

SENATE BILL NO. 441—COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

(ON BEHALF OF THE DIVISION OF BUDGET AND PLANNING)

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the processing at self-service terminals or kiosks of certain transactions with the Department of Motor Vehicles. (BDR 43-1184)

AN ACT relating to the Department of Motor Vehicles; providing for the imposition of certain fees for the processing by a supplier of self-service terminals or kiosks of certain transactions with the Department; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill authorizes the Director of the Department of Motor Vehicles to enter
2 into a contract with a supplier of self-service terminals or kiosks which authorizes
3 the supplier to process certain transactions that have been designated by the
4 Director and to charge and collect from customers a nonrefundable processing fee
5 for each such transaction. This bill requires the Director to adopt regulations to
6 carry out the provisions of this bill.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 481.051 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 481.051 1. The Director shall direct and supervise all
3 administrative and technical activities of the Department.
4 2. The Director may organize the Department into various
5 divisions, alter the organization and reassign responsibilities and
6 duties as the Director deems appropriate.



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1 3. The Director shall:

2 (a) Formulate the policy of the Department and the various
3 divisions thereof.

4 (b) Coordinate the activities of the various divisions of the
5 Department.

6 (c) Adopt such regulations consistent with law as the Director
7 deems necessary for the operation of the Department and the
8 enforcement of all laws administered by the Department.

9 4. The Director may appoint vendors to serve as agents of the
10 Department to sell temporary permits. The vendor shall collect the
11 fees for the permits issued pursuant to chapter 706 of NRS and pay
12 them to the Department. The vendor shall guarantee payment by
13 giving a bond in an amount not less than \$25,000, executed by the
14 vendor as principal, and by a corporation qualified pursuant to the
15 laws of this State as surety, payable to the State of Nevada. In lieu
16 of a bond, the vendor may deposit with the State Treasurer a like
17 amount of lawful money of the United States or any other form of
18 security authorized by NRS 100.065. If security is provided in the
19 form of a savings certificate, certificate of deposit or investment
20 certificate, the certificate must state that the amount is not available
21 for withdrawal except upon approval of the Director. Upon approval
22 of the Governor, the Director may appoint inspectors of the Nevada
23 Transportation Authority and personnel of the Nevada Highway
24 Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety to serve without
25 remuneration as vendors for the purposes of this subsection.

26 5. *The Director may enter into a contract with a supplier of
27 self-service terminals or kiosks which authorizes the supplier to
28 process through those self-service terminals or kiosks certain
29 transactions pursuant to this chapter and chapters 482, 483 and
30 485 of NRS that have been designated by the Director and to
31 charge and collect from customers a nonrefundable processing fee
32 for each such transaction. The Director shall adopt regulations to
33 carry out the provisions of this subsection.*

34 6. The Director may delegate to the officers and employees of
35 the Department such authorities and responsibilities not otherwise
36 delegated by law as the Director deems necessary for the efficient
37 conduct of the business of the Department.

38 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.
