

SENATE BILL NO. 331—SENATORS LESLIE AND PARKS

MARCH 21, 2011

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JOINT SPONSOR: ASSEMBLYMAN AIZLEY

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Referred to Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions relating to unlawful discrimination in places of public accommodation. (BDR 54-799)

**FISCAL NOTE:** Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.  
Effect on the State: No.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to public accommodations; revising provisions relating to unlawful discrimination based on sex and gender identity or expression in places of public accommodation; providing that certain promotions or marketing of places of public accommodation are not unlawful or grounds for a civil action; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Nevada has declared as its public policy the right of all people to have access to places of public accommodation without discrimination based on race, religious creed, color, age, sex, disability, sexual orientation, national origin or ancestry, and **section 6** of this bill extends that public policy to discrimination based on gender identity or expression. Existing law provides that all persons have the right to full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages and accommodations of any place of public accommodation without discrimination or segregation based on race, color, religion, national origin, disability or sexual orientation. (NRS 651.070) **Section 3** of this bill provides the same protection from discrimination or segregation based on sex or gender identity or expression in places of public accommodation. A person who withdraws, denies or deprives any other person of this right, intimidates, threatens or coerces any other person for the purpose of interfering with this right or punishes any other person for exercising



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14 this right is guilty of a misdemeanor. (NRS 651.080) **Section 1** of this bill provides  
15 that it is not unlawful or a ground for a civil action for any place of public  
16 accommodation to offer differential pricing, discounted pricing or special offers  
17 based on sex to promote or market the place of public accommodation.

18 Existing law authorizes the Nevada Equal Rights Commission to investigate  
19 practices of discrimination in places of public accommodation and authorizes a  
20 person who believes he or she has been discriminated against based on race, color,  
21 religion, national origin, disability or sexual orientation to file a complaint with the  
22 Commission. (NRS 233.150, 651.110) **Section 8** of this bill authorizes the  
23 Commission additionally to investigate practices of discrimination based on gender  
24 identity or expression. **Section 4** of this bill authorizes a person who believes he or  
25 she has been discriminated against based on sex or gender identity or expression to  
26 file a complaint with the Commission. **Section 5** of this bill provides that it is not  
27 an unlawful discriminatory practice in public accommodations for any place of  
28 public accommodation to offer differential pricing, discounted pricing or special  
29 offers based on sex to promote or market the place of public accommodation.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 651 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3     *1. Notwithstanding any provision of NRS 651.050 to 651.110, inclusive, it is not unlawful and is not a ground for a civil action for any place of public accommodation to offer differential pricing, discounted pricing or special offers based on sex to promote or market the place of public accommodation.*

4     *2. As used in this section, "place of public accommodation" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 651.050.*

5     **Sec. 2.** NRS 651.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:

6         *651.050 As used in NRS 651.050 to 651.110, inclusive, unless the context otherwise requires:*

7             *1. "Disability" means, with respect to a person:*  
8                 *(a) A physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of the person;*  
9                 *(b) A record of such an impairment; or*  
10                 *(c) Being regarded as having such an impairment.*

11             *2. "Gender identity or expression" means a gender-related identity, appearance, expression or behavior of a person, regardless of the person's assigned sex at birth.*

12             *3. "Place of public accommodation" means:*  
13                 *(a) Any inn, hotel, motel or other establishment which provides lodging to transient guests, except an establishment located within a building which contains not more than five rooms for rent or hire and which is actually occupied by the proprietor of the establishment as the proprietor's residence;*



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- 1       (b) Any restaurant, bar, cafeteria, lunchroom, lunch counter,  
2 soda fountain, casino or any other facility where food or spirituous  
3 or malt liquors are sold, including any such facility located on the  
4 premises of any retail establishment;
- 5       (c) Any gasoline station;
- 6       (d) Any motion picture house, theater, concert hall, sports arena  
7 or other place of exhibition or entertainment;
- 8       (e) Any auditorium, convention center, lecture hall, stadium or  
9 other place of public gathering;
- 10      (f) Any bakery, grocery store, clothing store, hardware store,  
11 shopping center or other sales or rental establishment;
- 12      (g) Any laundromat, dry cleaner, bank, barber shop, beauty  
13 shop, travel service, shoe repair service, funeral parlor, office of an  
14 accountant or lawyer, pharmacy, insurance office, office of a  
15 provider of health care, hospital or other service establishment;
- 16      (h) Any terminal, depot or other station used for specified public  
17 transportation;
- 18      (i) Any museum, library, gallery or other place of public display  
19 or collection;
- 20      (j) Any park, zoo, amusement park or other place of recreation;
- 21      (k) Any nursery, private school or university or other place of  
22 education;
- 23      (l) Any day care center, senior citizen center, homeless shelter,  
24 food bank, adoption agency or other social service establishment;
- 25      (m) Any gymnasium, health spa, bowling alley, golf course or  
26 other place of exercise or recreation;
- 27      (n) Any other establishment or place to which the public is  
28 invited or which is intended for public use; and
- 29      (o) Any establishment physically containing or contained within  
30 any of the establishments described in paragraphs (a) to (n),  
31 inclusive, which holds itself out as serving patrons of the described  
32 establishment.

33      **[3.] 4.** “Sexual orientation” means having or being perceived  
34 as having an orientation for heterosexuality, homosexuality or  
35 bisexuality.

36      **Sec. 3.** NRS 651.070 is hereby amended to read as follows:

37      651.070 All persons are entitled to the full and equal  
38 enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages  
39 and accommodations of any place of public accommodation,  
40 without discrimination or segregation on the ground of race, color,  
41 religion, national origin, disability, ~~for~~ sexual orientation **[4.]**, **sex,**  
42 **gender identity or expression.**

43      **Sec. 4.** NRS 651.110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

44      651.110 Any person who believes he or she has been denied  
45 full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges,



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1 advantages and accommodations of any place of public  
2 accommodation because of discrimination or segregation based on  
3 race, color, religion, national origin, disability , ~~or~~ sexual  
4 orientation, **sex, gender identity or expression** may file a complaint  
5 to that effect with the Nevada Equal Rights Commission.

6 **Sec. 5.** Chapter 233 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
7 thereto a new section to read as follows:

8     *Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, it is not an  
9 unlawful discriminatory practice in public accommodations for  
10 any place of public accommodation to offer differential pricing,  
11 discounted pricing or special offers based on sex to promote or  
12 market the place of public accommodation.*

13 **Sec. 6.** NRS 233.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14     233.010 1. It is hereby declared to be the public policy of the  
15 State of Nevada to protect the welfare, prosperity, health and peace  
16 of all the people of the State, and to foster the right of all persons  
17 reasonably to seek, obtain and hold employment and housing  
18 accommodations without discrimination, distinction or restriction  
19 because of race, religious creed, color, age, sex, disability, national  
20 origin or ancestry.

21     2. It is hereby declared to be the public policy of the State of  
22 Nevada to protect the welfare, prosperity, health and peace of all the  
23 people of the State, and to foster the right of all persons reasonably  
24 to seek and be granted services in places of public accommodation  
25 without discrimination, distinction or restriction because of race,  
26 religious creed, color, age, sex, disability, sexual orientation,  
27 national origin, ~~or~~ ancestry **H, gender identity or expression**.

28     3. It is recognized that the people of this State should be  
29 afforded full and accurate information concerning actual and alleged  
30 practices of discrimination and acts of prejudice, and that such  
31 information may provide the basis for formulating statutory  
32 remedies of equal protection and opportunity for all citizens in this  
33 State.

34 **Sec. 7.** NRS 233.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35     233.020 As used in this chapter:

36       1. "Administrator" means the Administrator of the  
37 Commission.

38       2. "Commission" means the Nevada Equal Rights Commission  
39 within the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation.

40       3. "Disability" means, with respect to a person:

41           (a) A physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one  
42 or more of the major life activities of the person;

43           (b) A record of such an impairment; or

44           (c) Being regarded as having such an impairment.



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1       4. “*Gender identity or expression*” means a gender-related  
2 *identity, appearance, expression or behavior of a person,*  
3 *regardless of the person’s assigned sex at birth.*

4       5. “Member” means a member of the Nevada Equal Rights  
5 Commission.

6       [5.] 6. “Sexual orientation” means having or being perceived  
7 as having an orientation for heterosexuality, homosexuality or  
8 bisexuality.

9       **Sec. 8.** NRS 233.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10      233.150 The Commission may:

11      1. Order its Administrator to:

12       (a) With regard to public accommodation, investigate tensions,  
13 practices of discrimination and acts of prejudice against any person  
14 or group because of race, color, creed, sex, age, disability, sexual  
15 orientation, national origin , [or] ancestry, ***gender identity or***  
16 ***expression*** and may conduct hearings with regard thereto.

17       (b) With regard to employment and housing, investigate  
18 tensions, practices of discrimination and acts of prejudice against  
19 any person or group because of race, color, creed, sex, age,  
20 disability, national origin or ancestry, and may conduct hearings  
21 with regard thereto.

22      2. Mediate between or reconcile the persons or groups involved  
23 in those tensions, practices and acts.

24      3. Issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses or for the  
25 production of documents or tangible evidence relevant to any  
26 investigations or hearings conducted by the Commission.

27      4. Delegate its power to hold hearings and issue subpoenas to  
28 any of its members or any hearing officer in its employ.

29      5. Adopt reasonable regulations necessary for the Commission  
30 to carry out the functions assigned to it by law.

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
