16 *1. The Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association shall adopt a policy
17 concerning the prevention and treatment of injuries to the head which may occur
18 during a pupil's participation in interscholastic activities and events, including,
19 without limitation, a concussion of the brain. The policy must provide
20 information concerning the nature and risk of injuries to the head which may
21 occur during the pupil's participation in interscholastic activities and events,
22 including, without limitation, the risks associated with continuing to participate
23 in the activity or event after sustaining such an injury.*

24 *2. The policy adopted pursuant to subsection 1 must require that if a pupil
25 sustains or is suspected of sustaining an injury to the head while participating in
26 an interscholastic activity or event, the pupil:*

27 *(a) Must be immediately removed from the activity or event; and*

28 *(b) May return to the activity or event if the parent or legal guardian of the
29 pupil provides a signed statement of a provider of health care indicating that the
30 pupil is medically cleared for participation in the activity or event ~~H~~ and the date
31 on which the pupil may return to the activity or event.*

32 *3. Before a pupil participates in an interscholastic activity or event, and on
33 an annual basis thereafter, the pupil and his or her parent or legal guardian:*

34 *(a) Must be provided with a copy of the policy adopted pursuant to subsection
35 1; and*

36 *(b) Must sign a statement on a form prescribed by the Nevada Interscholastic
37 Activities Association acknowledging that the pupil and his or her parent or
38 guardian have read and understand the terms and conditions of the policy.*

39 *4. As used in this section, "provider of health care" means a physician
40 licensed under chapter 630 or 633 of NRS, a physical therapist licensed under
41 chapter 640 of NRS or an athletic trainer licensed under chapter 640B of NRS.*

42 Sec. 2. Chapter 392 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
43 section to read as follows:

44 *1. For those competitive sports not governed by the Nevada Interscholastic
45 Activities Association pursuant to NRS 386.420 to 386.470, inclusive, and section
46 1 of this act, the board of trustees of each school district shall adopt a policy
47 concerning the prevention and treatment of injuries to the head which may occur
48 during a pupil's participation in competitive sports within the school district,
49 including, without limitation, a concussion of the brain. To the extent
50 practicable, the policy must be consistent with the policy adopted by the Nevada
51 Interscholastic Activities Association pursuant to section 1 of this act. The policy
52 must provide information concerning the nature and risk of injuries to the head
53 which may occur during a pupil's participation in competitive sports, including,*

1 without limitation, the risks associated with continuing to participate in
2 competitive sports after sustaining such an injury.

3 2. The policy adopted pursuant to subsection 1 must require that if a pupil
4 sustains or is suspected of sustaining an injury to the head while participating in
5 competitive sports, the pupil:

6 (a) Must be immediately removed from the competitive sport; and

7 (b) May return to competitive sports if the parent or legal guardian of the
8 pupil provides a signed statement of a provider of health care indicating that the
9 pupil is medically cleared for participation in the competitive sport ~~and the~~ and the
10 date on which the pupil may return to the competitive sport.

11 3. Before a pupil participates in competitive sports within a school district,
12 and on an annual basis thereafter, the pupil and his or her parent or legal
13 guardian:

14 (a) Must be provided with a copy of the policy adopted pursuant to subsection
15 1; and

16 (b) Must sign a statement on a form prescribed by the board of trustees
17 acknowledging that the pupil and his or her parent or guardian have read and
18 understand the terms and conditions of the policy.

19 4. As used in this section, "provider of health care" means a physician
20 licensed under chapter 630 or 633 of NRS, a physical therapist licensed under
21 chapter 640 of NRS or an athletic trainer licensed under chapter 640B of NRS.

22 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.
