

SENATE BILL NO. 65—COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

(ON BEHALF OF THE NEVADA LEAGUE OF  
CITIES AND MUNICIPALITIES)

PREFILED DECEMBER 15, 2010

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions concerning the publication of certain financial information by certain local governments. (BDR 21-400)

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AN ACT relating to local financial administration; revising provisions concerning the publication of certain financial information by an incorporated city or a county; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law requires the clerk and council of each city incorporated under  
2 general law or charter to publish in a newspaper a quarterly statement of the city's  
3 finances that shows the receipts and disbursements and the details of each bill that  
4 the city has paid. (NRS 268.030) **Section 2** of this bill requires the publication of  
5 only the total amounts of the city's receipts, disbursements and bills paid for the  
6 quarter but expressly provides that the receipts, bills and other documents which  
7 support each transaction that is included in the published totals are public records  
8 which are available for inspection and copying. **Section 2** also requires publication  
9 of the financial statement on the Internet website of the city, if the city maintains an  
10 Internet website. **Section 1** of this bill eliminates a duplicative requirement for the  
11 publication of financial information that only applies to the city clerks of cities  
12 incorporated under general law.

13 Under existing law, a board of county commissioners is required to publish in a  
14 newspaper a quarterly financial statement of receipts, expenditures and bills  
15 allowed. (NRS 244.225, 354.210) **Sections 3 and 5** of this bill require the  
16 publication of only the total amounts of the county's receipts, expenditures and bills  
17 allowed but expressly provides that the receipts, bills and other documents which  
18 support each transaction that is included in the published totals are public records  
19 which are available for inspection and copying. **Sections 3 and 5** also require



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20 publication of the financial statement on the Internet website of the county if the  
21 county maintains an Internet website.  
22 Section 4 of this bill requires the Committee on Local Government Finance to  
23 adopt regulations regarding the appropriate format for the financial statements  
24 posted on the Internet website of cities and counties.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 266.480 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2      266.480 The city clerk shall:  
3      1. Keep the office of the city clerk at the place of meeting of  
4      the city council, or some other place convenient thereto, as the  
5      council may direct.  
6      2. Keep the corporate seal and all papers and records of the  
7      city.  
8      3. Keep a record of the proceedings of the city council, whose  
9      meetings the city clerk shall attend.  
10     4. Countersign all contracts made in behalf of the city, and  
11     every such contract or contracts to which the city is a party shall be  
12     void unless signed by the city clerk.  
13     ~~15. Cause to be published quarterly in some newspaper  
14     published in the city a statement of the finances of the city, showing  
15     receipts and disbursements, and bills allowed and paid. The  
16     statement shall be signed by the mayor and attested by the city clerk.  
17     If there should be no newspaper published in the county, the  
18     financial statement shall be published in a newspaper of general  
19     circulation in the county.]~~

20      **Sec. 2.** NRS 268.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
21      268.030 1. After March 23, 1939, the city clerk and city  
22      council of every incorporated city in this state, whether incorporated  
23      under the provisions of chapter 266 of NRS or under the provisions  
24      of a special act, shall cause to be published quarterly in some  
25      newspaper, published as hereinafter provided, a statement of the  
26      finances of the city, showing *the total amounts of* receipts, ~~and~~  
27      disbursements ~~[exhibiting in detail the]~~ and bills allowed and paid  
28      ~~[for the period covered by the statement.]~~ The statement ~~[shall be]~~  
29      **must:**

30      (a) *Inform the public of the provisions of subsection 3;*  
31      (b) *If the city maintains an official Internet website, inform the  
32      public of where the financial statement is posted on the Internet  
33      website pursuant to subsection 2;*  
34      (c) *Provide a telephone number the public may call for further  
35      instructions on how to obtain the detailed financial documents;*



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1       (d) Provide the address of the city office or offices where the  
2 public may view the detailed financial documents;

3       (e) Be signed by the mayor and attested by the city clerk ; [ ]  
4 and [shall be]

5       (f) Be published in a newspaper published in [such] the city [ ]  
6 for a period of at least 5 consecutive days. If [there shall be] no  
7 newspaper is published in [such] the city, then the financial  
8 statement [shall] must be published in a newspaper published in the  
9 county, and if [there be] no newspaper is published in the county,  
10 [such] the financial statement [shall] must be published in a  
11 newspaper of general circulation in the county or posted by the  
12 city clerk at the door of the city hall.

13      2. If a city maintains an official Internet website, the city  
14 clerk and city council shall maintain and update quarterly on the  
15 Internet website of the city a statement of the finances of the city,  
16 showing the receipts, disbursements and bills allowed and paid for  
17 the period covered by the statement. The statement must:

18       (a) Inform the public of the provisions of subsection 3;

19       (b) Provide a telephone number the public may call for further  
20 instructions on how to obtain the detailed financial documents;

21       (c) Provide the address of the city office or offices where the  
22 public may view the detailed financial documents; and

23       (d) Be signed by the mayor and attested by the city clerk.

24      3. The original and any duplicate or copy of each receipt, bill,  
25 invoice, check, warrant, voucher or other similar document that  
26 supports a transaction, the amount of which is shown in the  
27 financial statement published pursuant to this section is a public  
28 record that is available for inspection and copying by any person  
29 pursuant to the provisions of chapter 239 of NRS.

30      4. Any city officer [in this state] who [shall violate] violates the  
31 provisions of this section [shall be deemed] is guilty of a  
32 misdemeanor.

33      Sec. 3. NRS 244.225 is hereby amended to read as follows:

34      244.225 1. The board of county commissioners shall publish  
35 quarterly a statement of the total amounts of receipts and  
36 expenditures of the 3 months next preceding, and the total amounts  
37 of accounts allowed. Publications shall be made by making one  
38 insertion of the statement in a newspaper published in the county,  
39 but if no newspaper [be] is published in the county, then such  
40 publication shall be made by posting a copy of the statement at the  
41 courthouse door and at two other public places in the county. **The  
42 statement must:**

43       (a) Inform the public of the provisions of subsection 3;



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1       (b) If the county maintains an official Internet website, inform  
2 the public of where the financial statement is posted on the  
3 Internet website pursuant to subsection 2;

4       (c) Provide a telephone number the public may call for further  
5 instructions on how to obtain the detailed financial documents;

6       (d) Provide the address of the county office or offices where  
7 the public may view the detailed financial documents; and

8       (e) Be published for a period of at least 5 consecutive days.

9       2. If a county maintains an official Internet website, the  
10 board of county commissioners shall maintain and update  
11 quarterly on the Internet website of the county a statement of the  
12 receipts and expenditures of the 3 months next preceding and the  
13 accounts allowed. The statement must:

14       (a) Inform the public of the provisions of subsection 3;

15       (b) Provide a telephone number the public may call for further  
16 instructions on how to obtain the detailed financial documents;  
17 and

18       (c) Provide the address of the county office or offices where  
19 the public may view the detailed financial documents.

20       3. The original and any duplicate or copy of each receipt, bill,  
21 invoice, check, warrant, voucher or other similar document that  
22 supports a transaction, the amount of which is shown in the  
23 statement published pursuant to this section, is a public record  
24 that is available for inspection and copying by any person  
25 pursuant to the provisions of chapter 239 of NRS.

26       Sec. 4. NRS 354.107 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27       354.107 1. The Committee on Local Government Finance  
28 may adopt such regulations as are necessary for the administration  
29 of this chapter.

30       2. **The Committee on Local Government Finance shall adopt  
31 regulations prescribing the format of the financial statement  
32 posted on the Internet website of a city or county pursuant to NRS  
33 244.225, 268.030 and 354.210.**

34       3. Any regulations adopted by the Committee on Local  
35 Government Finance must be adopted in the manner prescribed for  
36 state agencies in chapter 233B of NRS.

37       Sec. 5. NRS 354.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

38       354.210 1. Except as provided in subsection 3, the board of  
39 county commissioners shall cause **a statement of the total** amount of  
40 ~~fall~~ bills allowed by it ~~[, together with the names of the persons to  
41 whom such allowances are made and for what such allowances are  
42 made.]~~ to be published in some newspaper published in the county.

43       **The statement must:**

44       (a) Inform the public of the provisions of subsection 5;



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1       (b) If the county maintains an official Internet website, inform  
2 the public of where the financial statement is posted on the  
3 Internet website pursuant to subsection 4;

4       (c) Provide a telephone number the public may call for further  
5 instructions on how to obtain the detailed financial documents;

6       (d) Provide the address of the county office or offices where  
7 the public may view the detailed financial documents; and

8       (e) Be published for a period of at least 5 consecutive days.

9       2. The amount paid for such publication shall not exceed the  
10 statutory rate for publication of legal notices, and the publication  
11 shall not extend beyond a single insertion.

12       3. Where no newspaper is published in a county, the board of  
13 county commissioners may cause to be published, in some  
14 newspaper having a general circulation within the county, the  
15 allowances provided for in subsection 1, or shall cause the clerk of  
16 the board to post such allowances at the door of the courthouse.

17       4. If a county maintains an official Internet website, the  
18 board of county commissioners shall maintain and update  
19 quarterly on the official Internet website of the county a statement  
20 of the bills allowed by it. The statement must:

21       (a) Inform the public of the provisions of subsection 5;

22       (b) Provide a telephone number the public may call for further  
23 instructions on how to obtain the detailed financial documents;  
24 and

25       (c) Provide the address of the county office or offices where  
26 the public may view the detailed financial documents.

27       5. The original and any duplicate or copy of each bill,  
28 including, without limitation, the amount of the bill, the name of  
29 the person to whom such allowance is made and for what such  
30 allowance is made, or any other document that supports a  
31 transaction, the amount of which is shown in the statement  
32 published pursuant to this section, is a public record that is  
33 available for inspection and copying by any person pursuant to the  
34 provisions of chapter 239 of NRS.

35       Sec. 6. The Committee on Local Government Finance shall  
36 adopt the regulations required pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS  
37 354.107, as amended by section 4 of this act, on or before  
38 January 15, 2012.

39       Sec. 7. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval  
40 for the purpose of adopting regulations and performing any other  
41 preparatory tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of  
42 this act and on January 15, 2012, for all other purposes.



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
