

SENATE BILL NO. 442—COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

SUMMARY—Establishes the Fund for State Park Interpretative and Educational Programs and Operation of Concessions. (BDR 35-1210)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to state parks; creating the Fund for State Park Interpretative and Educational Programs and Operation of Concessions; authorizing the Administrator of the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to establish certain concessions within state parks; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources is funded by grants and gifts of money, fees and legislative appropriations. (NRS 407.075, 407.0762, 407.077) **Section 2** of this bill authorizes the Administrator of the Division to establish concessions within the boundaries of any state park the revenue from which is required to be deposited in the Fund for State Park Interpretative and Educational Programs and Operation of Concessions. **Section 1** of this bill creates the Fund for State Park Interpretative and Educational Programs and Operation of Concessions for the use of the Division and provides for the expenditure of money from the Fund.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 407 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. The Fund for State Park Interpretative and Educational
4 Programs and Operation of Concessions is hereby created as an
5 enterprise fund for the use of the Division to receive all revenues
6 derived from sales of concessions and vending machines operated
7 within state parks and other special revenue generating activities.*

8 *2. Money in the Fund must be invested as the money in other
9 state funds is invested. The interest and income earned on the
10 money in the Fund, after deducting any applicable charges, must
11 be credited to the Fund. Claims against the Fund must be paid as
12 other claims against the State are paid.*

13 *3. In addition to any expenditure required by subsection 4,
14 the cost of any goods and services used for the sale of concessions
15 and the coordination of special revenue generating activities must
16 be expended from the Fund.*

17 *4. Upon approval by the Director, the Administrator shall
18 expend money deposited in the Fund for special interpretative or
19 educational programs and special park projects that enhance the
20 interpretative and educational mission of the Division.*

21 *5. Any balance remaining in the Fund does not revert to the
22 State General Fund at the end of any fiscal year.*

23 **Sec. 2.** NRS 407.065 is hereby amended to read as follows:
24 407.065 1. The Administrator, subject to the approval of the
25 Director:

26 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, may
27 establish, name, plan, operate, control, protect, develop and
28 maintain state parks, monuments and recreational areas for the use
29 of the general public. The name of an existing state park, monument
30 or recreational area may not be changed unless the Legislature
31 approves the change by statute.

32 (b) Shall protect state parks and property controlled or
33 administered by the Division from misuse or damage and preserve
34 the peace within those areas. The Administrator may appoint or
35 designate certain employees of the Division to have the general
36 authority of peace officers.

37 (c) May allow multiple use of state parks and real property
38 controlled or administered by the Division for any lawful purpose,
39 including, but not limited to, grazing, mining, development of
40 natural resources, hunting and fishing, in accordance with such
41 regulations as may be adopted in furtherance of the purposes of the
42 Division.



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1 (d) Shall impose and collect reasonable fees for entering,
2 camping and boating in state parks and recreational areas. The
3 Division shall issue, upon application therefor and proof of
4 residency and age, an annual permit for entering, camping and
5 boating in all state parks and recreational areas in this State to any
6 person who is 65 years of age or older and has resided in this State
7 for at least 5 years immediately preceding the date on which the
8 application is submitted. The permit must be issued without charge,
9 except that the Division shall charge and collect an administrative
10 fee for the issuance of the permit in an amount sufficient to cover
11 the costs of issuing the permit.

12 (e) May conduct and operate such special services as may be
13 necessary for the comfort and convenience of the general public,
14 and impose and collect reasonable fees for such special services.

15 (f) May rent or lease concessions located within the boundaries
16 of state parks or of real property controlled or administered by the
17 Division to public or private corporations, to groups of natural
18 persons, or to natural persons for a valuable consideration upon such
19 terms and conditions as the Division deems fit and proper, but no
20 concessionaire may dominate any state park operation.

21 (g) May establish such capital projects construction funds as are
22 necessary to account for the parks improvements program approved
23 by the Legislature. The money in these funds must be used for the
24 construction and improvement of those parks which are under the
25 supervision of the Administrator.

26 (h) *In addition to any concession specified in paragraph (f),
27 may establish concessions within the boundaries of any state park
28 to provide for the sale of food, drinks, ice, publications, sundries,
29 gifts and souvenirs, and other such related items as the
30 Administrator determines are appropriately made available to
31 visitors. Any money received by the Administrator for a concession
32 established pursuant to this paragraph must be deposited in the
33 Fund for State Park Interpretive and Educational Programs and
34 Operation of Concessions.*

35 2. The Administrator:

36 (a) Shall issue an annual permit to a person who pays a
37 reasonable fee as prescribed by regulation which authorizes the
38 holder of the permit to enter each state park and each recreational
39 area in this State and, except as otherwise provided in subsection 3,
40 use the facilities of the state park or recreational area without paying
41 the entrance fee; and

42 (b) May issue an annual permit to a person who pays a
43 reasonable fee as prescribed by regulation which authorizes the
44 holder of the permit to enter a specific state park or specific
45 recreational area in this State and, except as otherwise provided in



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1 subsection 3, use the facilities of the state park or recreational area
2 without paying the entrance fee.

3 3. An annual permit issued pursuant to subsection 2 does not
4 authorize the holder of the permit to engage in camping or boating,
5 or to attend special events. The holder of such a permit who wishes
6 to engage in camping or boating, or to attend special events, must
7 pay any fee established for the respective activity.

8 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 1 of NRS
9 407.0762 and subsection 1 of NRS 407.0765, the fees collected
10 pursuant to paragraphs (d), (e) and (f) of subsection 1 or subsection
11 2 must be deposited in the State General Fund.

12 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.

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
