

## SENATE BILL NO. 299—SENATOR MANENDO (BY REQUEST)

MARCH 21, 2011

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions relating to the care of animals.  
(BDR 50-388)

---

AN ACT relating to animals; requiring the board of county commissioners of each county and the governing body of each incorporated city to adopt an ordinance requiring commercial breeders of dogs or cats to obtain a permit to act as a breeder under certain circumstances; setting forth the requirements for the issuance of those permits; making various changes to the standards of care for dogs and cats; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law specifies standards for the care of dogs and cats by kennel and  
2 cattery operators, cat and dog breeders and sellers, and operators of animal shelters.  
3 (NRS 574.360-574.440) **Section 1.3** of this bill defines “breeder” as a person who  
4 operates a commercial establishment engaged in the business of breeding dogs or  
5 cats for sale or trade. **Section 1.6** of this bill requires the board of county  
6 commissioners of each county and the governing body of each incorporated city to  
7 adopt an ordinance requiring each breeder to obtain an annual permit to do so from  
8 the board or governing body or from the animal control agency of the applicable  
9 county or city. **Section 1.6** also requires the applicable authority to issue the permit  
10 and assign a permit number to each breeder who applies for a permit, pays any  
11 prescribed fee and complies with any other requirement established by the  
12 ordinance. Each permit issued must specify the premises at which the person may  
13 act as a breeder, and the number of the permit assigned to a breeder must be  
14 displayed in all advertising in which the breeder offers a dog or cat for sale or trade  
15 and on any receipt of sale of a dog or cat sold by the breeder. **Section 1.6** also  
16 authorizes an animal control agent of the applicable board or governing body or

17 animal control agency to enter and inspect the specified premises of a breeder  
18 during any reasonable hour for the purpose of enforcing the animal care provisions  
19 of chapter 574 of NRS. Finally, **section 1.6** authorizes the ordinances required  
20 pursuant to this bill to provide for the suspension, revocation or denial of a permit  
21 for violating those animal care provisions.

22 **Section 1.9** of this bill prohibits a breeder from selling a dog or cat unless a  
23 registered microchip has been subcutaneously inserted into the dog or cat and the  
24 dog or cat has had its required vaccination for rabies. In addition, **section 1.9**  
25 prohibits a breeder from selling a dog or cat without a written sales contract and  
26 further prohibits a breeder from breeding a female dog before she is 18 months old  
27 or more than once a year. **Sections 4 and 8-13** of this bill make various changes to  
28 certain standards of care for dogs and cats.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 574 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 1.3, 1.6 and 1.9 of this  
3 act.

4 **Sec. 1.3. "Breeder" means a dealer, operator or other person  
5 who is responsible for the operation of a commercial  
6 establishment engaged in the business of breeding dogs or cats for  
7 sale or trade.**

8 **Sec. 1.6. 1. In addition to any ordinance adopted pursuant  
9 to NRS 244.189 or 244.359, the board of county commissioners of  
10 each county, if its jurisdiction to enact and enforce ordinances  
11 relating to animals is not limited by an interlocal agreement, shall  
12 adopt an ordinance requiring each breeder in an unincorporated  
13 area of the county to obtain an annual permit to act as a breeder  
14 issued by the board or by the animal control agency of the county,  
15 if any.**

16 **2. In addition to any ordinance adopted pursuant to NRS  
17 266.325, the city council or other governing body of each  
18 incorporated city, whether organized under general law or special  
19 charter, if its jurisdiction to enact and enforce ordinances relating  
20 to animals is not limited by an interlocal agreement, shall adopt an  
21 ordinance requiring each breeder in the incorporated area of the  
22 city to obtain an annual permit to act as a breeder issued by the  
23 city council or other governing body or by the animal control  
24 agency, if any.**

25 **3. After a board of county commissioners or a city council or  
26 other governing body of an incorporated city adopts an ordinance  
27 pursuant to subsection 1 or 2, as applicable, the board or  
28 governing body shall issue a permit and assign a permit number to  
29 each breeder who:**

1       (a) Submits an application on a form and in the manner  
2 prescribed by the ordinance;

3       (b) Pays a fee prescribed by the ordinance; and

4       (c) Complies with any other requirements prescribed by the  
5 ordinance.

6       4. Each permit issued pursuant to subsection 3 must specify  
7 the address of the premises at which the person may act as a  
8 breeder.

9       5. The number of the permit assigned to a breeder pursuant  
10 to subsection 3 must be displayed in all advertising in which the  
11 breeder offers a dog or cat for sale and on any receipt of sale of a  
12 dog or cat sold by the breeder.

13       6. For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of NRS  
14 574.360 to 574.440, inclusive, as those provisions apply to  
15 breeders, any animal control agent of the issuing authority may  
16 enter and inspect the premises specified on the permit at any  
17 reasonable hour.

18       7. An ordinance adopted pursuant to subsection 1 or 2 may  
19 provide for the suspension, revocation or denial of a permit for a  
20 violation of the provisions of NRS 574.360 to 574.440, inclusive,  
21 as those provisions apply to breeders.

22       Sec. 1.9. A breeder shall not:

23       1. Sell a dog or cat:

24       (a) Unless the dog or cat has had:

25           (1) A registered microchip subcutaneously inserted into the  
26 dog or cat; and

27           (2) All its required vaccinations for rabies; or

28       (b) Without providing a written sales contract to the  
29 purchaser; or

30       2. Breed a female dog:

31       (a) Before she is 18 months old; or

32       (b) More than once a year.

33       Sec. 2. NRS 574.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

34       574.210 As used in NRS 574.210 to 574.510, inclusive, **and**  
35 **sections 1.3, 1.6 and 1.9 of this act**, unless the context otherwise  
36 requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 574.220 to 574.330,  
37 inclusive, **and section 1.3 of this act** have the meanings ascribed to  
38 them in those sections.

39       Sec. 3. (Deleted by amendment.)

40       Sec. 4. NRS 574.310 is hereby amended to read as follows:

41       574.310 "Primary enclosure" means a structure used to restrict  
42 the immediate movement of a dog or cat to a limited amount of  
43 space, such as a room, pen, run, cage, compartment or hutch ~~H~~,  
44 **and in which an animal is regularly so restricted for more than 7**  
45 **hours during a 24-hour period.**

1      **Sec. 5.** NRS 574.340 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2      574.340 **1.** The provisions of NRS 574.210 to 574.510,  
3      inclusive, **and sections 1.3, 1.6 and 1.9 of this act** do not apply to:  
4      **[t] (a)** The exhibition, production, marketing or disposal of  
5      any livestock, poultry, fish or other agricultural commodity **[t]**  
6      **2.] or animal.**  
7      **(b)** Activities for which a license is required by the provisions of  
8      chapter 466 of NRS.  
9      **[t] (c)** The housing of domestic cats or dogs kept as pets or  
10     cared for, without remuneration other than payment for reasonable  
11     expenses relating to the care of the cats or dogs, on behalf of another  
12     person in a home environment.  
13      **[t] (d)** The exhibition of dogs or cats.  
14      **2. As used in this section:**  
15      **(a) "Animal" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 564.010.**  
16      **(b) "Livestock" has the meaning ascribed to it in**

18      **Sec. 6.** NRS 574.350 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
19      574.350 No member, agent or officer of a society for the  
20     prevention of cruelty to animals may enforce the provisions of NRS  
21     574.210 to 574.510, inclusive **[t], and sections 1.3, 1.6 and 1.9 of**  
22     **this act.**  
23      **Sec. 7.** (Deleted by amendment.)  
24      **Sec. 8.** (Deleted by amendment.)  
25      **Sec. 9.** NRS 574.380 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
26      574.380 If dogs or cats are kept outdoors, an operator shall:  
27        1. Provide a suitable method for the rapid drainage of surface  
28        water from the area where each dog or cat is kept.  
29        2. Provide each dog or cat with a sufficient amount of shelter  
30        to:  
31          (a) Remain dry from rain and snow;  
32          (b) Have enough shade to protect itself from any direct sunlight  
33        that is likely to cause overheating or discomfort; **[and]**  
34          (c) **Remain cool during a period for which the National**  
35        **Weather Service has issued a heat advisory;**  
36          (d) **Protect the animal from wind which creates a wind chill**  
37        **below 50 degrees Fahrenheit or for which the National Weather**  
38        **Service has issued a high wind warning; and**  
39          (e) Remain warm when the atmospheric temperature falls below  
40        50 degrees Fahrenheit. If the ambient temperature falls below **[the**  
41        **temperature to which a dog or cat is acclimated.] 50 degrees**  
42        **Fahrenheit,** the operator shall provide such an additional amount of  
43        clean bedding material or other protection as necessary for the dog  
44        or cat to remain warm.

1       3. After considering the ambient temperature, provide each dog  
2 or cat with a sufficient amount of food and water necessary to  
3 sustain it in a healthy condition at that temperature.

4       **Sec. 10.** NRS 574.390 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
5       574.390   **1.** An operator shall ensure that a primary enclosure

6 ~~[is]~~:

- 7       (a) *Has a solid floor;*  
8       (b) *Is not stacked on top of another primary enclosure; and*  
9       (c) *Is* constructed and maintained in such a manner as to:

10      ~~H.~~ (1) Protect the dogs or cats inside from injury;  
11      ~~E.~~ (2) Prevent the dogs or cats inside from escaping;  
12      ~~T.~~ (3) Keep other dogs or cats out;  
13      ~~F.~~ (4) Allow the dogs or cats inside convenient access to  
14 food and water;  
15      ~~S.~~ (5) Enable the dogs or cats inside to remain clean and dry;  
16 ~~and~~

17      ~~—~~ (6) Provide sufficient space for each dog or cat inside to  
18 turn about freely and to stand, sit and lie in a comfortable, normal

20      (7) *Prevent the dogs or cats inside from biting or otherwise  
21 harming an animal or person outside of the primary enclosure.*

22      **2. The provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection 1 do  
23 not apply to an animal shelter.**

24       **Sec. 11.** NRS 574.430 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25       574.430 An operator shall ensure that:

26      1. Insects, ectoparasites and avian, mammalian and reptilian  
27 pests are kept under control.

28      2. Supplies of food and bedding material are stored in facilities  
29 that afford adequate protection from infestation or contamination by  
30 vermin.

31      3. *For primary enclosures used to restrict the immediate  
32 movement of a dog or cat:*

33       (a) Excreta are removed ~~[from primary enclosures]~~ at least once  
34 daily to prevent contamination and to reduce to a minimum odors  
35 and the risk of disease ~~[A primary enclosure must be]~~; ~~and~~

36       (b) *Each such primary enclosure is* disinfected at least once  
37 daily and before placing another dog or cat in the primary enclosure.  
38 If a hosing or flushing method of cleaning is used, all dogs and cats  
39 must be removed from the primary enclosure and adequate measures  
40 must be taken to protect the dogs and cats in other primary  
41 enclosures from being contaminated with water and other wastes.

42      4. ~~[Other]~~ Primary enclosures *used to restrict the immediate  
43 movement of an animal other than a dog or cat* are cleaned,  
44 washed and disinfected at least once every 2 weeks to prevent any  
45 accumulation of debris or excreta and to reduce to a practical

1 minimum substances and organisms injurious to the health of  
2 animals or humans.

3       5. Pens or runs with hard surfaces, and cages and rooms, are  
4 sanitized at least once every 2 weeks by:

5           (a) Washing them with water of a temperature not less than 120  
6 degrees Fahrenheit and with soap or detergent;

7           (b) Washing all soiled surfaces with a safe and effective  
8 disinfectant; or

9           (c) Cleaning all soiled surfaces with live steam.

10       6. Pens or runs with gravel, sand or dirt surfaces are cleaned as  
11 often as necessary by removing and replacing the soiled gravel, sand  
12 or dirt.

13       7. Sewage, solid wastes, soiled bedding, dead animals and  
14 debris are removed from housing facilities regularly and disposed of  
15 properly.

16       8. Facilities for disposal are maintained in such a manner as to  
17 reduce to a minimum odors and the risk of disease or infestation by  
18 vermin.

19       9. Adequate facilities, such as washrooms, basins or sinks, are  
20 provided for the cleanliness of persons handling animals.

23       **Sec. 14.** The provisions of NRS 354.599 do not apply to any  
24 additional expenses of a local government that are related to the  
25 provisions of this act.
