SUMMARY—Prohibits the use of a cellular telephone or other handheld wireless communications device while operating a motor vehicle in certain circumstances. (BDR 43-45)

AN ACT relating to traffic laws; prohibiting a person from using a cellular telephone or other handheld wireless communications device while operating a motor vehicle in certain circumstances; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing traffic laws of this State, it is a crime to engage in various activities while operating a motor vehicle or to operate a motor vehicle in a reckless or unsafe manner. (Chapters 484A-484E of NRS) **Section 1** of this bill makes it a crime for a person to manually type or enter text into a cellular telephone or other similar device, or to send or read data using any such device, while operating a motor vehicle. **Section 1** further prohibits a person from using such a device for voice communications unless the device is used with an accessory which allows the person to communicate without using his or her hands, with certain limited exceptions. **Section 1** provides an exception to the prohibitions when the cellular telephone or other device is used by law enforcement officers and other emergency personnel who are acting within the course and scope of their employment. Additional exceptions apply if : **(1)** the person is using the cellular telephone or other device to report or request assistance relating to a medical emergency, a safety hazard or criminal activity, ~~**(2)**~~ ; **(2)** the person is responding to a situation requiring immediate action and stopping the vehicle would be inadvisable, impractical or dangerous, ~~**(3)**~~ ; or **(3)** the person is a licensed amateur radio operator providing communications services in connection with a disaster or emergency, participating in a drill, test, or other exercise in preparation for a disaster or emergency or otherwise communicating public information. A violation of the provisions added by **section 1** is a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of \$250 for a first offense within the immediately preceding 7 years, \$500 for a second offense within the immediately preceding 7 years and \$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense within the immediately preceding 7 years. **Section 1** further provides that a first offense will not be treated as a moving traffic violation. Additionally, if a person is convicted of a third or subsequent offense, in addition to the fine, the driver's license of the person will be suspended for 6 months. **Section 2** of this bill makes

24 the enhanced penalty for certain traffic violations that occur in a temporary traffic control
25 zone applicable to violations of these new crimes.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 484B of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 *1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person shall not, while
4 operating a motor vehicle on a highway in this State:*

5 *(a) Manually type or enter text into a cellular telephone or other handheld
6 wireless communications device, or send or read data using any such device to
7 access or search the Internet or to engage in nonvoice communications with
8 another person, including, without limitation, texting, electronic messaging and
9 instant messaging.*

10 *(b) Use a cellular telephone or other handheld wireless communications
11 device to engage in voice communications with the another person, unless the
12 device is used with an accessory which allows the person to communicate without
13 using his or her hands, other than to activate, deactivate or initiate a feature or
14 function on the device.*

15 *2. The provisions of this section do not apply to:*

16 *(a) A paid or volunteer firefighter, law enforcement officer, emergency
17 medical technician, ambulance attendant or other person trained to provide
18 emergency medical services who is acting within the course and scope of his or
19 her employment.*

20 *(b) A person who is reporting a medical emergency, a safety hazard or
21 criminal activity or who is requesting assistance relating to a medical emergency,
22 a safety hazard or criminal activity.*

23 *(c) A person who is responding to a situation requiring immediate action to
24 protect the health, welfare or safety of the driver or another person and stopping
25 the vehicle would be inadvisable, impractical or dangerous.*

26 *(d) A person who is licensed by the Federal Communications Commission as
27 an amateur radio operator and who is providing a communication service in
28 connection with an actual or impending disaster or emergency, participating in a
29 drill, test, or other exercise in preparation for a disaster or emergency or
30 otherwise communicating public information.*

31 *3. The provisions of this section do not prohibit the use of a voice-activated
32 global positioning or navigation system that is affixed to the vehicle.*

33 *4. A person who violates any provision of subsection 1 is guilty of a
34 misdemeanor and:*

35 *(a) For the first offense within the immediately preceding 7 years, shall pay a
36 fine of \$250.*

37 *(b) For the second offense within the immediately preceding 7 years, shall
38 pay a fine of \$500.*

39 *(c) For the third or subsequent offense within the immediately preceding 7
40 years, shall pay a fine of \$1,000.*

41 *5. A person who violates any provision of subsection 1 may be subject to the
42 additional penalty set forth in NRS 484B.130.*

43 *6. If a person is found guilty of a third or subsequent offense of subsection
44 1, the court shall, in addition to any other penalty imposed, issue an order
45 suspending the driver's license of the person for 6 months. The court shall*

1 **require the person to surrender all driver's licenses then held by the person. If
2 the person does not possess a driver's license, the court shall issue an order
3 prohibiting the person from applying for a driver's license for 6 months. The
4 court shall, within 5 days after issuing the order, forward to the Department of
5 Motor Vehicles any licenses, together with a copy of the order.**

6 **7. The Department of Motor Vehicles:**

7 **(a) Shall not treat a first violation of this section in the manner statutorily
8 required for a moving traffic violation.**

9 **(b) Shall report the suspension of a driver's license pursuant to this section
10 to an insurance company or its agent inquiring about the person's driving record.**

11 **8. As used in this section, "handheld wireless communications device"
12 means a handheld device for the transfer of information without the use of
13 electrical conductors or wires and includes, without limitation, a cellular
14 telephone, a personal digital assistant, a pager and a text messaging device.**

15 **Sec. 2.** NRS 484B.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

16 484B.130 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2 and 6, a person
17 who is convicted of a violation of a speed limit, or of NRS 484B.150, 484B.163,
18 484B.200 to 484B.217, inclusive, 484B.223, 484B.227, 484B.300, 484B.303,
19 484B.317, 484B.320, 484B.327, 484B.330, 484B.403, 484B.587, 484B.600,
20 484B.603, 484B.610, 484B.613, 484B.650, 484B.653, 484B.657, 484C.110 or
21 484C.120, **or section 1 of this act**, that occurred:

22 (a) In an area designated as a temporary traffic control zone; and

23 (b) At a time when the workers who are performing construction, maintenance
24 or repair of the highway or other work are present, or when the effects of the act
25 may be aggravated because of the condition of the highway caused by construction,
26 maintenance or repair, including, without limitation, reduction in lane width,
27 reduction in the number of lanes, shifting of lanes from the designated alignment
28 and uneven or temporary surfaces, including, without limitation, modifications to
29 road beds, cement-treated bases, chip seals and other similar conditions,

30 → shall be punished by imprisonment or by a fine, or both, for a term or an amount
31 equal to and in addition to the term of imprisonment or amount of the fine, or both,
32 that the court imposes for the primary offense. Any term of imprisonment imposed
33 pursuant to this subsection runs consecutively with the sentence prescribed by the
34 court for the crime. This subsection does not create a separate offense, but provides
35 an additional penalty for the primary offense, whose imposition is contingent upon
36 the finding of the prescribed fact.

37 2. The additional penalty imposed pursuant to subsection 1 must not exceed a
38 total of \$1,000, 6 months of imprisonment or 120 hours of community service.

39 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5, a governmental entity that
40 designates an area or authorizes the designation of an area as a temporary traffic
41 control zone in which construction, maintenance or repair of a highway or other
42 work is conducted, or the person with whom the governmental entity contracts to
43 provide such service, shall cause to be erected:

44 (a) A sign located before the beginning of such an area stating "DOUBLE
45 PENALTIES IN WORK ZONES" to indicate a double penalty may be imposed
46 pursuant to this section;

47 (b) A sign to mark the beginning of the temporary traffic control zone; and

48 (c) A sign to mark the end of the temporary traffic control zone.

49 4. A person who otherwise would be subject to an additional penalty pursuant
50 to this section is not relieved of any criminal liability because signs are not erected
51 as required by subsection 3 if the violation results in injury to any person
52 performing highway construction or maintenance or other work in the temporary
53 traffic control zone or in damage to property in an amount equal to \$1,000 or more.

1 5. The requirements of subsection 3 do not apply to an area designated as a
2 temporary traffic control zone:

3 (a) Pursuant to an emergency which results from a natural or other disaster and
4 which threatens the health, safety or welfare of the public; or

5 (b) On a public highway where the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or
6 less and that provides access to or is appurtenant to a residential area.

7 6. A person who would otherwise be subject to an additional penalty pursuant
8 to this section is not subject to an additional penalty if the violation occurred in a
9 temporary traffic control zone for which signs are not erected pursuant to
10 subsection 5, unless the violation results in injury to any person performing
11 highway construction or maintenance or other work in the temporary traffic control
12 zone or in damage to property in an amount equal to \$1,000 or more.

13 **Sec. 3.** NRS 707.375 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 707.375 1. ~~An~~ *Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act, an*
15 agency, board, commission or political subdivision of this State, including, without
16 limitation, any agency, board, commission or governing body of a local
17 government, shall not regulate the use of a telephonic device by a person who is
18 operating a motor vehicle.

19 2. As used in subsection 1, “telephonic device” means a cellular phone,
20 satellite phone, portable phone or any other similar electronic device that is
21 handheld and designed or used to communicate with ~~to~~ *another* person.
