AN ACT relating to hazardous materials; revising the scope of the duties and powers of the Executive Director of the Agency for Nuclear Projects; revising the scope of the duties of the Administrators of each Division of the Agency; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law establishes the Agency for Nuclear Projects and imposes on the Executive
2 Director of the Agency and the Administrators of each Division of the Agency certain duties
3 relating to the potential disposal of radioactive waste in this State and the location of a facility
4 for the disposal of radioactive waste in this State. Additionally, existing law vests the
5 Executive Director with certain discretionary powers relating to the potential disposal of
6 radioactive waste in this State. (NRS 459.009, 459.0093-459.0098) **[Section 1 of this bill]** This
7 bill revises the definition of “radioactive waste” to include high-level radioactive waste, low-
8 level radioactive waste, transuranic waste, spent nuclear fuel and certain other radioactive
9 materials, thereby expanding the scope of the duties and powers of the Executive Director and
10 the Administrators as such duties and powers relate to the potential disposal of radioactive
11 waste in this State. **[Section 2 of this bill preserves the current definition of “radioactive
12 waste” as it relates to provisions governing the Commission on Nuclear Projects.]**

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:1 **Section 1.** NRS 459.009 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 459.009 As used in NRS 459.009 to 459.0098, inclusive, unless the context
3 otherwise requires:

4 1. “Agency” means the Agency for Nuclear Projects.
5 2. “Commission” means the Commission on Nuclear Projects.
6 3. “Executive Director” means the Executive Director of the Agency.
7 4. “Radioactive waste” **is limited to:**

1 —(a) ~~The highly radioactive material resulting from the reprocessing of spent~~
2 ~~nuclear fuel, including liquid waste and any solid material derived from the liquid~~
3 ~~waste that contains concentrations of matter produced by nuclear fission sufficient~~
4 ~~to require permanent isolation, as determined by the Nuclear Regulatory~~
5 ~~Commission;~~

6 —(b) *means radioactive material, including, without limitation:*

- 7 (a) *High-level radioactive waste;*
8 (b) *Low-level radioactive waste;*
9 (c) *Transuranic waste;*

10 (d) ~~Spent nuclear fuel [that has been withdrawn from a reactor following~~
11 ~~irradiation and has not been separated into its constituent elements by reprocessing;~~
12 ~~and~~

13 (e) ~~Other];~~

14 (f) *Any radioactive material resulting from, or a by-product of, the nuclear*
15 *fuel cycle, the reprocessing of spent nuclear fuel or weapons reprocessing; and*

16 (g) *Any other radioactive* material that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission
17 determines must be permanently isolated.

18 ↳ *The term includes, without limitation, radioactive material that is a solid,*
19 *semisolid, liquid or contained gas, or any combination thereof.*

20 Sec. 2. ~~NRS 459.0092~~ is hereby amended to read as follows:

21 459.0092 *I.* The Commission shall:

22 [1.] (a) Be informed on issues and developments relating to the disposal of
23 radioactive waste;

24 [2.] (b) Report to the Governor and the Legislature on any matter relating to
25 the disposal of radioactive waste which it deems appropriate and on any such
26 matter requested by the Governor;

27 [3.] (c) Advise and make recommendations to the Governor and the
28 Legislature on the policy of this State concerning all projects involving the disposal
29 of radioactive waste;

30 [4.] (d) Formulate the administrative policies of the Agency and its divisions;

31 [5.] (e) Advise the state and local governments on litigation relating to
32 radioactive waste;

33 [6.] (f) Adopt such regulations and perform such other duties as are necessary
34 to carry out the provisions of NRS 459.009 to 459.0098, inclusive.

35 2. As used in this section, "radioactive waste" is limited to:

36 (a) ~~The highly radioactive material resulting from the reprocessing of spent~~
