

SENATE BILL NO. 331—SENATORS LESLIE AND PARKS

MARCH 21, 2011

JOINT SPONSOR: ASSEMBLYMAN AIZLEY

Referred to Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to unlawful discrimination in places of public accommodation. (BDR 54-799)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.
Effect on the State: No.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public accommodations; revising provisions relating to unlawful discrimination based on sex and gender identity or expression in places of public accommodation; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Nevada has declared as its public policy the right of all people to have access to
2 places of public accommodation without discrimination based on race, religious
3 creed, color, age, sex, disability, sexual orientation, national origin or ancestry, and
4 **section 4** of this bill extends that public policy to discrimination based on gender
5 identity or expression. Existing law provides that all persons have the right to full
6 and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages and
7 accommodations of any place of public accommodation without discrimination or
8 segregation based on race, color, religion, national origin, disability or sexual
9 orientation. (NRS 651.070) **Section 2** of this bill provides the same protection from
10 discrimination or segregation based on sex or gender identity or expression in
11 places of public accommodation. A person who withholds, denies or deprives any
12 other person of this right, intimidates, threatens or coerces any other person for the
13 purpose of interfering with this right or punishes any other person for exercising
14 this right is guilty of a misdemeanor. (NRS 651.080)

15 Existing law authorizes the Nevada Equal Rights Commission to investigate
16 practices of discrimination in places of public accommodation and authorizes a
17 person who believes he or she has been discriminated against based on race, color,



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18 religion, national origin, disability or sexual orientation to file a complaint with the
19 Commission. (NRS 233.150, 651.110) **Section 6** of this bill authorizes the
20 Commission additionally to investigate practices of discrimination based on gender
21 identity or expression. **Section 3** of this bill authorizes a person who believes he or
22 she has been discriminated against based on sex or gender identity or expression to
23 file a complaint with the Commission.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 651.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 651.050 As used in NRS 651.050 to 651.110, inclusive, unless
3 the context otherwise requires:

4 1. "Disability" means, with respect to a person:

5 (a) A physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one
6 or more of the major life activities of the person;
7 (b) A record of such an impairment; or
8 (c) Being regarded as having such an impairment.

9 2. "*Gender identity or expression*" means a gender-related
10 identity, appearance, expression or behavior of a person,
11 *regardless of the person's assigned sex at birth.*

12 3. "Place of public accommodation" means:

13 (a) Any inn, hotel, motel or other establishment which provides
14 lodging to transient guests, except an establishment located within a
15 building which contains not more than five rooms for rent or hire
16 and which is actually occupied by the proprietor of the
17 establishment as the proprietor's residence;

18 (b) Any restaurant, bar, cafeteria, lunchroom, lunch counter,
19 soda fountain, casino or any other facility where food or spirituous
20 or malt liquors are sold, including any such facility located on the
21 premises of any retail establishment;

22 (c) Any gasoline station;

23 (d) Any motion picture house, theater, concert hall, sports arena
24 or other place of exhibition or entertainment;

25 (e) Any auditorium, convention center, lecture hall, stadium or
26 other place of public gathering;

27 (f) Any bakery, grocery store, clothing store, hardware store,
28 shopping center or other sales or rental establishment;

29 (g) Any laundromat, dry cleaner, bank, barber shop, beauty
30 shop, travel service, shoe repair service, funeral parlor, office of an
31 accountant or lawyer, pharmacy, insurance office, office of a
32 provider of health care, hospital or other service establishment;

33 (h) Any terminal, depot or other station used for specified public
34 transportation;



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1 (i) Any museum, library, gallery or other place of public display
2 or collection;

3 (j) Any park, zoo, amusement park or other place of recreation;

4 (k) Any nursery, private school or university or other place of
5 education;

6 (l) Any day care center, senior citizen center, homeless shelter,
7 food bank, adoption agency or other social service establishment;

8 (m) Any gymnasium, health spa, bowling alley, golf course or
9 other place of exercise or recreation;

10 (n) Any other establishment or place to which the public is
11 invited or which is intended for public use; and

12 (o) Any establishment physically containing or contained within
13 any of the establishments described in paragraphs (a) to (n),
14 inclusive, which holds itself out as serving patrons of the described
15 establishment.

16 **[3.] 4.** “Sexual orientation” means having or being perceived
17 as having an orientation for heterosexuality, homosexuality or
18 bisexuality.

19 **Sec. 2.** NRS 651.070 is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 651.070 All persons are entitled to the full and equal
21 enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages
22 and accommodations of any place of public accommodation,
23 without discrimination or segregation on the ground of race, color,
24 religion, national origin, disability , ~~for~~ sexual orientation **[, sex,**
gender identity or expression.

26 **Sec. 3.** NRS 651.110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27 651.110 Any person who believes he or she has been denied
28 full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges,
29 advantages and accommodations of any place of public
30 accommodation because of discrimination or segregation based on
31 race, color, religion, national origin, disability , ~~for~~ sexual
32 orientation , **sex, gender identity or expression** may file a complaint
33 to that effect with the Nevada Equal Rights Commission.

34 **Sec. 4.** NRS 233.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35 233.010 1. It is hereby declared to be the public policy of the
36 State of Nevada to protect the welfare, prosperity, health and peace
37 of all the people of the State, and to foster the right of all persons
38 reasonably to seek, obtain and hold employment and housing
39 accommodations without discrimination, distinction or restriction
40 because of race, religious creed, color, age, sex, disability, national
41 origin or ancestry.

42 2. It is hereby declared to be the public policy of the State of
43 Nevada to protect the welfare, prosperity, health and peace of all the
44 people of the State, and to foster the right of all persons reasonably
45 to seek and be granted services in places of public accommodation



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1 without discrimination, distinction or restriction because of race,
2 religious creed, color, age, sex, disability, sexual orientation,
3 national origin, ~~for~~ ancestry ~~H~~, **gender identity or expression**.

4 3. It is recognized that the people of this State should be
5 afforded full and accurate information concerning actual and alleged
6 practices of discrimination and acts of prejudice, and that such
7 information may provide the basis for formulating statutory
8 remedies of equal protection and opportunity for all citizens in this
9 State.

10 **Sec. 5.** NRS 233.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

11 233.020 As used in this chapter:

12 1. "Administrator" means the Administrator of the
13 Commission.

14 2. "Commission" means the Nevada Equal Rights Commission
15 within the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation.

16 3. "Disability" means, with respect to a person:

17 (a) A physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one
18 or more of the major life activities of the person;

19 (b) A record of such an impairment; or

20 (c) Being regarded as having such an impairment.

21 4. **"Gender identity or expression" means a gender-related
22 identity, appearance, expression or behavior of a person,
23 regardless of the person's assigned sex at birth.**

24 5. "Member" means a member of the Nevada Equal Rights
25 Commission.

26 ~~5.6.~~ 6. "Sexual orientation" means having or being perceived
27 as having an orientation for heterosexuality, homosexuality or
28 bisexuality.

29 **Sec. 6.** NRS 233.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 233.150 The Commission may:

31 1. Order its Administrator to:

32 (a) With regard to public accommodation, investigate tensions,
33 practices of discrimination and acts of prejudice against any person
34 or group because of race, color, creed, sex, age, disability, sexual
35 orientation, national origin, ~~for~~ ancestry, **gender identity or
36 expression** and may conduct hearings with regard thereto.

37 (b) With regard to employment and housing, investigate
38 tensions, practices of discrimination and acts of prejudice against
39 any person or group because of race, color, creed, sex, age,
40 disability, national origin or ancestry, and may conduct hearings
41 with regard thereto.

42 2. Mediate between or reconcile the persons or groups involved
43 in those tensions, practices and acts.



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- 1 3. Issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses or for the
- 2 production of documents or tangible evidence relevant to any
- 3 investigations or hearings conducted by the Commission.
- 4 4. Delegate its power to hold hearings and issue subpoenas to
- 5 any of its members or any hearing officer in its employ.
- 6 5. Adopt reasonable regulations necessary for the Commission
- 7 to carry out the functions assigned to it by law.

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
