**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing assistance to parents and relatives caring for certain persons with mental retardation and related conditions. (BDR 39-1215)

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AN ACT relating to public assistance; revising provisions governing assistance provided to parents and relatives caring for certain persons with mental retardation or related conditions or children with certain developmental delays; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law provides assistance to parents and relatives caring for certain persons with  
2 mental retardation or related conditions or, if the person being cared for is under 6 years of  
3 age, similar developmental delays if certain other criteria relating to income and the quality of  
4 care are met. (NRS 435.365) This bill provides that such assistance is available only to the  
5 extent that money is available for that purpose and **[authorized]** **requires** the Division of  
6 Mental Health and Developmental Services of the Department of Health and Human Services  
7 to establish a waiting list for eligible applicants who are not provided assistance because of a  
8 shortage of money.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 435.365 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2       435.365 1. **[Whenever]** **To the extent that money is available for that**  
3 **purpose, whenever** a person with mental retardation or a related condition is cared  
4 for by a parent or other relative with whom the person lives, that parent or relative  
5 is eligible to receive assistance on a monthly basis from the Division for each such  
6 person who lives and is cared for in the home if the Division finds that:  
7       (a) The person with mental retardation or a related condition has been  
8 diagnosed as having profound or severe mental retardation or, if he or she is under  
9 6 years of age, has developmental delays that require support that is equivalent to

1 the support required by a person with profound or severe mental retardation or a  
2 related condition;

3       (b) The person with mental retardation or a related condition is receiving  
4 adequate care; and

5       (c) The person with mental retardation or a related condition and the parent or  
6 other relative with whom the person lives is not reasonably able to pay for his or  
7 her care and support.

8 → The amount of the assistance must be established by legislative appropriation for  
9 each fiscal year.

10      2. The Division shall adopt regulations:

11       (a) Which establish a procedure of application for assistance;

12       (b) For determining the eligibility of an applicant pursuant to subsection 1; and

13       (c) For determining the amount of assistance to be provided to an eligible  
14 applicant.

15      3. *The Division [may] shall establish a waiting list for applicants who are  
16 eligible for assistance but who are denied assistance because the legislative  
17 appropriation is insufficient to provide assistance for all eligible applicants.*

18      4. The decision of the Division regarding eligibility for assistance or the  
19 amount of assistance to be provided is a final administrative decision.
