

SENATE BILL NO. 417—COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES

MARCH 28, 2011

Referred to Committee on Natural Resources

SUMMARY—Provides for the placement of recycling containers in certain locations. (BDR 40-1108)

AN ACT relating to recycling; providing for the placement of recycling containers on the premises of certain apartment complexes and condominiums; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the State Environmental Commission to adopt regulations
2 establishing minimum standards for separating, at the source, recyclable material
3 from other solid waste originating from residential premises and public buildings
4 where services for the collection of solid waste are provided. (NRS 444A.020)
5 Existing law requires the Division of Environmental Protection of the State
6 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to adopt, by regulation, a
7 model plan for that purpose. (NRS 444A.030) Existing law imposes a similar
8 requirement upon the board of county commissioners in a county whose population
9 is 100,000 or more (currently Clark and Washoe Counties) by requiring those
10 boards to make available for use in those counties a program for the separation at
11 the source of recyclable material from other solid waste originating from residential
12 premises and public buildings where services for the collection of solid waste are
13 provided. (NRS 444A.040) However, unlike the requirement imposed upon the
14 Commission and the Division concerning recyclable material, the requirement
15 imposed upon those boards of county commissioners specifically set forth a
16 requirement that the recycling program of the board include provisions for the
17 placement of recycling containers on the premises of apartment complexes and
18 condominiums where those services are provided. **Sections 1 and 2** of this bill
19 revise the requirement concerning the adoption of regulations by the Commission
20 and the Division for the separation of recyclable material at the source to require
21 those regulations to include provisions for the placement of recycling containers on
22 the premises of apartment complexes and condominiums where those services are
23 provided.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 444A.020 is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:

3 444A.020 1. The State Environmental Commission shall
4 adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for:

5 (a) Separating at the source recyclable material from other solid
6 waste originating from residential premises and public buildings
7 where services for the collection of solid waste are provided ~~;~~,
8 *including, without limitation, the placement of recycling*
9 *containers on the premises of apartment complexes and*
10 *condominiums where those services are provided.*

11 (b) Establishing recycling centers for the collection and disposal
12 of recyclable material.

13 (c) The disposal of hazardous household products which are
14 capable of causing harmful physical effects if inhaled, absorbed or
15 ingested.

16 2. The regulations adopted pursuant to subsection 1 must be
17 adopted with the goal of recycling at least 25 percent of the total
18 solid waste generated within a municipality after the second full
19 year following the adoption of such standards.

20 3. The State Environmental Commission shall, by regulation,
21 establish acceptable methods for disposing of used or waste tires
22 consistent with the provisions of NRS 444.505, 444.507
23 and 444.509.

24 **Sec. 2.** NRS 444A.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 444A.030 1. The Division of Environmental Protection of the
26 ~~State~~ Department ~~of Conservation and Natural Resources~~ shall,
27 by regulation, adopt a model plan for:

28 (a) Separating at the source recyclable material from other solid
29 waste originating from residential premises and public buildings
30 where services for the collection of solid waste are provided ~~;~~,
31 *including, without limitation, the placement of recycling*
32 *containers on the premises of apartment complexes and*
33 *condominiums where those services are provided.*

34 (b) Establishing recycling centers for the collection and disposal
35 of recyclable material in areas where there are no centers.

36 (c) The disposal of hazardous household products which are
37 capable of causing harmful physical effects if inhaled, absorbed or
38 ingested.

39 (d) The disposal of infectious waste, hazardous waste which is
40 not regulated pursuant to NRS 459.485 and liquid waste which is
41 not regulated pursuant to NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive.



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1 2. The model plans adopted pursuant to subsection 1 must not
2 conflict with the standards adopted by the State Environmental
3 Commission pursuant to NRS 444A.020.

4 **Sec. 3.** The State Environmental Commission shall, on or
5 before October 1, 2011, in accordance with the provisions of NRS
6 444A.020, as amended by section 1 of this act, adopt regulations
7 establishing minimum standards for the placement of recycling
8 containers on the premises of apartment complexes and
9 condominiums where services for the collection of solid waste are
10 provided.

11 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective:

- 12 1. Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting
13 regulations; and
14 2. On October 1, 2011, for all other purposes.

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
