

SENATE BILL NO. 347—SENATOR DENIS

MARCH 21, 2011

Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Authorizes the issuance of a subpoena to compel the production of certain financial records as part of an investigation of the exploitation of an older person. (BDR 15-1075)

AN ACT relating to older persons; authorizing the issuance of a subpoena to compel the production of certain financial records and other documents in an investigation of the exploitation of an older person under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires certain persons who have reasonable cause to believe that
2 an older person has been abused, neglected, exploited or isolated to report the
3 abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of the older person to the Aging and
4 Disability Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services, or a
5 local office thereof, a police department, sheriff's office or a county's office for
6 protective services. (NRS 200.5093) The exploitation of an older person consists of
7 wrongfully depriving the older person of the ownership, use, benefit or possession
8 of his or her money, assets or property. (NRS 200.5092) This bill authorizes the
9 Administrator of the Division or the executive head of an office or department that
10 is investigating a report of the exploitation of an older person to issue an
11 administrative subpoena to compel the production of financial records or other
12 documents relating to the older person which are in the possession of a bank or
13 other financial institution, savings and loan association, thrift company or credit
14 union.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 200 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *If the Aging and Disability Services Division of the Department
4 of Health and Human Services or a local office thereof, a police
5 department or sheriff's office, or a county office for protective
6 services investigates a report of the exploitation of an older person
7 made pursuant to NRS 200.5093, the Administrator of the
8 Division or the executive head of the department or office may
9 issue a subpoena to compel the production of financial records or
10 other documents relating to the older person by a:*

11 *1. Financial institution subject to the provisions of any
12 chapter of title 55 of NRS;*

13 *2. Savings and loan association subject to the provisions of
14 chapter 673 of NRS;*

15 *3. Thrift company subject to the provisions of chapter 677 of
16 NRS; or*

17 *4. Credit union subject to the provisions of chapter 678 of
18 NRS.*

19 **Sec. 2.** NRS 200.5092 is hereby amended to read as follows:
20 200.5092 As used in NRS 200.5091 to 200.50995, inclusive,
21 **and section 1 of this act,** unless the context otherwise requires:

22 1. "Abuse" means willful and unjustified:

23 (a) Infliction of pain, injury or mental anguish on an older
24 person or a vulnerable person; or

25 (b) Deprivation of food, shelter, clothing or services which are
26 necessary to maintain the physical or mental health of an older
27 person or a vulnerable person.

28 2. "Exploitation" means any act taken by a person who has the
29 trust and confidence of an older person or a vulnerable person or
30 any use of the power of attorney or guardianship of an older person
31 or a vulnerable person to:

32 (a) Obtain control, through deception, intimidation or undue
33 influence, over the older person's or vulnerable person's money,
34 assets or property with the intention of permanently depriving the
35 older person or vulnerable person of the ownership, use, benefit or
36 possession of his or her money, assets or property; or

37 (b) Convert money, assets or property of the older person or
38 vulnerable person with the intention of permanently depriving the
39 older person or vulnerable person of the ownership, use, benefit or
40 possession of his or her money, assets or property.

41 ➔ As used in this subsection, "undue influence" does not include
42 the normal influence that one member of a family has over another.

1 3. “Isolation” means willfully, maliciously and intentionally
2 preventing an older person or a vulnerable person from having
3 contact with another person by:

4 (a) Intentionally preventing the older person or vulnerable
5 person from receiving visitors, mail or telephone calls, including,
6 without limitation, communicating to a person who comes to visit
7 the older person or vulnerable person or a person who telephones
8 the older person or vulnerable person that the older person or
9 vulnerable person is not present or does not want to meet with or
10 talk to the visitor or caller knowing that the statement is false,
11 contrary to the express wishes of the older person or vulnerable
12 person and intended to prevent the older person or vulnerable person
13 from having contact with the visitor; or

14 (b) Physically restraining the older person or vulnerable person
15 to prevent the older person or vulnerable person from meeting with
16 a person who comes to visit the older person or vulnerable person.

17 → The term does not include an act intended to protect the property
18 or physical or mental welfare of the older person or vulnerable
19 person or an act performed pursuant to the instructions of a
20 physician of the older person or vulnerable person.

21 4. “Neglect” means the failure of:

22 (a) A person who has assumed legal responsibility or a
23 contractual obligation for caring for an older person or a vulnerable
24 person or who has voluntarily assumed responsibility for his or her
25 care to provide food, shelter, clothing or services which are
26 necessary to maintain the physical or mental health of the older
27 person or vulnerable person; or

28 (b) An older person or a vulnerable person to provide for his or
29 her own needs because of inability to do so.

30 5. “Older person” means a person who is 60 years of age or
31 older.

32 6. “Protective services” means services the purpose of which is
33 to prevent and remedy the abuse, neglect, exploitation and isolation
34 of older persons. The services may include investigation, evaluation,
35 counseling, arrangement and referral for other services and
36 assistance.

37 7. “Vulnerable person” means a person 18 years of age or older
38 who:

39 (a) Suffers from a condition of physical or mental incapacitation
40 because of a developmental disability, organic brain damage or
41 mental illness; or

42 (b) Has one or more physical or mental limitations that restrict
43 the ability of the person to perform the normal activities of daily
44 living.

1 **Sec. 3.** NRS 200.50984 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 200.50984 1. Notwithstanding any other statute to the
3 contrary, the local office of the Aging and Disability Services
4 Division of the Department of Health and Human Services and a
5 county's office for protective services, if one exists in the county
6 where a violation is alleged to have occurred, may for the purpose of
7 investigating an alleged violation of NRS 200.5091 to 200.50995,
8 inclusive, ***and section 1 of this act*** inspect all records pertaining to
9 the older person on whose behalf the investigation is being
10 conducted, including, but not limited to, that person's medical and
11 financial records.

12 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection ***H and***
13 ***section 1 of this act***, if a guardian has not been appointed for the
14 older person, the Aging and Disability Services Division or the
15 county's office for protective services shall obtain the consent of
16 the older person before inspecting those records. If the Aging and
17 Disability Services Division or the county's office for protective
18 services determines that the older person is unable to consent to the
19 inspection, the inspection may be conducted without his or her
20 consent. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection ***H and***
21 ***section 1 of this act***, if a guardian has been appointed for the older
22 person, the Aging and Disability Services Division or the county's
23 office for protective services shall obtain the consent of the guardian
24 before inspecting those records. If the Aging and Disability Services
25 Division or the county's office for protective services has reasonable
26 cause to believe that the guardian is abusing, neglecting, exploiting
27 or isolating the older person, the inspection may be conducted
28 without the consent of the guardian, except that if the records to be
29 inspected are in the personal possession of the guardian, the
30 inspection must be approved by a court of competent jurisdiction.
