**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions concerning the renewal of permits to carry concealed firearms. (BDR 15-1060)

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AN ACT relating to concealed firearms; revising provisions concerning the renewal of permits to carry concealed firearms; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law requires a sheriff who receives an application for a permit to carry  
2 a concealed firearm to conduct an investigation of the applicant to determine if the  
3 applicant is eligible for a permit. (NRS 202.366) This bill additionally requires a  
4 sheriff to conduct an investigation of an applicant who wishes to renew his or her  
5 permit to carry a concealed firearm.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 202.366 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2           202.366   1. Upon receipt by a sheriff of an application for a  
3      permit, ***including an application for the renewal of a permit***  
4      ***pursuant to NRS 202.3677,*** the sheriff shall conduct an  
5      investigation of the applicant to determine if the applicant is eligible

1 for a permit. In conducting the investigation, the sheriff shall  
2 forward a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints to the Central  
3 Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission  
4 to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report concerning the  
5 criminal history of the applicant. The sheriff shall issue a permit to  
6 the applicant unless the applicant is not qualified to possess a  
7 handgun pursuant to state or federal law or is not otherwise qualified  
8 to obtain a permit pursuant to NRS 202.3653 to 202.369, inclusive,  
9 or the regulations adopted pursuant thereto.

10 2. To assist the sheriff in conducting the investigation, any  
11 local law enforcement agency, including the sheriff of any county,  
12 may voluntarily submit to the sheriff a report or other information  
13 concerning the criminal history of an applicant.

14 3. Within 120 days after a complete application for a permit is  
15 submitted, the sheriff to whom the application is submitted shall  
16 grant or deny the application. If the application is denied, the sheriff  
17 shall send the applicant written notification setting forth the reasons  
18 for the denial. If the application is granted, the sheriff shall provide  
19 the applicant with a permit containing a colored photograph of the  
20 applicant and containing such other information as may be  
21 prescribed by the Department. The permit must be in substantially

39 4. Unless suspended or revoked by the sheriff who issued the  
40 permit, a permit expires 5 years after the date on which it is issued.

41 **Sec. 2.** NRS 202.3677 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
42 202.3677 1. If a permittee wishes to renew his or her permit,  
43 the permittee must **[complete]**:

44 (a) **Complete** and submit to the sheriff who issued the permit an  
45 application for renewal of the permit **[ ] ; and**

1        **(b) Undergo an investigation by the sheriff pursuant to NRS  
2 202.366 to determine if the permittee is eligible for a permit.**

3        2. An application for the renewal of a permit must:

4            (a) Be completed and signed under oath by the applicant;

5            (b) Contain a statement that the applicant is eligible to receive a  
6 permit pursuant to NRS 202.3657; and

7            (c) Be accompanied by a nonrefundable fee of \$25.

8        ➔ If a permittee fails to renew his or her permit on or before the  
9 date of expiration of the permit, the application for renewal must  
10 include an additional nonrefundable late fee of \$15.

11        3. No permit may be renewed pursuant to this section unless  
12 the permittee has demonstrated continued competence with  
13 revolvers, with each semiautomatic firearm to which the application  
14 pertains, or with revolvers and each such semiautomatic firearm, as  
15 applicable, by successfully completing a course prescribed by the  
16 sheriff renewing the permit.
